Qualifications.—1st or 2nd class B.Sc. Degree in Chemistry, or equivalent, from a recognized University.

Duties.—To carry out the analysis of residues of pesticides in various substances and to co-operate with research workers in other disciplines in investigating different aspects of the application and use of pesticides in the tropics.




