5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.

Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.

In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the Local Authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the Local Authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term

hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall only be used for private residential purposes and not more than one private dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings appurtenant thereto shall be erected on the land.

6. The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area as may be laid down by the Local Authority in its By-laws.

7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without the prior written consent of the Commissioner of Lands.

8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.

9. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

10. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

12. CAUSE NO. 15 OF 1966

Parties:—

Kenya Chemical Workers' Union
and
Jupiter Chemical Company

Issue in dispute:—

Effective Date and Period of Operation.

1. Kenya Chemical Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Jupiter Chemical Company shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on 30th March 1966, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

3. In Cause No. 56 of 1965 between these Parties the Court stated:—

"The Court notes that the Respondents have in their written submissions asked the Court to award 1st September 1965, as the effective date but the Claimants did not make any submissions to the Court on this. Effective date and the duration of the award did not appear as an issue in this dispute and the Court, therefore, does not make any award in respect thereto."

Subsequent to the publishing of the Court's Award there was a difference of opinion between the Parties as to whether or not agreement had been reached on the effective date of the wages award. They agreed that the effective date issue be referred to the Court as a fresh dispute in accordance with the provisions of the Trade Disputes Act, 1965, as this issue had not been included in the original Issues in Dispute in Cause No. 56 of 1965.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

4. The Claimants submitted that the effective date of the whole agreement, which was to incorporate wages and other benefits, had been agreed with the Respondents at 1st April 1965, and that that was the reason why it had not been included as an issue in Cause No. 56 of 1965. The Claimants produced minutes of meetings held in May, July, August and November 1965, in order to support their contention. They stated that although they had agreed to a different commencement date in respect of wages it was conditional on certain figures being agreed by the Respondents and as these had not been accepted by the Respondents they were not bound by it. They, therefore, requested the Court to award the effective date for wages and other issues, which were in dispute, as from 1st April 1965, and award to continue in force for a period of 12 months' duration.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

5. The Respondents submitted that under section 10 (2) of the Trade Disputes Act, 1965, the award of the Court took effect from the date it was published in the Official Gazette and, therefore, the Court was not competent to accept this dispute. Without prejudice to this the Respondents submitted that the minutes of the meetings produced by the Claimants clearly proved that there had been no agreement on the effective date in respect of wages and that, therefore, the Court should consider all the circumstances relating to this dispute and award the effective date as the first of the month following the Court's award, i.e. 1st February 1966, and to specify its duration for 12 months.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the Respondents' submission that, in the absence of any specific directions by the Court on the effective date of its award, then, the effective date is the date of its publication in the Gazette, but rejects this submission in the present dispute. If the Parties had at no time made any reference to the effective date of the agreement covering terms and conditions of employment including wages, and this matter had not been raised by either Party in the previous dispute (Cause No. 56 of 1965), the Court would have had sympathy with the Respondents' arguments.

It is clear, however, that the Parties had discussed this issue, and when the matter came to Court in Cause No. 56 of 1965, they were both labouring under different impressions. If this had not been so the employers would not have made reference under this issue in their written submissions and the Claimants would not have refrained from saying anything on it.

In these circumstances the Court, after having considered all the aspects of this dispute, awards that the effective date shall be 1st December 1965, and that this Award shall remain in force for 12 months from that date.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 32 OF 1965

Parties:—

The Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union
(Claimants)
and

Nairobi District Retail Dairymen's Association (Respondents)

GENERAL BACKGROUND

1. In this Cause the Court published its Award on the 12th day of October 1965. Section 5 para. 2 of the Award states:—

"The Court finds that clause 7, although ambiguously worded, allows the Claimants to re-open discussions at a later date. The Court is not satisfied that the re-opening of the discussions was tied to the inauguration of the National Provident Fund Scheme. In view of the fact that no discussions have taken place between the Parties the Court requires them to discuss and if possible reach an agreement on this issue. The result of their negotiations should be notified to the Court within a period of three months from the date of the Award."

