THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 78 of 1966

Parties: --

Kenya Civil Servants' Union

and

Ministry of Works

Issue in Dispute:-

Wrongful Termination of Services.

- 1. The Kenya Civil Servants' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Ministry of Works shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The Parties were heard in Nairobii on the 9th and 10th January 1967 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants called two witnesses, Mr. J. B. D'Souza and Mr. Ramzan Nizamdin, in support of their case.

General Background

3. One Ramzan Nizamdin had been employed by the Respondents since the 15th August 1958 as a driver. On 18th March 1964 his services were terminated by the Respondents vide a letter dated 17th March 1964 signed by the Acting Regional Engineer, Eastern Region, which stated as follows:—

"Dear Sir,

Re: DISCIPLINE

Further to this office letter No. WP/9256 dated 6th March 1964, you are informed that authority has been given to terminate your services with one month's pay in lieu of notice.

- 2. In addition, 20 days accumulable leave which you have earned will also be granted to you with effect from 27-3-64 to 15-4-64 inclusive.
- 3. Since you have less than seven years' continuous service you are not eligible for retirement benefits."

The letter dated 6th March 1964, referred to in the notice of termination of service, advised the said Ramzan Nizamdin that on account of various charges which had been preferred against him departmentally, authority was being sought to terminate his services

On 18th March 1964, Ramzan Nizamdin wrote a letter appealing against the said notice of termination and asked the Claimants to take up the matter. After the local officials had failed to secure a proper settlement, the matter was referred to the Claimants' Provincial Secretary and as a result of representations made on 26th May 1964 the Regional Engineer replied on 1st June 1964 giving the following reasons for the termination of appointment of the said Ramzan Nizamdin:—

- (1) Driving over the speed limit of 45 miles per hour on 18/2/1963
- (2) Deliberately driving GK 3834 over a stone more than 2 ft. above the ground on 9/1/64, and thereby causing damage to the radiator.
- (3) Refusing to accept a transfer to Embu in October 1963, resulting in his increment being deferred.
- (4) Since attaining the age of 55 years on 15/10/62, and being not the Government's policy to retain in service officers of the age of 55 years and over, approval was given by the Government that he be removed from the service on the age ground.

The Claimants challenged the aforesaid reasons and as a result a meeting was arranged between the Claimants and the Provincial Engineer during which the charges were discussed in full. As a result of what transpired at this meeting, the Claimants wrote a letter to the Civil Secretary on 18th September 1964 in which an appeal was made to him to reinstate Ramzan Nizamdin until he qualified for a gratuity payment. The Civil Secretary replied vide his letter of 9th November 1964 that he could not vary the decision in view of the regulations governing the retention of officers in Kenya Government service over the age of 55 years.

Sometime in 1962 a Government Medical Officer had assessed the said Ramzan Nizamdin's age as 55 years. After reference to this employee's age in the Civil Secretary's letter mentioned hereinabove, the Claimants pursued this question of age vigorously and an opinion was obtained from a private medical practitioner who assessed his age at around 50 years. After this a Medical Board was appointed composed of three doctors who testified that Ramzan Nizamdin's age was 50 years and he was fit to work as a driver.

In spite of the ruling by the Medical Board, the Claimants did not succeed in securing this employee's reinstatement and the Claimants decided to report a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour and a conciliator was appointed. The conciliator made the following recommendation:—

"In view of the above, and the delay that has occurred before the matter was taken up, either by the Officer himself or the Union, the Investigator found it difficult to recommend the reinstatement of Mr. Nizamdin. However, considering that Mr. Nizamdin has served the Ministry for four years, the Investigator has strongly recommended that the Ministry of Works should consider granting an ex gratia payment to him.

I would recommend that the parties concerned should accept the Investigator's recommendations as a basis for the settlement of the dispute."

The Respondents rejected the recommendation and the Claimants also were not satisfied with it. As a result the Parties at the Claimants' insistence decided to refer the matter to the Industrial Court and signed the notification of dispute form on or about the 26th October 1966 in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act 1965.

