Successful candidates will be posted to the Police Training College, Kiganjo, for a period of six months where instruction will be given in all aspects of Police work. After the completion of training and subject to a satisfactory course report, candidates will be posted to Police Units for duty.

The salary attached to the post is: £683 by £26 to £838 by £30 to £898 by £36 to £934 p.a. and successful applicants will enter at the minimum of the scale. A free issue of uniform is made on first appointment, thereafter an allowance of £25 per annum is given for upkeep.


