Applicants must be of the Cambridge, or preferably, Higher School Certificate standard of education, and be fluent in both written and spoken English and Swahili. They should have pleasant personality and good voice, and must have performed announcing duties for a period of at least two years in radio or television, either as artists or relevant capacities. A knowledge of typing, would be an advantage though not essential. Duties include research in the contents of synopsis of television programmes, compiling scripts for announcements, and continuity duties during programme transmission. NOTICE is hereby given that The East African Power & Lighting Co. Ltd., a limited liability company having its registered office at Electricity House, Harambee Avenue, Nairobi, Kenya, the holder of Distributing Licence No. 14 dated the 24th September 1958 (hereinafter called "the Applicant") will on 18th February 1971, pursuant to the provisions of sections 36 and 129 of the Electric Power Act (Cap. 314), apply to the Minister for Power and Communications to extend the provisions and the area of supply the subject of the said licence by the inclusion for the remainder of the period of the said licence and for the period of any extension or renewal thereof of the areas the particulars of which are set out in the Schedule hereto.