2. The Parties, as a result of this Award, appeared to have exchanged correspondence, the gist of which is that the Claimants rejected the two insurance schemes put forward by the Respondents and insisted on a gratuity scheme for their members for the period of their services with the Respondents up to the time of the implementation of the National Scheme. The Respondents maintained that the demand put forward by the Claimants had never been an issue in this dispute and, therefore, they insisted that the Claimants should start negotiations with them on one of these two insurance schemes. In these circumstances the Court decided to give the Parties an opportunity of addressing the Court on their arguments and a further hearing took place on 31st March 1966.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

3. The Claimants maintained that what they were after and, in fact, had sought all along was a gratuity scheme for their members for the period of service up to the introduction of the National Scheme. The Claimants argued that they were not interested in the insurance schemes, which in any case they claimed the Respondents would not be able to operate successfully as they could not pay decent wages to their workers due to the shortage of money. They requested the Court to award three weeks' pay for every completed year of service up to the date of the National Scheme.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

4. The Respondents, on the other hand, stated that the Claimants had from the very beginning been interested in a pension scheme for their members and that they had during the hearing tried to shift their demands to one of gratuity, an issue, they claimed, which had never been discussed between them. The Respondents found that in view of the National Scheme there was no point in having a pension scheme but they were prepared to consider the introduction of an insurance scheme which would be complementary to the National Scheme. The Respondents pointed out that the Claimants had exhibited a negative attitude to the whole matter and requested the Court to order the Claimants to finalize the details with them on one of the insurance schemes.

AWARD

5. After having gone through the correspondence and arguments put forward by the Parties the Court finds that the Parties have not carried out exactly what the Court had envisaged.

During the first hearing it became apparent that the Parties were talking on different subjects, and, therefore, the Court had decided to afford them a further opportunity of sorting out this difference and possibly reach agreement. But this had proved futile and the Parties were still in the same position as before.

In these circumstances in fairness to both the Claimants and the Respondents the Court has decided not to make any award just now. Both Parties are given an opportunity of tabling fresh demands on this subject so that proper and fruitful negotiations may be carried out on clearly defined issues. In the event of non-settlement this issue should come before the Court as a new dispute. The present dispute is, therefore, closed.

CAUSE NO. 7 OF 1966

Parties:—

Transport and Allied Workers' Union
and
Kenya Bus Services Limited, Nairobi
Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited
Bulwark Transport (E.A.) Limited

Issues in dispute:—

- (a) Wages and Housing Allowance.
- (b) Leave.
- (c) Severance Pay.
- (d) Date of Agreement.

1. Transport and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Bus Services Limited, Nairobi; Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited and Bulwark Transport (E.A.) Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on 26th and 28th March 1966, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

3. Negotiations on wage revision between the Claimants and the Respondents which had commenced prior to the introduction of the Tripartite Agreement in early 1964 were allowed to take place under the provisions of the Tripartite Agreement. As a result of these negotiations the Parties entered into an agreement effective from 1st March 1964, which provided for wage increases for the Respondents employees from Sh. 12 per month to Sh. 25 per month. This agreement remained in force until the 28th day of February 1966. In January 1966, the Claimants put forward fresh demands on wages and terms and conditions of employment and meetings were held between the Parties on these proposals on 18th, 20th, 28th January and 1st, 2nd, 4th, 7th and 8th February 1966. These meetings resulted in agreement on all issues with the exception of the ones which are in dispute in the present case. The Parties agreed to refer these issues to the Industrial Court in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act, 1965, and signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 8th February 1966. The Court was informed by the Parties that they had agreed that the Court's award made in this cause would apply equally to Kenya Bus Services Limited, Nairobi; Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited and Bulwark Transport (E.A.) Limited but that the existing terms and conditions of employment for these companies would remain the same.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

