Qualifications—Candidates should have served a full-term apprenticeship with a mechanical engineering firm with a recognized scheme of apprenticeship or with a reputable garage and be in possession of indentures They should preferably have attended technical evening classes up to the United Kingdom National Certificate standard They should have had at least a further five years' experience as journeymen at their trade following completion of their apprenticeship and this experience should include welding oxy acetylene and electric arc, turning, smith work and some experience at automobile electrician's work Should have a good general knowledge of the maintenance, inspection and repair of motor vehicles and heavy earth moving plant, including high speed diesel engines, and be capable of supervising the operation of a garage or workshop with necessary technical records and returns Pump-fitting experience is also desirable

Duties—General mechanical duties, including the maintenance and overhaul of motor transport vehicles heavy earth-moving plant and diesel driven percussion and rotary drilling plant The installation, erection, maintenance and overhaul of pumping plant and the supervision of a provincial/divisional garage and workshop They are required to give practical demonstrations to the labour under their control and at times to undertake jobs themselves They are also responsible for the keeping of certain records and for the preparation of technical reports and returns

Inspectors (Mechanical) are likely to be stationed in almost any of the Territory's larger stations They are required from time to time to undertake safaris to work on new projects or on the maintenance of established installations at out stations

(6) *Assistant Superintendent of Police Police Force—Ministry of Home Affairs (Two Vacancies) (Pensionable or Contract)*

Salary scale—The basic salary scale of the post paid to officers on local terms is the B5—3 scale £678 by £27 to £759 by £30 to £789 £879 by £33 to £912 by £36 to £984 per annum

If the successful candidates are eligible for overseas terms and are accepted by the Secretary of State they will be appointed on the scale £1,143 by £45 to £1 233 by £48 to £1 617 by £51 to £1 668 by £54 to £1,776 per annum

Eligibility—Preference will be given in the first instance to officers of the Tanganyika Civil Service serving on Class 'L' leave terms and Africans who are serving otherwise than on Class 'L' terms or who are not in the public service, then to other officers not being on temporary appointment and then to persons normally resident in the Territory who are not included in the other categories

On satisfactory completion of the training, which will last for approximately one year, the candidate will be advanced to the substantive post of Assistant Superintendent of Prisons at a commencing salary of £678 per annum in the B(W)5—3 scale.)

Terms of Service

Appointments to the Training Grade normally last for not less than six months nor more than three years. Candidates who are found to be satisfactory after training are eligible for appointment to the posts for which they have been trained.

Except in the case of posts which are only offered on contract terms African candidates who are not more than 40 years of age may be offered appointment on probation to the permanent and pensionable service. Other candidates not already on pensionable terms will normally be offered appointment on contract.

An officer appointed on contract on overseas terms is given overseas leave and passage privileges and on satisfactory completion of his contract receives a gratuity equal to 25 per cent of the total salary paid to him under the contract.

An officer appointed on contract on local terms is given annual leave and local travel privileges and on satisfactory completion of his contract receives a gratuity equal to 13½ per cent of the total salary paid to him under the contract.

Free medical attention and limited housing privileges are given.
