THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 86 OF 1966

Parties:—

Kenya Shoe and Leather Workers' Union
and
Dragon Tanning Company Limited

Issues in dispute:—

- (1) Service Gratuity.
- (2) House Allowance.

1. The Kenya Shoe and Leather Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Dragon Tanning Company Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 16th day of January 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

GENERAL BACKGROUND

3. In Cause No. 37 of 1965 between the Parties hereto the Court made the following award in respect of Service Gratuity:—

"The agreement on this issue which exists between the Parties is an unusual one and is not in line with the general trend. The Court is satisfied that the Claimants have made out a good case for the revision of this agreement and considers that there are exceptional circumstances to warrant this.

The Court, therefore, awards as follows:—

In the event of termination of service, other than by resignation of the employee, the employee shall be entitled to:

- (a) Seven days' pay for every completed year of service up to five years;
- (b) ten days' pay for every completed year of service after five years and up to and including the tenth year of service;
- (c) fifteen days' pay for each completed year of service after the tenth year of service."

In October 1966, the Claimants forwarded their various demands including wages to the Respondents and agreement was reached on all items except the two in dispute. The matter was referred to the Ministry of Labour as a trade dispute, but no conciliation was carried out and the Parties were recommended to take the dispute to the Industrial Court. Consequently, they signed the notification of dispute form on 5th December 1966, in accordance with the Trade Disputes Act 1965.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CLAIMANTS

4. (1) *Service Gratuity*.—The Claimants submitted that, they had asked for a further amendment to the Industrial Court award by the deletion of the words "other than by resignation of the employee" as they felt it was unfair and could work against the interest of an employee who, for genuine reasons wished to leave the employment in that, in these circumstances he would not be entitled to any gratuity. They rejected the suggestion that, if their demands were accepted, the workers would start resigning.

The Claimants cited the case of Bulleys Tanneries who had paid out the benefits which had accrued to their employees by way of service gratuity on account of the commencement of the National Social Security Fund. They also drew the Court's attention to the Industrial Court Cause No. 40 of 1966 in which the Court had not restricted the award of gratuity to termination of service due to retirement or at the instance of the employer. The Claimants stated that, their demand was in the alternative as they first preferred the Court to award that, all the money accrued to various employees under this benefit should be paid out to them immediately failing which, the Industrial Court award should be varied by the deletion of the words mentioned hereinabove. The Claimants conceded that, as per their Collective Bargaining Agreement, it was not easy for the Respondents to dismiss any of their employees and adequate machinery existed for dealing with cases of dismissal. They also pointed out that, the Respondents did not operate any provident fund scheme.

The Claimants also argued that, if an employee wished to resign from employment he should be paid gratuity for the number of years' service that he had rendered to the Respondents because, in accordance with the African way of life, the workers often wished to leave employment so that they could live on their farms.

(2) *House Allowance*.—The Claimants submitted that, Kenya was one of the advanced countries in East Africa today and, therefore, the workers expected to live in decent houses, but

unfortunately, the Respondents were exploiting their workers as they were housed in groups of three in rooms which were 10 ft. by 16 ft. with the result that, the employees were separated from their families. The Claimants described these houses as stables and pointed out that, they had referred the matter to the Medical Officer of Health, Nairobi City Council and the Labour Officer and although the Respondents had been advised to build modern houses, they had completely ignored this advice. The Claimants felt that, the present houses should be allocated to one employee per room and he should be allowed to live with his family. All others who could not get houses should get Sh. 60 per month by way of house allowance. The Claimants stated that, non-Africans who were doing similar jobs as other African employees were allocated superior type of houses.

MAIN SUBMISSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE RESPONDENTS

5. (1) *Service Gratuity*.—The Respondents submitted that, during the course of joint negotiation on 31st October 1966, the Claimants had demanded that, all moneys which had accrued to employees under the Court's award in Cause No. 37 of 1965 should be paid out. The Respondents had rejected this demand as it was contrary to the published policy of the Government and drew the Court's attention to a statement issued following meetings between the Government and C.O.T.U. They argued that, the Court should not go against the published policy of the Government. The Respondents further argued that, the policies of the General Manager of the Bulleys Tanneries were hardly relevant to the present dispute. The Respondents drew the Court's attention to the various Industrial Court awards which were in line with the one made by the Court in Cause No. 37 of 1965. In these circumstances, bearing in mind that the Claimants had proved no cases of hardship, the Respondents requested the Court to reject the Claimants' demand. The Respondents pointed out that, the Claimants had repeatedly changed their stand on this issue as on 1st December 1966, they made another approach to secure the pay out of the moneys and demanded that, the Respondents should alter the Court's award by deleting the words "other than by resignation of the employee".

(2) *House Allowance*.—The Respondents submitted that, the Court had on previous occasions accepted the view that it was not the Court's function to be academic and each and every award must be a positive solution to a specific problem and this view could clearly be applied to the Claimants' demand on housing in this dispute as they had demanded that, employees who were not housed by the Respondents should receive an allowance of Sh. 60 per month. The Respondents maintained that, there was sufficient housing for all employees, therefore, the question of an allowance did not arise and if an employee wished to live elsewhere, then this must be a personal decision which in no way involved the Respondents.

The Respondents argued that, the other aspect regarding the conditions of the houses provided was that the Ministry of Labour had set down "minimum standards of housing" and the various local authorities were interested in housing provided by employers for their employees. In these circumstances to ask the Court to make an award in circumstances where a situation was adequately guarded by appropriate legislation enforced by officers of the Government Ministries, would appear to be a pointless exercise. They drew the Court's attention to Cause Nos. 24 and 60 of 1965 where the Court had expressed a similar view.

AWARD

6. The Court has very carefully considered the submissions and the evidence tendered by the Parties in support thereof before making its findings.

(1) *Service Gratuity*.—This issue was negotiated between the Parties on the 19th of June 1963, and following further negotiations, had been increased to the rates which existed prior to the Industrial Court Cause No. 37 of 1965 on 15th June 1964. The Court had then, as a result of its award in the said Cause No. 37 of 1965, varied it further. In these circumstances the Court finds that, as no exceptional circumstances have been pleaded by the Claimants for any further amendment, it has no other alternative but to make a nil award.

(2) *House Allowance*.—The Court rules that adequate legal provisions exist to ensure that workers are not housed in sub-standard accommodation or are not forced to live in overcrowded conditions. The Court can, therefore, do nothing more than to point out that, if the Claimants feel aggrieved, then they should take up this question with the appropriate authorities. In view of this the Court makes a nil award on this issue as well.

The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the building and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drainage, elevation and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280). If default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall only be used for inoffensive light industrial purposes.

6. The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.

7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.

8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the President. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.

9. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

10. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.

11. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

12. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof.

13. The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of mains or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

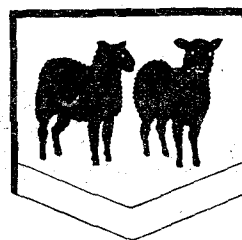