4. (a) *Wages and Housing Allowance.*—The Claimants submitted that the Respondents' present wage level for their various employees was very low as compared to wages being paid by other firms in the country. They contended that the Respondents' employees were engaged in strenuous work which involved a high degree of responsibility and skill as they had to drive extremely long buses and double-decker buses also. They stated that due to the increase in population in Nairobi and Mombasa the revenue of the Respondents had gone up considerably but that the employees who had had to work harder had not received any increase in their wages. The Claimants maintained that other smaller firms like United Touring Company, Eboo's Motor Service and Ivory Safaris paid higher wages than the Respondents who were now operating more than 100 buses. Workers were entitled to lead a decent life the Claimants emphasized and all efforts should be made to raise the standard of living of ordinary working Africans.

The Oil Industry, the Brewing Group, the Banks and the D.A.T.A. Group all paid much higher wages to their drivers than the Respondents. Conductors were discharging a very responsible duty and some of them handled up to Sh. 5,000 in one month yet the wages paid to these conductors were very low. It was the Claimants' submission that if the Respondents wanted to eliminate cases of stealing by conductors they should pay them decent wages. The Claimants also drew the Court's attention to inspectors, mechanics and clerical staff employed by the Respondents and argued that their wages and salaries should be increased substantially. The Claimants submitted to the Court their demands ranging from Sh. 350 for the lowest-paid employee to Sh. 1,500 for Grade I Clerks and Traffic Supervisors and Sh. 1,825 for Ferry Inspectors. They also put forward a revised job classification scheme which they accepted had at no time been discussed or agreed with the Respondents.

The Claimants maintained that the house allowance of Sh. 35 and Sh. 40 which was currently being paid was not enough for employees to live in a decent two-roomed dwelling. At present workers were living with their families in single

rooms and at times two families were forced to share one room. They requested the Court to award a house allowance of between Sh. 75 and Sh. 120 per month.

(b) *Leave.*—The Claimants submitted that they had in the first instance demanded that for each period of 12 months' continuous service with the Respondents an employee should be entitled to annual leave of 42 days excluding public holidays. Later on during negotiations they claimed to have reduced this demand as follows:—

1. Employees up to two years of service should get 21 days' leave per year.
2. Employees with two years to five years of service should get 25 days' leave per year.
3. Employees with over five years of service should get 30 days' leave per year.

This demand the Claimants maintained compared favourably with other agreements which they had negotiated with other firms like United Touring Company, Ivory Safaris, East African Airways and Eboo's Motor Service.

(c) *Severance Pay.*—The Claimants submitted that the current agreement between the Parties provided that in case of redundancy an employee should get an additional benefit calculated at the rate of one day's pay for each month of service up to a maximum of six months' pay. They pointed out that during negotiations the Respondents had stated that this scheme would remain in force until the effective date of the National Social Security Fund but as they could not subscribe to this view the matter was referred to the Industrial Court. The Claimants submitted that this benefit had nothing to do with the Provident Fund Scheme.

(d) *Date of Agreement.*—The Claimants submitted that the new agreement between the Parties should be effective from 1st January 1966, because the Respondents' employees had suffered severely on account of low wages during the last two years, and even the Sh. 12 increase granted in 1964 was not adequate.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

5. (a) *Wages and Housing Allowance.*—The Respondents stated that they operated a total of 114 vehicles and had one of the most modern and fully-equipped depots in Kenya to carry out maintenance and repair work. They had since 1963 replaced no less than 50 vehicles by new ones in order to maintain an efficient bus service for the benefit of the public. During the past three years there had been a considerable increase in operating costs which they had absorbed as fares had remained unchanged since October 1962. Various facts and figures illustrating how vehicle operating costs had gone up were put forward by the Respondents. They pointed out that under the terms of their agreement with the City Council they were not allowed to alter the fare structure without the written consent of the Council. They had also to pay to the Council a franchise fee based on the turnover of their earnings during the financial year. They were also obliged to maintain a number of uneconomic routes which had to be subsidized from the paying routes.

