EAST AFRICAN RAILWAYS AND HARBOURS (Tanganyika Section)

Tariff of Harbour Dues and Charges No. 1 Amendment Slip No. 17

It is notified for general information that the following amendments to the Tariff of Harbour Dues and Charges No. 1 will come into effect on 1st May, 1963:—

Clause 26—Imports

Delete section (b) and substitute therefor:—

(b) Handling:

Dar es Salaam and Tanga

Handling Charge, Sh. 17 per ton or unit as prescribed in Clause 25 of this tariff. (Minimum charge Sh. 8/50.)

Mtwara

Handling Charge, Sh. 15 per ton or unit as prescribed in Clause 25 of this tariff. (Minimum charge Sh. 7/50.)

Notes:

1. Where two or more minima under more than one Bill of Lading are included on one Declaration and Disposal Order, the minimum charge shall apply in each case.

2. At Dar es Salaam, when documents, complete in every respect, have been lodged with the Management prior to the day on which the ship arrives in Dar es Salaam Harbour a rebate of Sh. 1 per ton of cargo will be allowed.

Clause 27—Exports

Delete the "Handling" rate of Sh. 10 wherever it appears under Dar es Salaam and Tanga and Sh. 8 under Mtwara and substitute therefor Sh. 11 and Sh. 9 respectively.

In the case of "Scrap metal (n.o.e.)", delete Sh. 16 and substitute therefor Sh. 17 in respect of Dar es Salaam and Tanga and delete Sh. 14 and substitute therefor Sh. 15 in respect of Mtwara.

Clause 28—Coastwise Cargo

Delete the clause in its entirety and substitute therefor:

28. COASTWISE CARGO:

Cargo as under, not for transhipment, loaded and discharged by vessels trading between any two ports and Zanzibar territories, shall be charged as follows, subject to a minimum charge of Sh. 2/50 in the case of imports and Sh. 1 in the case of exports.
