## COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIP AND FELLOWSHIP PLAN

#### PAKISTAN AWARDS, 1962

THE Pakistan Government is offering scholarships to men and women students from other parts of the Commonwealth under the Scholarship and Fellowship Plan and applications are now invited from candidates in Kenya

The scholarships are for Commonwealth students normally resident in other countries to pursue advanced courses or undertake research in Pakistan They are intended for persons of high intellectual promise who may be expected to make a significant contribution to life in their own countries on their return from study abroad They are primarily for post-gr duate study and research and applicants must therefore, be graduates or holders of equivalent qualifications of recognized universities

Eligibility—Candidates must normally be Commonwealth citizens or British protected persons resident in countries of the Commonwealth other than Pakistan

Applicants must not have reached their 35th birthday by 1st September, 1962 but preference will be given to candidates who are between 22 and 28 years of age

The subjects for which facilities of study exist in Pakistan are as follows —

Islamic studies, Urdu Archaeology, Agriculture Arabic Geology, Geography and Education

Tenure of awards—Awards will normally be made for a period of two years, but in exceptional circumstances may be for a shorter or longer period, but not exceeding three years

Value of awards—All expenses plud including tuition and tourist class passages to and from Kenya

- 7 The grantee shall comply with the provisions of the Petroleum Ordinance (Cap 304) and any amendment thereto or reenactment thereof for the time being in force and the rules made from time to time thereunder
- 8 The buildings shall not cover a greater area of land than may be prescribed by the Local Authority
  - 9 The grantee shall not subdivide the land
- 10 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet or charge the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Governor no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed
- 11 The grantee shall not erect on the land any hoarding, placard, poster sign or advertisement except a notice advertising the presence and products of the grantee's business
- 12 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sums as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid
- 13 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess
- 14 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require any road serving or adjoining the land to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess
- 15 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Governor in lieu thereof
- 16 The Governor or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains
- 17 No covenant condition or requirement will be entered into imposed or made whereby the ownership or occupation of the land or any part thereof is restricted to persons of a particular face or faces or class or classes of race, or whereby such persons are excluded from such ownership or occupation

## THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE (Cap 155)

#### KISUMU MUNICIPALITY—QUARRY SITE

THE Commissioner of Lands invites tenders for quarrying rights in respect of the quarry reserve of approximately 19 acres at present used as a municipal quarry by the Kisumu Municipal Council

2 A plan of the site may be seen at the office of the Town Clerk, Kisumu, or at the Lands Department, City Square, Nairobi

#### (a) Conditions of Tender

- 1 Sealed tenders marked 'Tender for Quarry, Kısumu' together with a deposit of Sh 1,000 must be deposited with the Department of Lands before noon on 3rd March, 1962 Should any tender not be accepted the Sh 1,000 will be refunded to the unsuccessful tenderer
- 2 Tenders should be accompanied by a statement indicating—
  - (a) an annual rent tendered for the area concerned There will be no royalty payable upon stone or stone chippings quarried and disposed of,
  - (b) the required term of the grant based upon the tenderer's estimate of the life of the quarry, for which he is prepared to pay the tendered rent
  - 3 The successful tenderer will be required to -
  - (1) Purchase at a price to be agreed by the tenderer and the Kisumu Municipal Council the quarry plant now on the site
  - (11) Supply to the Kisumu Municipal Council its requirements for stone and stone chippings. The amount of stone and stone chippings and the price therefor to be agreed annually in advance with the Kisumu Municipal Council Such stone and stone chippings as may be required by the Kisumu Municipal Council shall be given priority of supply
- 4 The successful tenderer will be required to pay the rent due to 31st December, 1962, within seven days of the notification that his tender has been accepted and thereafter the rent reserved on the 1st day of January in each succeeding year
  - 5 The highest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted

#### (b) General Conditions of Licence

- 1 The land shall be used for the purpose of quarrying stone only, save as is hereinafter provided
- 2 The land shall not be quarried within 100 ft of any road or road reserve
- 3 Quarrying will commence on the lowest part of the plot, provided this is not within 100 ft of any road or road reserve
- 4 No excavation will be effected below the level of the commencing point
- 5 The floor of the quarry will have a slight upward grade towards the working face and will be so drained as to be clean and free from mosquito-breeding areas to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health and the Commissioner of Lands
- 6 Spoil will be used to (a) level the quarry floor after quarrying, (b) fill excavations on the plot outside the actual quarry as directed by the Commissioner of Lands or such officer as he may appoint to act on his behalf, (c) no spoil will be removed from the site
- 7 At all times the grantee will comply with the reasonable requests of the Commissioner of Lands, or such officer as he may appoint to act on his behalf, in respect of the proper conduct of quarrying operations
- 8 Housing for Africans employed on the site may be erected on the plot in accordance with the requirements of the Commissioner for Labour, Nairobi
- 9 Proper sanitary arrangements will be provided in accordance with the requirements of the Medical Officer of Health, Kisumu Municipal Council
- 10 The sides of the quarry will be left vertical or sloped outwards to the quarry floor to prevent any subsequent fall of earth or stone
- 11 The grantee will maintain all beacons and shall keep them open and free from obstruction
- 12 The grantee will mark out the boundaries of the plot with posts at 50-ft intervals
- 13 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or Local Authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the Governor in lieu thereof
- 14 The grantee shall not at any time during the tenancy assign, mortgage or sublet or part with the possession of the plot or any buildings erected thereon save with the prior consent of the Commissioner of Lands first having been obtained in writing
- 15 The grantee will comply with the provisions of the Mining O dinance and rules and regulations made thereunder
