### VACANCIES IN THE SERVICE OF THE EAST AFRICAN COMMON SERVICES ORGANIZATION

Executive Officer Grade II in Treasury (E.A.C.S.O.)

Salary scale.-£670 to £1,060 p.a.

Applicants must be serving officers of the East African Common Services Organization. They should have a good command of the English Language both spoken and written and should be capable of dealing with foreigners, most of whom are in East Africa for the first time. Air Traffic Control Officer Cadets in the E.A. Directorate of Civil' Aviation (E.A.C.S.O.)

The E.A. Directorate of Civil Aviation offers training for interesting, responsible, and well paid careers in Air Traffic Control to young men between the ages of 18 and 25 possessing at least a Cambridge School Certificate with credits in three of the following subjects: English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, General Science, History and Geography. Applicants must be physically fit.

The training to Air Traffic Control Officer Grade III is of approximately  $2\frac{1}{2}$  years' duration, during which time Cadets undergo training in Air Traffic Control Procedures, Meteorology, Telecommunications and Navigation and "on-the-job" training. Flying instruction is provided for those showing aptitude. This course will commence on April 1968.

The commencing salary is £268 p.a. and on successful passing of intermediate examination will be £520 to £620.

On advancement to Air Traffic Control Officer Grade III the salary will be £670 to £820. Further training to Air Traffic Control Officer Grade II standard is provided, the salary scale for Grade II being £850 to £1,060 p.a. and there are promotion prospects to Air Traffic Control Officer Grade I in the scale £1,096 to £1,348 p.a.

#### GOVERNMENT PERSONNEL OFFICERS' EXAMINATION

ATTENTION is invited to Personnel Circular No. 31 of 10th November 1966, in which it was announced that Government Personnel Examinations would be conducted by the Public Service Commission and the dates of such examinations would be announced to the Service. The two examinations will now be held on the 14th and 15th February 1968, and will be subject to the conditions set out below. It should be noted that the decision of the Public Service Commission on all matters related to these examinations shall be final.

#### 2. Scheme of Examinations

Each examination will consist of three papers held over two days as follows:—

#### First Day

- (a) Personnel Management (3 hours) 9 a.m.—12 noon.
- (b) Government Personnel Regulations/Administration (3 hours) 1.30 p.m.—4.30 p.m.

#### Second Day

Office Administration (2/3 hours) 9 a.m.—11 a.m. 12 noor

#### 3. Syllabuses

The syllabuses of the examinations are given in Part III of the Appendix to Personnel Circular No. 31 of 1966. A list of books which candidates are recommended to study as part of their preparation for these examinations is given in Appendix "A" to Public Service Commission Circular Letter No. 31/11 of 8th December 1967, and although the list is not exhaustive candidates are advised to read as widely as possible.

#### 4. Eligibility to Enter

The examination will be open to civil servants who must be Kenya citizens serving with the Government of Kenya; and in the case of:—

#### (a) Examination No. 1

be serving Clerical, Higher or Senior Clerical Officers serving in *Personnel Branches*; or in the case of—

#### (b) Examination No. 2

be serving Personnel Officers in the Grade G.5, or above this grade, as at the date of the introduction of the Scheme

Candidates must have passed Examination No. 1 or have been exempted before offering themselves for Examination No. 2.

#### 5. Entry Fees

Candidates for Examination No. 1 will be required to pay an entry fee of Sh. 10, and for No. 2 an entry fee of Sh. 20. In no circumstances will these fees be refundable.

#### 6. Entries

Candidates are required to complete in duplicate the Entry Form, set out in Appendix "B" to the Public Service Commission Circular Letter No. 31/11 of 8th December 1967,

copies of which are obtainable from the Examinations Officer, Ministry of Education, P.O. Box 12259, Nairobi, or from any Ministry/Department, or from Offices of the Provincial/District Commissioners, and Provincial Education Offices including the Education Office, North-Eastern Province, P.O. Box 42, Garissa. Entry forms should be submitted through the Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Departments to the Examinations Officers, Ministry of Education, to reach him not later than 12th January 1968, and must be accompanied by a remittance covering the appropriate fees. Money/Postal Orders should be crossed and made payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, and remitted to the Examinations Officer. In no circumstances will late entries be accepted. Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Departments are requested to ensure that entry forms are properly completed and are transmitted in good time.

#### 7. Examination Centres

The examinations will be held at Mombasa, Nyeri, Nakuru, Embu, Kakamega, Kisumu, Nairobi and Garissa, and candidates must specify at which centre they propose to sit, which will normally be the nearest to their Stations. The actual venue in each Provincial centre will be notified to individual candidates in due course.

#### 8. Conditions of Obtaining a Pass

In order to obtain a pass in the appropriate full examination, a candidate must pass every paper at one and the same sitting. The names of successful candidates will be published in the Kenya Gazette.

#### 9. Effect of Passing

Once a candidate has passed one of these examinations, he will be eligible to be considered by the Public Service Commission for promotion to the next higher grade as and when vacancies occur, and in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme of Service as set out in Personnel Circular No. 31 of 1966.

#### 10. Conduct of Examinations

Candidates will not be permitted to consult any books, files, notes, etc., during the examination, and any infringement of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the examination, and such disqualification may also result in disciplinary action. Arrangements for the issue of examination papers, invigilation and submission of completed scripts, etc., will be as laid down by the Ministry of Education acting on the directions of the Public Service Commission.

### THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT (Cap. 280)

#### PLOT FOR A HOTEL

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of Kenya gives notice that the plot in Nandi Hills Township, as described in the Schedule hereto, is available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grant of the plot.

- 2. A plan of the plot may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the Office of the District Commissioner, Kapsabet, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office. P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands; Nairobi, through the Clerk to Council, Sirikwa County Council.
- 4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner not later than noon on the 7th day of January 1968.
- 5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.
- 6. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—
  - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
  - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
  - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

#### General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya) and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot.

#### Special Conditions

- 1. No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner:

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person

- authorized by him on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.
- 3. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.
- 4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made.

- 5. The land and buildings shall only be used for the purposes of an hotel with proper lounge and dining facilities for the guests.
- 6. The buildings shall not cover more than 90 per centum of the area of the land.
- 7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive.
  - 8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land.
- 9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands: no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No. 2 has been performed.
- 10. The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.
- 11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess.
- 12. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.
- 13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings, erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President of the Republic of Kenya in lieu thereof.
- 14. The President of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.






