Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Mehta Sons (Africa) Limited

Issues in dispute —

- (1) Wages
- (2) Implementation
- (3) Gratuity

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Mehta Sons (Africa) Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 29th day of May 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

6 (1) *Wages and (2) Implementation*—The Court has very carefully considered the submissions made by the Parties but is unable to accept the Respondents' contention that the Claimants cannot ask for the agreement which was concluded during conciliation to be extended to their employee Mr Benson. In the preamble to the first agreement made between the Parties, it is clearly stated that, the agreement would apply to all the Respondents' employees subject only to the exclusion created by the current agreement between the KFL (now COTU) and the FKE on managerial, confidential and supervisory staff. It is obvious that even if in the first agreement the names of the five employees then in service were mentioned, the fact remains that the Claimants have the right to speak on behalf of all employees who are their members subject to restrictions in the Recognition Agreement if any. Another point which has to be borne in mind is that two of the original employees who were both clerks have left the service and have been replaced by Mr Benson who incidentally on confirmation was brought up to the same wage of Sh 445 per month which was paid to them.

In view of this the Court rules that the agreement made between the Parties granting a wage increase of Sh 20 with effect from 1st January 1967, should also extend to Mr Benson, but as far as the other employee Mr Kimani is concerned, the position is different. This employee received a wage increase in March this year that is, three months after the agreed effective date of the new increases whereas Mr Benson received an increase in November last year a month or so before the agreed effective date. The Court, therefore, rules that Mr Kimani is not entitled to Sh 20 increase until the expiry of 12 months from March 1967.

The Court further rules that, the watchman who is an employee of E A Spirit Distributors Limited cannot be affected by this award as he is not employed by the Respondents.

(3) *Gratuity*—The question of the Recognition Agreement has a direct bearing on this issue. The Court finds that the Respondents having resigned from the DATA Group cannot be a party and be bound by the Recognition Agreement which that Group has with the Claimants. Neither is there another Recognition Agreement between the Parties, but since they have negotiated and concluded agreements on wages and terms and conditions of service with the Claimants, they are, therefore, enjoying a *de facto* recognition.

In these circumstances the Respondents having lost the benefit of the DATA Group Recognition Agreement, have thrown themselves open to Union negotiations on issues which can legitimately be pursued by a Union on behalf of its members. The Court rules that gratuity unless it is expressly excluded in a recognition agreement with the Union, is an item on which a Union can legitimately bargain with an employer on behalf of its members. In these circumstances the Court awards the following gratuity scheme —

- (a) An employee on completion of four years' continuous service with the Respondents shall be entitled to ten days' pay for every completed year of service by way of gratuity to be based on the employee's wages at the time of the termination of his service.
- (b) An employee who is dismissed for misconduct shall not be entitled to gratuity.
- (c) The effective date for the purpose of working out the benefits under this scheme shall be 1st January 1960, i.e. an employee shall not be entitled to any gratuity for services prior to 1st January 1960.
- (d) This scheme shall cease with the implementation of the National Social Security Fund. Employees shall, however, continue to benefit under this award for services rendered up to the date of the implementation of the National Social Security Fund, for example, if an employee who started working in 1963 retires after eight

years of service, then he shall be provided for the years of service up to the commencement of the National Social Security Fund on the basis of this award.

Issues in dispute —

- (1) Severance Pay Claimed by Teachers
- (2) Discharge of Employees Engaged under the Tripartite Agreement

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Orchards Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 31st day of May 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

6 The Court has very carefully considered the submissions made by the Parties on the issues in dispute and finds that, the two teachers were at all times employees of the Respondents and they cannot, therefore, escape their obligations on the ground that the parents of the children receiving education used to pay fees which went towards the payment of their salaries. This financial arrangement cannot affect the contractual obligation which the Respondents had with these two employees. The Court is satisfied that Mr Robinson on 18th January 1965, was fully aware of what he was writing about when he admitted that the Respondents had in employment two full time teachers and that the Respondents could no longer provide this service. In view of this, the Court awards that these two teachers should be paid wages in lieu of the requisite notice required for the termination of the services of the Respondents' employees and further that as they had lost their jobs through being declared redundant, they should be given the severance pay as awarded by the Court in Cause No 10 of 1964 between the same Parties.

As far as the question of the 18 employees who had been taken on under the Tripartite Agreement by the Respondents is concerned, the Court is satisfied that the Respondents had fully discharged and complied with their obligations under it. The Respondents had informed the Ministry of Labour of their financial difficulty and the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, had accepted their contention and had approved the laying off of these workers. In these circumstances it would be extremely unfair now at this late stage to penalize the Respondents for the alleged omission of the reference of their application to the Tripartite Committee. In any case, the Court is satisfied that in view of the financial difficulties in which the Respondents found themselves in early 1965, the Tripartite Committee would have approved their application that is if, in fact, this had not been done before the Permanent Secretary wrote to the Claimants stating that the discharge of these employees was in order.

The Court notes that these employees had been taken on some time between February and March 1964, and their services had been terminated on 31st January 1965, when they had received the following —

- (a) One month's salary in lieu of notice
- (b) Three quarters month's salary in lieu of leave
- (c) Half month's salary as severance pay

The fact that the Tripartite Agreement was later extended by another two months cannot affect these 18 employees whose services had been terminated before the extension of the agreement was agreed by the Parties to that agreement. In these circumstances the Court rejects the Claimants' demands for additional 2½ months' wages to be paid to these 18 employees.

General Conditions

1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant

4 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant

5 Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

Special Conditions

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Government Lands Act. If default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the

requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

5 The land and the buildings shall only be used for residential purposes and not more than one private dwelling-house with the necessary offices and outbuildings appurtenant thereto shall be erected on the land. A guest house will not be permitted

6 The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws

7 The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers dangerous or offensive

8 The grantee shall not subdivide the land

9 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President, no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed

10 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid

11 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess

12 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess

13 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President in lieu thereof

14 The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions, whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains
