THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT 1965 (15 of 1965)

ORDER UNDER SECTION 36—COLLECTION OF TRADE UNION DUES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 36 of the Trade Disputes Act 1965, the Minister for Labour hereby orders every employer who employs not less than five members of the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union, to

- (d) notify in writing that trade union and that federation before the end of each month of the amounts of any payments made to the accounts of that trade union and of that federation in that month;
- (e) notify in writing the Registrar of Trade Unions before the end of each month of the amounts of any payments made into the accounts of that trade union and of that federation in that month.

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 36 (2) of the Trade Disputes Act, Gazette Notice No. 4493 of 6th December 1966, is varied accordingly.

Tourist Officer, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife (No. 478/67)

Salary scale.—£1,390 to £1,598. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants, preferably civil servants, should possess a degree of an approved University with some knowledge or experience of Tourism, Press or Public Relations work. Consideration will also be given to candidates of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education who have a minimum of four years' experience of Tourism, Press and Public Relations work in a responsible position. Applicants must have a good command of the English Language and should be versed with the Kenya's tourist attractions. They must be prepared to work in foreign countries, and to learn foreign languages. A sound knowledge of Government regulations and procedures will be an advantage as would be knowledge of French and/or German.

Public Relations Officer, Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife (No. 479/67)

Salary scale.—£1,390 to £1,598. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants, preferably civil servants, should possess a degree of an approved University with some knowledge or experience of Tourism, Press and Public Relations work. Applicants must have a good command of the English Language and should be versed with the Kenya's tourist attractions.

Accountant Grade I, Office of the President (No. 480/67)

Salary scale.-£1,096 to £1,348. PENSIONABLE.

Applicants must be civil servants with at least five years' satisfactory accounting experience in a responsible position; or must have passed the Intermediate Examination of a recognized professional Accounting body, or hold a degree of an approved University including Accountancy as a major field of study, plus in either case two years' satisfactory accounting experience. A through knowledge of Government regulations and Financial Orders is essential as is ability to control staff and conduct correspondence. The successful applicant must be prepared to serve anywhere in Kenya.

Assistant Serjeant-at-Arms, National Assembly (No. 481/67)

Salary scale.—£670 to £820. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should preferably be of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education with military or police experience. The duties of the post include certain functions in the Chamber, supervision of stores, Catering Accounts and checking of bar stocks. A knowledge of Commercial and Government accounting systems will be advantageous as the successful candidate will be required to take full control of the Catering Accounts.

Liaison Assistant, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting (No. 482/67)

Salary scale.—£670 to £820. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants should be of Cambridge or preferably Higher School Certificate standard of education. They must be proficient in typing and be very fluent in both Kiswahili and English. Ability to write and promote programmes is essential. Duties include the preparation of Programme Schedules to a deadline, writing programme promotions for the Press, and processing of copywright returns to various organizations both local and overseas. The post is in the Voice of Kenya.

Computing Assistant Grade II (Four Posts), Water Development Department, Ministry of Natural Resources (No. 483/67)

Salary scale.—£600 to £820. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants should possess the Cambridge School Certificate with a credit in Mathematics or a General Certificate of Education with a pass in that subject, and must have an aptitude

for Mathematics. Technical school training covering draughts-manship, cartography, or some knowledge of statistics, would be an advantage. Neat penmanship is essential. Applicants should also have at least two years' experience, preferably in work dealing with the compilation of figures or calculations of a technical or semi-technical nature, but academic qualifications of higher than Cambridge School Certificate standard which have included a study of advanced Mathematics and/or statistics would be considered in lieu of experience in office work.

Shorthand Typist Grade I (Two Posts), Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife (No. 484/67)

Salary scale.—£633 to £816. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must have passed the Government Intermediate Shorthand and Typewriting Examinations or possess recognized certificates for Shorthand 100 w.p.m. and Typewriting 40 w.p.m., and should have had some secretarial experience. One post is in the Ministry's Headquarters and another in the Fisheries Department.

Audio-Typists (20 Posts), National Assembly (No. 485/67) PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must have a good Cambridge School Certificate preferably with a credit in English Language, and should be fluent and extremely well versed in English. Preference will be given to serving young men who have several years' experience in Government. Ability to type will be an advantage but not essential. The successful candidates will undergo a training programme of approximately six months' duration. Direct entrants into the service holding the Cambridge School Certificate will be paid £268 per annum during the training period, but serving officers who may be offered any of the posts will retain their existing salaries and salary scales. or any equivalent examination.

Fhysical.—Between the ages of 18 and 25 years, and single. Height: 5 ft. 6 in. or over. Vision and hearing: normal, without aids, athletic and of good physique. Candidates will be required to pass a Government Medical Examination.

The salary attached to the post is £339 by £16 to £659 p.a. A free issue of uniform is made on first appointment, thereafter an allowance of £25 p.a. is given for upkeep.

