AMENDMENT TO TARIFF BOOK No 3 (PART I)

THE East African Railways and Harbours gives notice that with effect from 1st September, 1961, Tariff Book No 3 (Part I) will be amended as follows —

PAGE 50 SECTION 90

Delete the entire section

Insert as follows —

“(1) Motor-cars, privately owned, on wheels, will be carried at the full scale ‘A’ vehicle rates given in section 340 of Part II of this Tariff Book on the forward journey and a reduction of 50 per cent will be granted on the return journey except as provided for in paragraph 4, subject to the following —

(a) That the owner consigns the vehicle between the same points as those for which one valid return first or two valid return second class passenger tickets, paid for at the standard rates detailed in sections 70 and 74 are produced at the time of booking

(b) That the vehicle is carried in an open railway wagon on those sections of the journey requiring rail transit

(c) That the Administration reserves the right to load other traffic in the railway wagon

(d) That the Administration cannot undertake to dispatch the vehicle by any particular train, nor can any specified time of arrival at destination be guaranteed

(e) That the carriage of motor cars at these reduced rates is undertaken only at the owner's risk, and subject also to the general conditions attached to the carriage of motor-cars

(2) The charges for both the forward and return journeys will be paid by the consignor at the time of booking for the forward journey

The rates for motor cars are given in section 340 of Part II of this Tariff Book

(3) Should the owner require the exclusive use of an open railway wagon or motor-van, the full ordinary rates will be applied

(4) Between Mombasa Station and Nairobi Station only accompanied motor-cars, privately owned, on wheels, will be carried at the scale ‘A’ rate less 20 per cent for a single journey provided that the owner produces one valid single first class ticket or two valid single second class tickets, paid for at the standard rates detailed in section 70 between the same points at the time of booking. The conditions stated in paragraphs 1 (b) and 1 (c) will apply. This rate is not available to unregistered cars

(5) Motor-scooters (including bicycles with motor attachments and mopeds) accompanying passengers will be carried between certain stations at the reduced rates given in section 340 (4) of Part II of this Tariff Book

Provided that—

(a) the owner holds a valid return first or second class passenger ticket between the two points concerned,

(b) the carriage of motor-scooters at these reduced rates is undertaken only at the owner's risk,

(c) the reduced rates apply to return journeys only single journeys and journeys between points other than those specified will be charged at the ordinary parcels rates”

Candidates should have a good honours degree in economics preferably with statistics as a special subject. Experience in a statistical organization on research in economic analysis or statistical surveys would be an advantage.

For those with Higher School Certificate the entry point will be £312 and for those with a degree of a British university £551. Trainees will serve on temporary terms during the period of training. After successful completion of a year's training and passing an examination, trainees may be promoted to the D scale at £506 or £574 for graduates.

Salary scale—The basic salary scale of the post paid to officers on local terms is £1,655 to £1,725 to £1,780 per annum.

If the successful candidate is eligible for overseas terms and is accepted by the Secretary of State he will be appointed on the scale £2,502 to £2,583 to £2,664 per annum.

Eligibility—Preference will be given in the first instance to officers of the Tanganyika Civil Service serving on Class "L" leave terms and Africans who are serving otherwise than on Class "L" terms or who are not in the public service, then to other officers not being on temporary appointment and then to persons normally resident in the Territory who are not included in the other categories.

Qualifications—Candidates must possess an accountancy qualification and a thorough knowledge of Gujarati both written and spoken. They must have had at least three years' practical experience as an accountant and should be able to investigate and report on books of account. They should also be conversant with commercial customs and usages in East Africa.

Duties—The successful candidate will be required to investigate the books of bankrupts and companies in liquidation, to report on them and, if so required, to give evidence on them in court.

- (2) *Town Planning Officer Town Planning Division Ministry of Local Government (One Vacancy) (Pensionable or Contract)*

Salary scale—The basic salary scale of the post paid to officers on local terms is the A scale £726 by £36 to £870 £945 by £39 to £1,023 by £45 to £1,068 by £48 to £1,308 £1,359 by £51 to £1,410 by £54 to £1,518 per annum.

Eligibility—Preference will be given in the first instance to officers of the Tanganyika Civil Service serving on Class "L" leave terms and Africans who are serving otherwise than on Class "L" terms or who are not in the public service, then to other officers not being on temporary appointment and then to persons normally resident in the Territory who are not included in the other categories.

Qualifications—Candidates who should preferably be above 23 years of age must be Chartered Town Planners and should preferably have five years' experience (though a candidate with only three years' experience might be considered). Preference will be given to candidates who in addition possess qualifications as civil engineers or architects or chartered surveyors. Women candidates are eligible for appointment.

Duties—The Division is responsible for preparing planning schemes on behalf of local authorities, for redevelopment planning for advising on the control of development and for the detailed design of the layout and subdivision of public land, which comprises the bulk of urban land. Comprehensive experience in these fields is essential and experience in the administration of planning law and regulations will be an advantage. The selected candidate is likely to spend most of his time in the capital, Dar es Salaam, but will be expected to travel up country and may eventually be stationed in the provinces.
