Serving officers with a minimum of three years' practical experience in the grade not below that of an Information Officer Grade III will be considered. Duties involve Press coverage and general information work which include feature writing, ad hoc publicity drives, sub-editing for the Kenya News Agency; or production of magazines and pamphlets, display boards, supervision/direction of cinema vans, and handling of public address equipment and fundamental techniques of photography.

Senior Cameraman (No. 54/71)

Salary scale.—£858 to £1,068. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must possess the Cambridge School Certificate or the Higher School Certificate with credits in Mathematics and General Science. They should have at least five years' experience in 16 mm. film production, shooting news, features and documentaries. A thorough knowledge of dark-room operation is essential. Duties will include 16 mm. filming, negative processing, editing, scripting and supervision of film production staff. The successful candidate must be prepared to undertake considerable travelling in and outside Kenya and put up with irregular working hours.

THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

SOTIK TOWNSHIP—PLOTS FOR SHOPS AND/OR OFFICES COMBINED WITH RESIDENCE (EXCLUDING THE SALE OF PETROL)

THE Commissioner of Lands gives notice that the plots in Sotik Township as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the individual plots.

- 2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the Clerk, Kipsigis County Council, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 4 post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Clerk of the Kipsigis County Council, stating the plot required in order of preference. Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department or the Clerk of the Kipsigis County Council.
- 4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Clerk of the Kipsigis County Council, not later than noon on the 19th day of March 1971.
- 5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.
- 6. Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh. 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.
- 5. Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh. 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 40 of 1970

Parties:---

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union

and

City Spray Painters

Issues in dispute:-

- 1. Wages.
- 2. Safari allowance.
- 3. Acting allowance.
- 4. Leave travelling allowance.
- 5. Suspension.
- 6. Gratuity.
- 7. Effective date and duration.
- 1. The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and City Spray Painters shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 20th day of January 1971 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARI

3. The Respondents originally were members of the Nairobi Spray Painters Employers' Group (hereinafter referred to as the Group) and as such had a terms of service agreement with the Claimants. This Group was disbanded in December 1966 and the Claimants approached the two largest companies in the Group, namely the General Spray Painters Ltd. and the Respondents. On 19th January 1967, the parties met but unfortunately a deadlock was reached. On 1st March 1967, the panies separately and on 12th June 1967, a conciliator recommended that there should be a reference to the Industrial Court. No action however was taken and the next move was a commencement of fresh negotiations between the Claimants and the Respondents as a result of which a new recognition agreement was signed on 5th December 1968.

On 17th January 1969, negotiations commenced on the terms and conditions of employment covering Respondents' employees. From then on until 18th May 1970, no serious attempt appears to have been made to resolve the outstanding items. During the hearing the Claimants conceded that from 27th March 1969 to 18th May 1970, they did not attend the meetings as they were occupied with other matters concerning COTU and threatened strikes by their members in other firms.

Eventually a meeting did take place on 18th May 1970, but as agreement could not be reached the Claimants notified the existence of a dispute to the Ministry of Labour on 5th June. A conciliator was appointed but was not successful and the parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" to the Industrial Court on 16th November 1970, and forwarded it to the Court on 28th November.

It is important at this stage to note that the Respondents granted usual increments to employees in December 1968 ranging from Sh. 10 to Sh. 25 p.m. Again in 1969, after discussions with the shopsteward, the Respondents granted increases to all employees in December ranging from Sh. 15 to Sh. 50 p.m. The existing level of wages paid as at January 1971, taking into account all the increases granted, is:—

During the hearing the Claimants accused the Respondents of having adopted a negative attitude as they made it clear to them, the Claimants, that they would increase the wages of their employees as and when they thought it necessary and by an amount which they, the Respondents, thought appropriate. The Claimants accused the Respondents of having undermined them by proceeding to grant increments to their workers knowing fully well that they were involved in negotiations with the Claimants representing the workers from as far back as December 1968.

The Court has in the past expressed the view that it is indiscreet on the part of an employer to grant wage increases when a union is negotiating for such an increase on behalf of the workers. Such a move can rightly be construed as an attempt by the employer to undermine the union but in the present

case, after careful consideration of the background of this dispute, the Court is satisfied that when the two wage increases were granted the Respondents had adequate reasons for doing so. The first increase in 1968 was granted at a time when negotiations on wages had not even started and the second increase in December 1969 was granted at a time when the Claimants had apparently stopped negotiations and the shopsteward had come to the Respondents and asked for an increase which was granted.

The Claimants submitted that the Respondents were able to meet their demand of a 10 per cent wage increase as their business was flourishing. The increase in the number of motor vehicles had clearly resulted in a great increase in spray painting business and as the Respondents were among the best in their line, they were making a lot of money. The Claimants stated that despite the fact that the Respondents made a big profit they were reluctant to pay decent wages to the workers.

The Respondents on the other hand denied strongly that they had not been co-operative with the Claimants. They stated that there are dozens of companies operating in this type of business but the Claimants had put pressure only on two of them, one being the Respondents. The Respondents stated that there had been no difference in their turnover since the last seven years and their business had not increased. Their main business was from the larger garages who did their own spray painting and the Respondents only got what was surplus. The Respondents claimed that the award of the Court would be subject to the Tripartite Agreement as they had taken their quota of additional workers under the said agreement.

With reference to the remarks made by the Claimants' General Secretary during the hearing alleging breach of the Tripartite Agreement on the part of the Government, the Court would like to draw his attention to the fact that necessary machinery has been created under the agreement where such matters can be gone into. The Court cannot and indeed is not prepared to pass an opinion on such an important matter in relation to a national agreement on such scant remarks without adequate backing of satisfactory evidence to that effect.

The Court has carefully considered the various submissions made by the parties before making its award on the issues in dispute.

Wages.—The Court awards a wage increase of Sh. 20 p.m. to those workers who are at present earning between Sh. 260 and Sh. 315 p.m.; and Sh. 50 p.m. increase to the two skilled workers at present receiving Sh. 725 and Sh. 800 p.m.

Safari allowance.—The Court has come to the conclusion that the facts do not warrant the introduction of this allowance at present and therefore makes a nil award.

Acting allowance.—The Court makes the following award:—

Where an employee is required to act in a higher grade for a period of not less than 14 consecutive days, he shall be paid, in addition to his basic minimum wage, an acting allowance equal either to 20 per cent of the basic wage of the employee for whom he is acting, or to the full basic wage of that employee, whichever is the lesser amount.

Leave travelling allowance.—The Court awards that employees should be paid a sum of Sh. 25 leave travelling allowance when they proceed on their annual leave.

Suspension .- Nil award.

Gratuity.—The Court makes the following award which is based on the offer made by the Respondents:—

An employee on retirement shall be entitled to ten days' pay for every completed year of service by way of gratuity to be based on the employee's wages at the time of the commencement of the N.S.S.F. The effective date for the purpose of working out the benefits under this scheme shall be for employment after the 1st January 1959 up to the commencement of the N.S.S.F. in 1966 (an employee shall not be entitled to any gratuity for service prior to the 1st January 1959) and the scheme shall be deemed to have ceased with the implementation of the N.S.S.F. An employee who resigns or is dismissed summarily for established lawful cause shall not be entitled to a gratuity.

Effective date and duration.—The Court rules that this award should be effective from 1st December 1970, and that it should remain in force for a period of 18 months from that date.





IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.:—

- Kenya Gazette contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

Extract from the Code of Regulations, section D-

Kenya Gazette

"D.41. (1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