Appointment in the first instance will be on probation and successful applicants will enter at the minimum of the scale (£339 p.a.). Acceptance into the permanent and pensionable establishment is subject to the satisfactory completion of a probationary period of two years and a pass in all subjects in the Police Inspectorate Examination.

Successful candidates will be posted to the Police College, Kiganjo, for a period of six months where instructions will be given in all aspects of Police work. After the completion of training and subject to a satisfactory course report candidates will be posted to Police Units for duty.

Foreman of Works (Electrical), in the Office of the Secretary-General, Property and Estate Management Division

Salary scale.—G.4 (Sh. 13,400 by Sh. 600 to Sh. 16,400 p.a.). Closing date.—19th January 1968.

Qualifications.—Candidates must have Cambridge School Certificate of Education or the Junior Secondary Education Standard Ten (X) with City and Guilds Ordinary Level in Electrical Engineering.

A minimum of three years' experience as an Electrician Supervisor is essential. The candidates must have experience in electric installation of machinery, electric cookers and refrigerators, house wiring and general electrical repair.

The successful candidates will be responsible for the supervision of electricians and labourers working under them.

Link Trainer Instructor, in the E.A. Directorate of Civil Aviation

Salary scale.—G.2 (Sh. 21,920 by Sh. 640 to Sh. 26,960 p.a.). Closing date.—19th January 1968.

Duties.—The Link Trainer Instructor will give instruction to pilots in instrument training and procedures at the facility established at Wilson Airport, Nairobi.

Qualifications.—Preferably ex-aircrew with considerable experience of instructing on aircraft simulators. Applications from persons with recent experience as airline pilots or navigators will be considered.

Applications from unqualified persons will not be acknowledged.

Field Officer, in E.A. Trypanosomiasis Research Organization Salary scale.—G.4-3 (Sh. 13,400 by Sh. 600 to Sh. 17,600 by Sh. 720 to Sh. 21,920 p.a.).

Closing date.—19th January 1968.

Duties.—The duties of the post entail supervision of Junior Entomological, Veterinary and Medical staff in various localities in East Africa during routine operations and epidemiological survey under the general direction of Scientific Officers.

The applicants should have past experience in field work in connexion with the survey and control of Vector-borne diseases of man and animals. He should be able to speak English and two or more local languages fluently and to be able to write full reports in clear and concise English. The possession of School Certificate or Higher School Certificate is desirable but not essential. Ability to supervise and control junior staff and organize their work is an advantage. The successful candidate will be required to live at E.A.T.R.O., Sukulu, Tororo, from where his work will be directed.

Research Officer (Biochemistry), in the E.A. Institute of Malaria and Vector-borne Diseases

Salary scale.—R.2-1 (Sh. 22,160 to Sh. 28,840 and Sh. 29,880 to Sh. 41,280 p.a.

Entry point will depend on qualification and experience.

The applicants must possess a M.Sc. degree in Biochemistry or its equivalent with some years' postgraduate experience.

He will be expected to devote his time to the following aspects of research and will therefore be expected to have had some experience in this field:

- Detection of anti-malarial compounds and their metabolites in the blood, urine, etc.
- Separation and purification of antigens of malarial and other parasites, and the study of their possible use in different immunodiagnostic methods.
- The application of chromatography in aiding the separation of taxonomically undistinguishable sibling species of some Vectors of Malaria and Onchocerciasis.

Examining Officer (Trainee), Investigation Branch, E.A. Customs and Excise Department

Salary.—Training scale (Sh. 5,360 by Sh. 400 to Sh. 12,400). Closing date.—19th January 1968.

Applicants must be Africans who should be between the ages of 25 and 32 years and hold a Higher School Certificate or a Division I School Certificate with credits at least in English Language and Mathematics. Previous experience in investigating work or considerable commercial accountancy practice will be an advantage. Applications will be considered from candidates with lower educational qualifications but who have experience in investigation work.

Candidates would be required to undergo a departmental course in Customs and Excise Law and practice and after satisfactory completion of at least two years' training and subject to passing a qualifying examination would be appointed Examining Officer, Investigation Branch, in the Scale G.4-2 (Sh. 12,800 to Sh. 26,960 p.a.).

Their duties will include valuation inquiries and investigation work arising from the legal and illegal importation and exportation of goods to and from foreign countries and between the individual States of East Africa. Knowledge of general commercial invoicing is an advantage and a high standard of integrity is a necessary requirement. Candidates should have the ability to deal tactfully and successfully with the commercial and general public.

Candidates will be liable for service anywhere in Kenya, Uganda and Tanzania and will be expected to undertake considerable travelling and to work out of routine office hours for which a duty allowance of Sh. 3,000 per annum will be paid.

Head of Animal Husbandry Division, in the E.A. Agriculture and Forestry Research Organization

Applications are invited from experienced officers for the post of Head of Animal Husbandry Division.