In February 1964, under the terms of the Tripartite Agreement they had engaged an additional 10 per cent of the labour force and most of these employees had been absorbed into regular employment. The Respondents submitted that out of approximately 18,000 employees employed by the private sector in road transport, they accounted for only 5 per cent of this number. The vast majority of workers in the road transport industry were subject to a Wages Council Order—The Road Transport Order of 1963 and they maintained that their wages were far superior to those specified in that Order. They submitted that in 1962 they had carried out an exercise in re-grading of staff and that wage differentials which had existed between employees performing the same duties were eliminated. Keeping all these factors in view the Respondents had proposed the following increments:—

Staff present receiving Sh. 165 + house allowance of Sh. 35 = Sh. 200 should receive an increase of Sh. 25 to bring up the basic pay to Sh. 190 + house allowance of Sh. 35 = Sh. 225.

Staff earning Sh. 197 + house allowance of Sh. 35 = Sh. 232 should receive an increase of Sh. 20 on the basic pay to bring it up to Sh. 217 + house allowance of Sh. 35 = Sh. 252.

An increase of Sh. 15 on the basic rate was offered to all other employees.

The Respondents submitted that their annual wage bill represented some 41 per cent of the total cost of their expenditure and that their proposals would cost them another £8,424 a year. The Court's attention was drawn to the fact that they were operating a medical centre at Eastleigh Depot which cost them over £4,000 a year. They requested the Court to make the award on the lines of their offers.

The Respondents strongly opposed any increase in the house allowance stating that the Claimants had made no case whatsoever for any increase.

(b) *Leave*.—Their present annual leave of 21 consecutive days on full pay was considered by the Respondents to be adequate and no justification could be found for any increase. They had offered that where public holidays fell during the 21 days' leave they were prepared to give an additional day's leave to cover the public holidays. They also pointed out that if employees accumulated their leave for two years they got a total of 46 days' leave instead of 42.

(c) *Severance Pay*.—The Respondents submitted that they had a scheme for severance pay but that the Claimants' wishes in respect of this scheme appeared to conflict with the National Social Security Fund Act, the commencement of which would see the end of this scheme. They stated that any award by the Court under this issue would be contrary to law.

(d) *Date of Agreement*.—It was submitted by the Respondents that their present agreement expired on the 28th day of February 1966, but as the two months' extension to the Tripartite Agreement had not been anticipated at the signing of the 1964 agreement, they were entitled to this additional benefit of two months. Further in accordance with the award of the Industrial Court in Cause No. 25 of 1965, the Respondents on behalf of the Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited and in agreement with the Claimants, had accepted parity with Nairobi made in respect of wages and housing allowance which would bring Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited into line with Kenya Bus Services Limited, Nairobi. In these circumstances they requested the Court to award the effective date as 1st May 1966, and to fix the duration of the award for 12 months until 30th April 1967.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the various submissions made by the Parties before making its findings.

(a) *Wages and Housing Allowance*.—The Court awards a wage increase of Sh. 35 per month to all employees provided that the Mombasa employees shall get a wage increase of Sh. 29 per month only. This would achieve parity between the Mombasa and the Nairobi rates.

The Court makes a nil award in respect of housing allowance.

(b) *Leave*.—Nil award.

(c) *Severance Pay*.—During the hearing it became obvious that the Parties were not clear as to the nature of their dispute in this issue. It appeared that the dispute was whether or not, with the commencement of the National Social Security Fund Act, the Severance Pay Scheme as operated by the Respondents came to an end. As this point is one of considerable importance to both employers and workers, the Court is not prepared to make a ruling on this issue in the present dispute as full and proper arguments were not put forward by the Parties. In these circumstances the present practice under this issue shall continue subject to the Parties being at liberty, if it is found necessary, to bring this matter to the Court as a fresh dispute in which event the Court will be prepared to give a ruling on this point after a full hearing.

