Issues in Dispute:

The Union's claim to review the terms and conditions of service agreement and the employer's refusal because of a joint agreement dated 27th August 1963.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Bhagwanji and Company Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Mombasa on the 13th day of April 1967 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

6. In August 1963 when the agreement between the Parties was signed there is no doubt that, the Respondents undertook to pay their employees superior benefits than their competitors and, therefore, were justifiably concerned that the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union (which has subsequently amalgamated with three other Unions to form the Claimants) should secure similar agreement with 75 per cent of their competitors. It is equally true that the Claimants who took over all the obligations of the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union have not succeeded in entering into agreements with the firms competing with the Respondents, although these firms have been approached by them. But the fact remains that, the Wages Council for the Distributive Trades by Regulations issued on 13th January 1964 laid down a wage level and conditions of employment which not only brought them up in the case of 75 per cent of the relative employers but, in fact, even improved the 1963 agreement between the Kenya Distributive and Commercial Workers' Union and the Respondents except on two very minor points which were not elaborated during the hearing. The condition attached to the 1963 agreement has, therefore, been overtaken by events beyond the Parties' control and the Court rules that the Claimants are entitled to seek a review of the 1963 agreement.

1. The Kenya Chemical Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Plastics (Africa) Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 20th and 21st day of April 1967 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

6. In this dispute the Claimants' General Secretary admitted that the sole purpose of the strike which took place between 16th March and 20th March 1967 was to hurt the Respondents and that they believed they succeeded in doing so. This is most unfortunate because the notification of dispute form to the Industrial Court had been signed by the Respondents on 16th March 1967. So, in fact, there was absolutely no need to stage a strike. The Court must comment on this matter as even though the agreed procedure may have been exhausted, the fact remains that the Respondents agreed to refer the issues in dispute to the Industrial Court on 16th March 1967, therefore, the strike action was completely unnecessary. The Court strongly feels that this sort of action should be avoided as it serves no ones interest and, on the other hand, increases industrial strife.

On the issues in dispute the Court, after a careful consideration of all the facts and evidence presented to it, awards as follows:—

(a) *Employees in Acting Capacity.*—The Court awards that an employee shall be entitled to an acting allowance provided that the employee works in an acting capacity in a higher grade for a period of more than 14 working days. The acting allowance shall be based on the rate of the grade in which the employee is asked to work.

(b) *Hours of Work.*—Nil award.

(c) *Annual Paid Leave.*—Nil award.

(d) *Gratuity Scheme.*—As this item is precluded from Union negotiations in the Recognition Agreement, the Court rules that no award can be made on it.

(e) *Maternity Benefits.*—Nil award.

(f) *Termination of Employment.*—The Court awards that after the completion of the probationary period an employee's services may be terminated by one month's notice or pay in lieu thereof.

The Court further awards as follows:—

An employee who is guilty of an offence other than gross misconduct or other lawful cause of dismissal may be given a written warning which shall be entered in the employee's employment record card and shall remain valid for a period of 12 months from the date of issue. If, within the 12 months' period, the employee commits a similar or any other offence which does not warrant dismissal, he will be further warned in writing in his employment record card, and the two warnings shall remain valid for a period of 12 months from the date of the second warning. If, within this 12 months' period the employee commits a further offence which does not warrant dismissal, he will be issued with a final letter of warning which will make him liable to summary dismissal for any other offence which he may commit thereafter. A final letter of warning will remain valid for a period of one year from the date of issue. A copy of the final warning shall be sent to the General Secretary of the Union.

(g) *Shift Differential.*—Nil award.

(h) *Wages (including Date and Duration).*—The Court awards the following new rates for the various grades:—

Grade II	Sh. 355 per month (consolidated)
Grade III	Sh. 280 per month (consolidated)
Grade IV	Sh. 245 per month (consolidated)

Effective date and Duration.—The Court rules that this award should be with effect from 1st March 1967 and remain in force for a period of 18 months from that date.