Qualifications.—Good honours degree with main subjects in Agriculture and Zoology with postgraduate research qualification Ph.D., although experienced candidates with M.Sc. would be considered.

The candidate should have a minimum of 15 years' postgraduate experience and specialize either in animal nutrition or animal husbandry. Some experience in range and wildlife research would be an advantage. The post will carry considerable responsibility and would involve both direction of research and administrative duties.

Scale.—S.P.S.O. fixed Sh. 48,000 p.a. taxable in East Africa and Sh. 18,960 p.a. netted overseas addition free from further taxation. Both basic and overseas addition are subject to 25 per cent gratuity on completion of a contract. Gratuity on overseas addition is free from Income Tax.

Technical Secretary Grade II, in the E.A. Agriculture and Forestry Research Organization

Salary scale.—Sh. 14,000 by Sh. 600 to Sh. 17,600 by Sh. 720 to Sh. 20,480 p.a.

Qualifications.—Entry point to the scale will depend on the amount of experience obtained after the selected candidate attained the speeds of 50 and 120 words per minute typing and shorthand respectively. Knowledge of technical and scientific terms is desirable and selected candidate without this knowledge will be required to acquire it as soon as possible after taking up the appointment.

The appointment will be on either permanent and pensionable terms or on one or two years' contract. A gratuity of 10 per per cent and 25 per cent of the gross salary will be payable after successful completion of one- and two-year contracts respectively.

Statistical Assistant (Trainee) (Two Posts), Statistics Division, Common Market and Economic Affairs Secretariat

Salary scale.—D. (£520 by £20 to £620 p.a.). PENSIONABLE. Closing date.—12th January 1968.

- (a) the Cambridge Higher School Certificate with a Principal Level pass in Mathematics or Economics or an equivalent General Certificate in Education at Advanced Level; or

The trainee will normally be required to serve two years in this grade. During this period he will undergo intensive training in the office as well as at the East African Statistical Training Centre in Dar es Salaam.

On successful completion of the training, the trainee will qualify for promotion to the Statistical Assistant grade (scale G.4-3: £670 to £1,060). A promising Statistical Assistant can, after further training, qualify for the post of a Statistical Officer (scale G.3-2: £850 to £1,348).

Applicants should possess either Part I Certificate of the Institute of Statisticians or Middle Level Certificate of the East African Statistical Training Centre and at least two years' experience in statistical work.

A Statistical Assistant is responsible for the collection of data and compilation and analysis of returns and other data at a level requiring a knowledge of basic statistical techniques.

One increment may be awarded for each year of approved experience subsequent to acquiring the basic qualifications, up to a maximum of seven.

Librarian, Statistics Division, Common Market and Economic Affairs Secretariat

Salary scale.—G.3 (£850 to £1,060 p.a.). PENSIONABLE.

Closing date.-12th January 1968.

Applicants should possess either-

- (a) a University degree and one year's relevant experience; or

- (c) the Diploma in Librarianship and two years' relevant experience.

The Librarian is responsible to the Director for the general administration of the Library and supervision of staff, ordering of new publications, classification and cataloguing, and liaison with libraries in East Africa and elsewhere. Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers

and

James Warren and Company (Africa) Limited

Issue in dispute:—

Leave Allowance v/s Leave Travelling Allowance.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and James Warren and Company (Africa) Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th day of December 1967, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

The agreement made between the Parties on 8th March 1967, which was with effect from 1st October 1966, for a period of 12 months from that date has been revised by the Parties and wage increases have been granted with effect from 1st October 1967. This new agreement is to remain in force for a period of two years and the employees will receive another wage increase at the beginning of the second year of the operation of the agreement. During the revision of the first agreement the Claimants were entitled to raise the question of leave travelling allowance and did so. After discussions the following was recorded during the Joint Negotiating Committee meeting held on 3rd November 1967:—

"Company: The Company representative maintained that the present clause 5 in the operative agreement as far as he was concerned needed no change.

Union: The representative of the Union maintained that he was not prepared to accept the present clause 5 to remain the same and therefore, demanded leave travelling allowance of Sh. 120 in cash.

No agreement could be reached on this item. Both Parties agreed to refer this to Industrial Court for arbitration."

This fringe benefit has gradually changed in character over the last few years. Whereas some years back it was primarily meant to pay for the travelling expenses of an employee and/or certain members of his family, now it is considered a pure and simple leave allowance leaving it up to the employee to spend it as he wishes. In the industrial sector the bulk of the precedents is in favour of a leave allowance and after a careful consideration of all the submissions in the present dispute the Court can find no reason why the Respondents should not pay a leave allowance to their employees when they proceed on annual paid leave. In view of this the Court awards that the present clause 5 should be cancelled and in its place the Respondents should pay a sum of Sh. 60 per annum to each of their employees when they proceed on their annual paid leave.
