6. The Court has very carefully considered the submissions made by the Parties and would like to stress that, where an issue has been adjudicated upon by the Court in the not too distant past, the Parties should realize that they stand a very little chance of persuading the Court to revise its own decision in the absence of very strong and special circumstances. The Court finds that, in this dispute the Claimants have produced no reasons whatsoever which can justify any increase either in annual paid leave or on the issue of service gratuity. The Court had refused in Cause No. 62 of 1965 to vary the existing provisions on these issues and in the absence of any special reasons, the Court rejects the Claimants' demands again on these two issues.
