6. The allottee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 30 days of notification that his application has been approved the assessed stand premium and proportion of rent, together with the survey fees, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant and the stamp duty in respect of the grant assessed at 2 per cent of the stand premium, annual rent and value of the existing buildings, if any, in default of payment of which within the specified period, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot offered.

General Conditions

1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature shall apply.

2. The term of the grant shall be 99 years from the 1st day of the month following notification of the approval of the grant.

3. The grant will be issued in the name of the applicant as stated on the application.

Special Conditions

1. No buildings shall be erected on the land, nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the Commissioner of Lands through the local authority, plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Mombasa Tally Clerks Contractors' Group shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Mombasa on the 12th day of April 1967 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

6. This dispute has raised some very important issues like the one that some employees have been employed on casual work in this industry for nearly 20 years and have not had the advantage which the other workers on monthly employment have enjoyed. Then there was the question of favouritism being shown by the Respondents to their relatives and non-Union members. These problems have to be viewed in the context of the whole set up of the business of tally contractors who themselves enjoy only casual work and state that they are not in a position to offer monthly terms to their employees. There is an inherent drawback in this whole system in that the shipping lines have divested themselves of this responsibility of having tally clerks on their pay roll. The Claimants have stressed this aspect of the problem in their submissions but have overlooked the fact that decasualization is not an issue in this dispute. Admittedly a mention of fringe benefits is made in respect of monthly, weekly and daily workers but this vague reference to the type of employment desired by the Claimants for their members is not enough to make decasualization an issue in this dispute. In these circumstances the Court cannot give a ruling on this subject. Accordingly issues 2 and 3 must also fail.

On the question of wages the Court awards that the workers should get a 10 per cent increase on their current rates.

The Respondents are advised to take due note of the allegations of favouritism made against them in the selection of workers. They should ensure that the available work is as widely distributed as possible so that most of the workers engaged on this type of work benefit from it.