(d) *Date of Agreement*.—The Court is satisfied that the 1964 agreement between the Parties was negotiated freely and voluntarily. The Respondents are entitled to the benefits under the Tripartite Agreement and in order to achieve uniformity between the Nairobi and Mombasa agreement the Court awards the effective date of the new agreement to be 1st May 1966, and further that this agreement shall come to an end after a period of 12 months, i.e. on 30th April 1967.

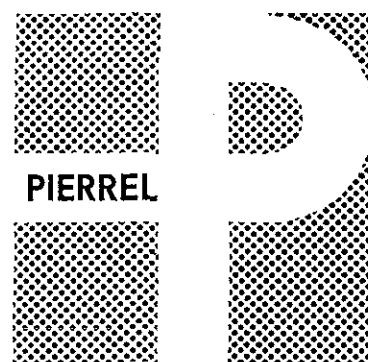

(b) *Leave*.—Their present annual leave of 21 consecutive days on full pay was considered by the Respondents to be adequate and no justification could be found for any increase. They had offered that where public holidays fell during the 21 days' leave they were prepared to give an additional day's leave to cover the public holidays. They also pointed out that if employees accumulated their leave for two years they got a total of 46 days' leave instead of 42.

(c) *Severance Pay*.—The Respondents submitted that they had a scheme for severance pay but that the Claimants' wishes in respect of this scheme appeared to conflict with the National Social Security Fund Act, the commencement of which would see the end of this scheme. They stated that any award by the Court under this issue would be contrary to law.

(d) *Date of Agreement*.—It was submitted by the Respondents that their present agreement expired on the 28th day of February 1966, but as the two months' extension to the Tripartite Agreement had not been anticipated at the signing of the 1964 agreement, they were entitled to this additional benefit of two months. Further in accordance with the award of the Industrial Court in Cause No. 25 of 1965, the Respondents on behalf of the Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited and in agreement with the Claimants, had accepted parity with Nairobi made in respect of wages and housing allowance which would bring Kenya Bus Services (Mombasa) Limited into line with Kenya Bus Services Limited, Nairobi. In these circumstances they requested the Court to award the effective date as 1st May 1966, and to fix the duration of the award for 12 months until 30th April 1967.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the various submissions made by the Parties before making its findings.

(a) *Wages and Housing Allowance*.—The Court awards a wage increase of Sh. 35 per month to all employees provided that the Mombasa employees shall get a wage increase of Sh. 29 per month only. This would achieve parity between the Mombasa and the Nairobi rates.

The Court makes a nil award in respect of housing allowance.

(b) *Leave*.—Nil award.

(c) *Severance Pay*.—During the hearing it became obvious that the Parties were not clear as to the nature of their dispute in this issue. It appeared that the dispute was whether or not, with the commencement of the National Social Security Fund Act, the Severance Pay Scheme as operated by the Respondents came to an end. As this point is one of considerable importance to both employers and workers, the Court is not prepared to make a ruling on this issue in the present dispute as full and proper arguments were not put forward by the Parties. In these circumstances the present practice under this issue shall continue subject to the Parties being at liberty, if it is found necessary, to bring this matter to the Court as a fresh dispute in which event the Court will be prepared to give a ruling on this point after a full hearing.

(d) *Date of Agreement*.—The Court is satisfied that the 1964 agreement between the Parties was negotiated freely and voluntarily. The Respondents are entitled to the benefits under the Tripartite Agreement and in order to achieve uniformity between the Nairobi and Mombasa agreement the Court awards the effective date of the new agreement to be 1st May 1966, and further that this agreement shall come to an end after a period of 12 months, i.e. on 30th April 1967.

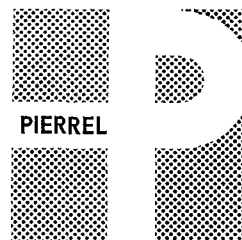
