The Timing of the Payment of Pratt Arrears.

The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the South Nyanza County Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 6th day of February 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

The Court has very carefully considered the submissions made by the Parties before making its findings.

In the agreement on which the Claimants have based their case it is clearly stated that, it is subject to the Minister's approval. The Minister has, in fact, approved Part I of this agreement which has already been implemented by the Respondents. But as far as Part II of the agreement is concerned, the Court is satisfied that the Minister has not approved it as the financial position of the Respondents is very poor. Even if the Minister's approval was not necessary, Part II of the agreement was to be implemented as soon as possible if financial position justified it, and the Court finds that the financial position of the Respondents does not at present justify it.

In these circumstances the Court must reject the Claimants' application for fixing a time limit within which the Respondents should honour the agreement. At the same time the Court cannot accept the Respondents' application that, the Court should wipe out the payment of arrears as mentioned in the aforesaid Part II of the agreement. The Respondents are committed to this agreement and should honour it as soon as their financial position justifies it. The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Local Government, has accepted this vide his letter dated 3rd October 1966.

The Claimants should, however, realize that there appears to be very little chance of the financial position of the Respondents improving in the next two years, but they are entitled to keep the situation under review and press for the payment when they have satisfactory evidence that, the financial position has improved.

The Court must criticize the Respondents for having entered into an agreement which they were aware they could not implement. This sort of attitude is deplorable.

In fact, it was conceded by the Respondents' representative that, the exact amount of their deficit is not known and that facts and figures were not easily available. This sorry state of affairs is no doubt responsible for the extremely poor industrial relations that have existed in the Respondents' undertaking.

The Respondents have acted most irresponsibly in this dispute and the Court must hold them responsible for the present unfortunate situation.

The agreement in this dispute again is subject to the Minister for Local Government's approval, but the Court is satisfied that, the Minister for Local Government through his representative on 5th August 1966, agreed to the payment in accordance with the agreement between the Parties as from 1st January 1966. Unfortunately the payment has not been made although employees of the North Tetu Area Council, which comes under the Respondents, have enjoyed Pratt scales for some time now.

In view of these circumstances, the Court awards that the Respondents should pay the agreed salaries to their employees as from 1st January 1967, and that as far as arrears between 1st January 1965 and 31st December 1966, are concerned, the Respondents should pay these within a period of three years from 1st January 1967.

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280), to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term created hereby shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.