Main Submissions on Behalf of the Claimants

4. The Claimants submitted that, when they had intervened in the matter the Respondents had alleged that Ramzan Nizamdin's services had been terminated on the grounds of unsatisfactory work and conduct. The Respondents had later on put forward the main reason for the termination of services as being the age. The Claimants argued that this change had been brought about because the Respondents had come to realize that the various alleged charges which they had preferred against this employee could not be substantiated and in any event were not serious enough to warrant a dismisal on disciplinary grounds. The Claimants alleged that at the meeting which they had with the Provincial Engineer when the charges against Ramzan Nizamdin were discussed in full, the Provincial Engineer agreed that the charges did not merit termination of service except the last one relating to age which was a technical matter in view of the medical evidence involved, and because the termination had been carried out by the Civil Secretary the Claimants had no alternative but to write to him for reinstatement. This had been done with the full concurrence and advice of the Provincial Engineer.

The Claimants submitted that the age question was settled by the Medical Board and the Respondents had, therefore, no grounds whatsoever for terminating this driver's services.

The Claimants stated that this employee had suffered because he did not get on well with one of his superior officers and who had engineered and brought about the various charges which were referred to in the Respondents' case. The Claimants also stated that the said Ramzan Nizamdin had never received any letters of warning which are alleged to have been sent to him.

The Claimants pointed out that the charge sheets in respect of various incidents had been given to the said Ramzan Nizamdin for his explanations which he had entered on them, but it was most unfortunate that the decisions made in respect of these charges were never conveyed to him. The Claimants argued at length on the four incidents which had formed the basis of the termination of their member's services and stated that they had produced sufficient and satisfactory evidence to the Court as a result of which the Court should find that Ramzan Nizamdin had given truthful account of the various events and that it should, therefore, order that he be reinstated so that he would be entitled to the gratuity benefit after completing seven years of service.

The Claimants conceded that there was no procedure agreed between them and the Government when disciplinary action was taken against a temporary employee and stated that the Code of Regulations has been agreed between the Parties and they were bound by it. They also accepted that the said Ramzan Nizamdin was a temporary employee subject to a month's notice.

The Claimants further stated that this employee had never been insolent or insubordinate to his superior officer on 27th February 1962 and that, in fact, the incident had arisen when the senior officer had told him not to park his lorry at the usual place at 4.30 p.m. Regarding the allegation that he had been driving his lorry, while on drag duty, between 45 and 50 m.p.h., he stated that he was driving at 20 m.p.h. On the question of his refusal to go on transfer to Embu from Kitui, the Claimants urged that his superior officer's conduct and action in this matter were extremely unreasonable and that Ramzan Nizamdin could not be expected to go on transfer at such a short notice particularly when there was no one to look after his wife who was expected to deliver a child any day. Regarding the final allegation of Ramzan Nizamdin having deliberately driven a Government vehicle over a stone 2 ft. above the ground, the Claimants stated that this was not possible and denied that any damage that had been caused to the radiator was as a result of a deliberate act or that the damage was extensive.

The Claimants produced all the relevant letters in connexion with this matter and requested the Court to give an award in their favour and find that Ramzan Nizamdin's services had been wrongfully terminated.

