Note.—In all cases preference will be given to qualified candidates who are Kenya citizens.

Administration Officer (Staff), Ministry of Lands and Settlement (No. 158/67)

Salary scale.—£1,600 to £1,800. AGREEMENT only.

Applicants must have a minimum of seven years experience in Personnel Administration two of which should normally be in senior capacity; or must possess a degree of an approved University preferably in Social Science or Industrial Relations, plus four years' experience in personnel work; or the Final Examination or Corporate Membership of a professional body plus three years' experience in personnel work. A knowledge of the work of Settlement would be advantageous. The duties of the post will be primarily concerned with the organization of the staffing of the Department of Settlement including those serving under the Settlement Fund Trustees. Appointment from outside the Service can only be made on agreement terms, but should a permanent and pensionable civil servant be selected, arrangements can be made to second him to the post.

Senior Accountant (Five Posts), Ministry of Lands and Settlement (No. 159/67)

Salary scale.—£1,390 to £1,598. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must have a minimum of seven years' satisfactory Accountancy experience in a responsible position; or must hold a degree of an approved University including Accountancy as a major field of study, plus four years' Accountancy experience; or must have passed the Final Examination of a recognized professional Accounting body, plus two years' Accountancy experience. One post is for Budgetary Controller, for which applicants should have had a minimum of three years' practical experience of budgetary analysis and control. The person appointed to this post will be expected to exercise control over expenditure of approximately £1,000,000 per annum. Another post is of Machine Room Accountant for which applicants must have minimum of two years' practical experience of I.C.T. punched card equipment and keyboard accounting machines. For this a knowledge of computer applications is desirable. The three remaining posts are for general accounting duties and persons appointed to them will be expected to take charge of and direct control of accounts sections dealing with all aspects of accountancy of both Government and commercial types and particularly the collection of revenue, control of expenditure and the handling of loans. In every case, applicants must possess considerable initiative and ability to control staff.

Personnel Officer Grade I, Ministry of Lands and Settlement (No. 160/67)
