3. The grantee shall at his own expense suitably connect the said drainage system and also the water supply system with any town drainage and/or town water supply system when in the opinion of the local authority the latter systems are so far completed as to enable the grantee to do so.

4. The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and conditions all buildings at any time erected on the land.

14. Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require any roads serving or adjoining the land to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess.

15. Issue in dispute:—

Severance Pay as a result of Redundancy.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Fitzgerald Baynes & Company Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The Parties were heard in Nairobi on the 7th day of May 1968, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

In this dispute the two employees involved Mr. Shillingi Mohamed and Mr. Mohamedali Kassamali have received Sh. 20,980/45 and Sh. 8,897/35 respectively by way of provident fund. They would be entitled to a further Sh. 4,410 and Sh. 2,758 by way of severance pay if the Respondents' submissions were rejected.

Clause 15 (a) of the agreement which exists between the Parties reads as follows:—

"All employees other than those who are members of the retirement benefit scheme shall be entitled on retirement to a gratuity subject to the provisions of subparagraphs (b), (c) and (d) below."

Clause 16 under the heading of "Redundancy" reads as follows:—

"In the event of the termination of any Established Employee's services on the grounds of redundancy, he shall be given due notice or wages in lieu of notice and accrued leave pay, in terms of rule 14 together with any gratuity to which he may be entitled under rule 15. If he is entitled to no gratuity he shall instead receive severance pay at the rate of two weeks' basic wages (at the rate then being paid to him) for each complete year's service, plus an additional one month's basic wages."

It should be noted that gratuity is payable to those employees who are not members of the retirement benefit scheme and that redundancy payments are to be made if a worker is not entitled to any gratuity at the rate of two weeks' basic wages for each complete year's service. It is not stated that a worker who is entitled to a benefit under the retirement benefit scheme should not receive severance pay on redundancy. The Respondents argue that a worker can receive redundancy payment if he is entitled to no gratuity and as gratuities are tied up with retirement benefit scheme, the same principles should apply to that benefit scheme. This argument is somewhat difficult to understand because if that is what the intention of the Parties was, then it is most unusual that this omission should have been allowed in what is otherwise a very well drawn up agreement indeed.

The Court notes that the then General Manager of the Respondents had written a letter to the two employees concerned on 30th June 1967, in which he had stated in the last paragraph as follows:—

"You are therefore given notice as from 1st July 1967, and will be required to work until 31st July 1967, for one month of your notice but as you have been employed by this Company for in excess of five years you will be paid an additional month's pay in lieu of the second month plus two weeks' pay for every year of completed service and an additional month's pay as per the terms and conditions of service. Should you have leave accrued to your credit you will also be paid in lieu of such leave *pro-rata* to service plus *pro-rata* leave bonus. The Company regrets the need for this step and wishes you every success in obtaining fresh employment, we also wish to thank you for your past services."

This General Manager is also the first signatory to the agreement existing between the Parties. In view of this the Court finds that when he wrote the above letter he was fully aware of what the relevant provisions in the agreement meant and it was only as an afterthought that the Respondents tried to back out of this assurance given by him. In view of this the Court has no alternative but to award that these two employees should be paid their severance pay as they had been declared redundant.

The Court would like to state that the facts of this case are entirely different from the precedents which had been cited by the Respondents in support of their arguments.

RULING ON COSTS

THIS is an application for costs made by the Claimants against the Respondents in the above Cause in which the Claimants have succeeded.

The Claimants base their demand on the premise that the Industrial Court is a properly constituted Court of the country. As such section 27 (1) of Civil Procedure Act should apply and the Industrial Court has jurisdiction to make an order as to costs. They further argued that it is a principle of our legal system that any proper expenses incurred by a party in asserting his claim should be reimbursed to him in the judgement by the award of costs. They pointed out that in nearly all cases of civil litigation it was the matter of costs which was the principal factor in deciding a party whether to litigate or not. Every party must know that—in the usual course of events—if he loses his case in Court he will have to bear, not only his own costs, but those of his adversary as well. This discouraged vexatious litigation. The Claimants added that if this principle was set aside or not observed in the Industrial Court, then the Court can expect the number of cases brought before it to be increased beyond measure.

The Respondents, on the other hand, maintain that the law as it stands now does not provide for the awarding of costs in Industrial Court except in the case of appeal.

The Respondents pointed out that in Trinidad and Tobago where the Industrial Court has power to award costs it has had a very serious effect on Trade Unions and in a recent case the Court had made an order of \$6,000 by way of costs against a Union which had made it necessary for the Union to impose a levy on its members.

The Respondents further argued that in United Kingdom the Industrial Court had been established with the aim that the parties must be encouraged to make the utmost use of it and, therefore, the Act provided that the expenses of the Court should be met from moneys made available by Parliament. Similar provision was to be found in the Kenya Trade Disputes Act.

Finally the Respondents stated that as the Trade Disputes Act and the relevant Rules made by the Chief Justice made no reference to the awarding of costs, the application should be rejected.

After a careful consideration of the aforesaid arguments the Court has come to the conclusion that it has no power to award costs in any matter before it other than on an appeal from an order of Minister. It should be noted that section 23 (1) expressly states that the Court may give such directions as to the costs of appeal as the Court thinks proper. Apart from this one reference to costs the whole Act and the Rules are silent on it. It is quite obvious that the Parliament never intended that the Industrial Court should award costs in ordinary trade disputes. No Court fees are payable by parties either, a fact which reinforces the view that parties to industrial disputes should make the utmost use of the Court.

The Court feels that the awarding of costs is a double edged weapon as there is no doubt that if costs were to be awarded in trade disputes it would act against the interest of the Trade Union movement in Kenya by virtue of the far superior financial ability of the Employers. Accordingly the Court finds that this application is misconceived and is, therefore, refused.