Main Submissions on Behalf of the Respondents

- 5. The Respondents submitted that from 1962 there had been a marked deterioration in the efficiency and conduct of Ramzan Nizamdin as instanced from the following charges:—
 - (a) On 27th February 1962 he was charged for being insubordinate and insolent to his senior officer. On this occasion he was given a warning in a letter dated 12th March 1962, and was given an opportunity to eradicate his shortcomings in another department.
 - (b) On 18th February 1963 he was charged for driving a motor vehicle—Commer Tipper OHMS 47C6—at a constant speed of 45-50 m.p.h. while dragging a tree. He was given a further written warning dated 5th March 1963.
 - (c) In September 1963 the Road Unit to which Mr. Nizamdin was attached had moved away from Kitui to Embu. Mr. Nizamdin had no alternative but to go with his Unit, and he refused to do so. A Medical Officer certified that Mrs. Nizamdin could not travel, and the driver was allowed to leave his wife behind until such time as she was able to travel. Mr. Nizamdin refused to accept this. He was granted two days' leave to enable him to make arrangements for his wife's stay in Kitui, but in spite of this arrangement he stayed away from work for more than one week. Consequently, his increment was not granted, and a letter dated 4th October 1963 was written to him.
 - (d) On 8th November 1963 he was charged for damaging a motor vehicle, GK 50C3, with another vehicle, GK 9516, which he was driving. The Police report confirmed that the accident was caused by careless driving and speeding.
 - (e) On 14th January 1964 Mr. Nizamdin was charged for deliberately driving a vehicle, No. GK 3834, over a stone more than 2 ft. above the ground, thereby damaging the radiator. In this connexion he was informed in a letter dated 6th March 1964 that authority for termination of his appointment was being sought for constant adverse reports.

During the hearing the Senior State Counsel appearing for the Respondents pointed out that Ramzan Nizamdin had been acquitted in proceedings which were taken against him as a result of the incident mentioned in paragraph (d) hereinabove and requested the Court to disregard this allegation against the said employee.

The Respondents maintained that this employee had been dismissed on disciplinary grounds and not because of age. His services had been terminated on 17th March 1964 and he had been given one month's salary in lieu of notice *vide* the letter reproduced hereinabove in the general background.

In discharging this employee the Civil Secretary, Eastern Region, in good faith had taken account of his age as assessed by a Medical Officer in 1962, and the fact that after the age of 55 years the energy and efficiency of officers was bound to deteriorate as reflected in the conduct of Ramzan Nizamdin for the period 1962 to 1964. The Respondents maintained that, in discharging this employee for what could be termed gross inefficiency, the Civil Secretary had referred to age grounds in order not to prejudice the officer's chances of obtaining employment elsewhere.

The Respondents submitted that, from the answers given by Ramzan Nizamdin during cross-examination, it was clear that he was not a truthful witness and that the various charges which had been brought against him were fully gone into at the time and were proved. The Respondents requested the Court not to penalize them for not having substantiated these charges during the current proceedings as most of the officers and persons concerned had left the country.

The Respondents, therefore, submitted that, notwithstanding that Ramzan Nizamdin may be under the compulsory retiring age of 55 years, they were justified in terminating his services. They therefore requested the Court to reject the claim.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the various submissions made by both Parties and the evidence tendered in support thereof in coming to its findings.

It is most unfortunate that after the services of Ramzan Nizamdin had been terminated on 17th March 1964 the officers concerned brought in the question of his age during subsequent correspondence and discussions with the Claimants. This question is not at all relevant to the issue, and the Court is satisfied that the services of this employee were terminated as a result of the allegations made against him on disciplinary grounds. The letter dated 6th March 1964 which the Acting Regional Engineer, Eastern Region, wrote to him, fully bears this out. This letter reads as follows:—

"Dear Sir,

We refer to a charge sheet dated the 11th January 1964 which alleges that on the 9th January, at Mutonga, you deliberately drove GK 3834 over a stone more than two feet above the ground, thereby causing damage to the radiator.

In this matter we have studied carefully your explanation and remarks, and find it difficult to believe that if you were driving with due care in the cab of a large vehicle it would not be possible to see a stone large enough to damage the radiator, and this is borne out by two witnesses, Mr. Munyore and Mr. Kapembe, who accompanied you on this journey.

