The following conditions will govern the sale —

(1) No person may bid for purchase or deal in any manner whatsoever with ivory, or other trophies intended for resale whether within or without the Territory, at the auction sale unless he is in possession of a trophy dealer's licence issued under the provisions of section 38 (1) of the Fauna Conservation Ordinance (Cap 302 of the Laws of Tanganyika). No lot or lots to which this clause applies may be removed from the Customs Ivory Room until the purchaser has produced a valid trophy dealer's licence for inspection by the auctioneer. Any sale to a purchaser to whom this clause applies who is not licensed as aforesaid shall be void.

(2) The highest bidder to be the purchaser subject to the reserve price being obtained or exceeded, and should any dispute arise between the bidders before the ensuing lot is put up the lot in dispute may be put up again and resold.

(3) When the ivory is sold the bidding shall be in shillings and by the pound avoirdupois. Skins and other trophies shall be sold in such manner as the auctioneer may determine. The auctioneer shall regulate the amount to be advanced at each bidding and no person may retract his bidding.

(4) When rotten ivory is offered for sale a condition of the sale is that the ivory must be exported to a place outside East Africa which shall for the purposes of this condition, include Zanzibar.

(5) Immediately after the fall of the hammer the lot shall be at the absolute risk of the purchaser or purchasers.

(6) The auctioneer may without assigning any reason refuse to accept any bid.

(7) The purchaser of each lot shall if required, give his name and address to the auctioneer and shall, if required by the auctioneer, deposit in cash five per cent of the purchase price immediately after the fall of the hammer. If any purchaser fails to comply with either of these conditions the lot or lots concerned may at the discretion of the auctioneer be resold. If upon such resale the price obtained is less than that originally accepted the difference shall be payable by the original purchaser.

(8) When any lot or lots are sold by weight the purchaser shall not be entitled to claim in respect of short weight, which would appear to have been caused through natural shrinkage or drying out unless the short weight exceeds five per cent of the published weight and in which case the purchaser shall only be entitled to reimbursement in excess of five per cent. Any claim shall be made prior to delivery.

(9) No lot or lots may be removed from the Customs Ivory Room until fully paid for. Five per cent of the purchase price must be paid by the buyer not later than noon on the day after the sale and the full payment completed within ten days after the sale.

(10) Free storage will be allowed for a period of 14 days from the date of sale after which date each lot undelivered will be subject to a rental of Sh 4 per week or part thereof.

(11) Upon failure to comply with the above conditions the deposit shall be forfeited. Lots unpaid for as aforesaid may be resold either by public sale or private contract, and the deficiency, if any upon such second sale and all charges attending the same shall be made good by the defaulter at the present sale and be recoverable by the Regional Commissioner of Customs and Excise as and for liquidated damages but any surplus that may arise therefrom shall belong solely to the Regional Commissioner of Customs and Excise.

2 *Interest Credited to Depositors*—£183,400—This has again been estimated from total monthly balances standing to the credit of Depositors in the Main Ledger for 1960

3 *Losses of Savings Bank Moneys*—£1,093-19-48—This amount comprises 103 items which include —

- (i) 13 cases of misappropriation by Post Office employees. One person was responsible for 5 items totalling £47-10-0 and another person was responsible for 4 items totalling £39-10-0
- (ii) 38 cases of fraud etc. by members of the public. In one case of forgery involving 4 items totalling £83-8-0 the offender was sent to prison for 6 years. Another case of forgery involved 4 items totalling £138-10-0 for which the offender was sentenced to 2 years and 3 months imprisonment
- (iii) 1 case of burglary and 1 case of armed robbery, both at Mitubiri resulting in losses of £4-11-23 and £6-11-68 respectively
- (iv) 1 case of cash lost from the Savings Bank counter amounting to £175 attributed to a constructional fault in cash drawers whereby it was possible for money to be extracted from the rear of locked drawers

## BALANCE SHEET

4 The difference by which the total of individual depositors' accounts exceeds the corresponding amount in the Main Ledger was reduced by £80-1-92 as the result of errors relating to previous years being brought to light in 1960, so that the known difference as at 31st December, 1959, is £3,240-7-55. The comparison of the total amount standing to the credit of individual depositors' accounts with the relevant account in the Main Ledger as at 31st December 1960, is being undertaken but is not yet completed

5 Statements certified by the Comptroller and Auditor General of the United Kingdom in respect of cash and investments held by the Crown Agents on behalf of the Savings Bank at the 31st December 1960, have not yet been received although uncertified copies of these statements have been seen

## ORDER BY THE KENYA DAIRY BOARD

## NAIROBI MILK PRICES ORDER

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by the Dairy Industry (Prices of Dairy Produce) Regulations, 1961, the Kenya Dairy Board hereby orders as follows —

- 1 The Dairy Industry (Prices of Dairy Produce) Regulations, 1961, shall apply to the area of the City of Nairobi
- 2 For the purpose of regulation 3 the prices to be paid by retailers for the categories of milk specified in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be the respective fixed prices specified in sub-columns (A) and (B) of the second column of Part I
- 3 For the purpose of regulation 4 the prices to be paid to retailers for the categories of milk specified in Part II of the Schedule hereto shall be the respective fixed prices specified in the second column of Part II
- 4 The prices prescribed in Part II of the Schedule hereto shall not apply to purchases totalling 3 gallons of milk or more made by the same purchaser from the same retailer in any one day where such milk is contained in containers containing 1 gallon of milk or more
- 5 The Board may on application give special written authority to purchase or sell milk at prices other than those prescribed by this Order
- 6 This Order shall take effect from 1st August, 1961
