- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and The Old Mutual Life Assurance Society shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 26th day of July 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents called Mr. Adam Kutahi, an Assistant Executive Officer of the Federation of Kenya Employers as a witness.

AWARD

The Court has very carefully considered the submissions made by the Parties in this dispute and finds that the addendum to the main agreement is not a satisfactory document and leaves much room for improvement. To begin with although it is stated that an employee would receive gratuity on retirement from service the Court could find no evidence of the Parties having agreed to an age of retirement. Further it is not clear that if an employee is to be paid gratuity on retirement what is the purpose of laying down a qualifying period of five years. The fact that the Respondents have every intention of paying gratuity to an employee whom they discharge after having completed five years of service, is also not included. However, in spite of these obvious defects in the addendum to the main agreement the Court is satisfied that the word "retirement" in this agreement has been used in its generally accepted meaning and the Claimants were perfectly waren that he controlled the residue to the court of the controlled to the control aware that no gratuity would be paid in the event of an employee resigning. Even if the Court was to find in the Claimants' favour on this point, the fact remains that Mr. Gachie resigned on 1st March 1966, and left the service on the same day after collecting his salary for February and leave pay whereas the agreement on which the Claimants are basing their claim was not signed until 4th April 1967. In these circumstances Mr. Gachie cannot benefit from this agreement. The Court, therefore, rejects the Claimants' demand.

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President gives notice that the plots in Kisumu Municipality as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the individual plots.






