GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTANCY EXAMINATIONS

THE Scheme of Service for the Accountancy grades of the Executive Service was set out in Personnel Circular No. 32. - (b) Public Finance

(3 hours) 1330-1630

Second Day

(c) Government Accounts

(3 hours) 0900-1200.

Syllabuses

4. The syllabuses of the examinations are set out in Part III of the Appendix to Personnel Circular No. 32. A list of books which candidates are recommended to study as part of their preparation for these examinations is given in Appendix A, although the list is not exhaustive and candidates should read as widely as possible.

Eligibility to Enter

- 5. Candidates must be Kenya citizens and in the case of:-
- (a) Examination No. 1 be serving clerical officers who have had not less than one year's practical accounting experience immediately prior to the examination; and
- (b) Examination No. 2 be either-
- (i) in the Grade G.7 (Direct Entrant); or
- (ii) in the grade of G.5 at the date of introduction of the Scheme (and thereby exempt from Examination No. 1); or
- (iii) any other officer having completed, and passed, a three months' Junior Accounts course at the K.I.A.

Candidates must pass Examination No. 1 or have been exempted, before offering themselves for Examination No. 2.

Entry Fees