Bearing in mind that you have already been charged and found guilty of speeding (see our WP/CENT/9256 dated the 5th March 1963), as a result of which we asked for a further report on your abilities six months after that date (the report we received was not of a very flattering nature), and a further charge sheet on which you were found guilty of refusing to accept a transfer to Embu (our WP/9256 dated the 4th October 1963 refers), as a result of which your increments were deferred, unfortunately, following this latter charge sheet, we have no alternative but to recommend that you be discharged and the necessary authority to do this will be sought. Once this is confirmed you will receive one month's notice together with any leave outstanding to your credit.

Yours faithfully,

J. K. B. WILLIS, Ag. Regional Engineer, Eastern Region."

The question of whether or not the charges brought against this employee during 1963-64 warrant his dismissal is adequately covered in the Code of Regulations, Sixth Edition, under the heading "Disciplinary Action—Temporary Officer G.60", where it is provided as follows:—

- (1) The dismissal of a temporary officer will be effected by the Permanent Secretary/Head of Department not responsible to a Ministry concerned in accordance with the provisions of the officer's letter of temporary appointment.
- (2) When a temporary officer is dismissed he should be so informed in writing and given the reason for his dismissal.

Further under the heading "Termination—Temporary Officers" under G.64, it is provided as follows:—

The employment of an officer serving on a letter of temporary appointment will be terminated by a Permanent Secretary/Head of Department not responsible to a Ministry in accordance with the provisions of the officer's letter of appointment by giving the appropriate period of notice or salary in lieu of notice.

In view of this, although the Court sympathizes with this driver in that he had just fallen short by approximately 1½ years from completing his service after which he would have been entitled to his gratuity, the Court is constrained to find that his services had been terminated properly. It is unfortunate that employees with such long service continue to be treated as temporary employees, but the facts of life are that the exigencies of the Civil Service require that certain employees be retained in the service as temporary. This is a matter, however, which the Claimants can pursue at some other quarters, as indeed they can seek an amendment to the Code of Regulations which provide for the dismissal of such employees so easily.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 87 of 1966

Parties:---

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers

Laundry, Dry Cleaning and Dyers Group of F.K.E.

Issue in dispute:—

Gratuity.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Laundry, Dry Cleaning and Dyers Group of F.K.E. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 17th day of January 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.
- 3. The Respondents, during the hearing of this dispute, took a preliminary point and argued that the Claimants were not entitled to pursue their claim on the issue in dispute as there was a current valid agreement in force. They pointed out that they had met the Claimants during 1966 and as a result of negotiations an agreement had been signed on 2nd June 1966, in the following terms:—
 - "It is agreed by both Employer and Empleyee representatives of the Laundry, Dry Cleaning and Dyeing Wages Council that—
 - all points agreed are forwarded as joint Employee/ Employer proposals to the Wages Council;
 - (2) all points that are not agreed are forwarded to the Wages Council for final decision;
 - (3) the terms and conditions as set out in the amended Wages Council Order shall be taken as the new negotiated Agreement between the Union and the F.K.E. Employers agreed for a period of 12 months from the date of implementation. The date of implementation shall be agreed upon between the Employers and the Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers."

The Claimants replied by saying that, no agreement had been reached on gratuity and although they had withdrawn this point during the 1964 negotiations, they had not abandoned it for ever. They agreed that there was an agreement in force covering wages and terms and conditions of service in respect of the Respondents' employees with effect from 1st August 1966, up to 31st July 1967, but argued that the Parties could at any time open negotiations on a new issue.

As a result of the preliminary submissions, the Court made the following award.

AWARD

4. The Court rules that as there is a valid agreement in existence between the Parties with effect from 1st August 1966, for a period of 12 months, the present issue cannot be entertained until the expiry of this agreement. This issue had been before the Parties since 1964 and yet, they concluded an agreement omitting any reference to it. In these circumstances the Court is satisfied that no extenuating circumstances have been put forward which justify reopening this issue within the life of the aforesaid agreement.

The Court, therefore, rules that this claim be rejected for the time being.



- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the House of Representatives and Senate.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

Extract from the Code of Regulations, section D-

Kenya Gazette

- D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.
- (2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
