Deputy Commissioner for Co-operative Development (No. 63/71)

Salary.-£2,275 (fixed). PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must possess a degree from a recognized University in one of the following: Economics, Commerce, Business Administration, Agriculture or other related fields, with at least five years' post-graduate experience in a relevant field in rural economy. They must have acquired wide experience in planning, administering and implementing rural programmes in which co-operatives are directly involved. Serving officers must be of at least Senior Co-operative Officer level, with proven ability to organize and supervise field programmes. Ability to evaluate large co-operative projects, together with interpretation of Final Accounts and Balance Sheets is essential. Duties involve co-ordination and supervision of staff, and development programmes at a senior level, as well as budgeting and control of votes for the Department; enforcement of the Co-operative Societies Act, Rules and By-laws; dealing with complaints from co-operative societies and general public; and action reports from Provincial Co-operative Officers and foreign experts. The successful candidate will be based at Nairobi but his duties will involve extensive travelling.

Assistant Commissioner for Co-operative Development (Administration) (No. 64/71)

Salary scale.—£1,839 to £2,064. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must possess a degree from a recognized University in one of the following: Economics, Commerce, Business Administration or Agriculture, with post-graduate training or research in either Development Economics, Co-operative Management, Education or other relevant fields. They should have at least two years' experience in planning or research work in either the Government or private sector in the field of economic planning or rural economy. Duties include horizontal and vertical co-ordination of development programmes; studying and working out analytical and action oriented guidelines in new co-operative activities; harmonize co-operative development policies with other national plans, especially farm policy and finance and economic planning.

Management Accounting Consultant (Designate), Management Training and Advisory Centre (No. 66/71)

Applicants should possess either a degree in Commerce or Economics of an approved University or an acceptable qualification in Accountancy or Secretarial Practice. They should preferably have had experience in an industrial or commercial organization and should be able to assist African businessmen and give advice to the small business and industrial establishments. The successful candidate will receive on-the-job training from the Consultant conducting programmes on management accounting and small business and industrial development. On satisfactory completion of this training he will be appointed to the position of Counterpart to the Consultant.

Senior Technical Instructor, National Youth Service (No. 67/71)

Salary scale.—£1,155 to £1,239. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be mature persons of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education. They must possess the Final City and Guilds Certificate or the Kenya Government Grade I Trade Test Certificate with considerable experience as a Technical Instructor in Motor Mechanics, or General Mechanics (Fitter/Turner) or Electricity. Experience in vocational education administration including designing and supervision of the training schemes and instructors, a knowledge of Government accounting and stores procedures would be advantageous. Chief Inspector of Small Arms, Kenya Police (No. 70/71)

Applicants should be of Cambridge School Certificate standard of education and should have undergone a recognized armourers' apprenticeship. In addition, they must have served for a minimum of six years as Armourers Grade I or two years as Senior Inspectors of Small Arms Grade I in the case of Kenya Police Armourers, and in both cases have a thorough knowledge of small arms and ammunition. The post is that of a Force Armourer and the successful candidate will be required to exercise control and be responsible for the efficient maintenance and repair of all Police weapons through the Arms Base Workshop, Provincial Arms Workshops and several circuit teams operating throughout the Provinces. Ability to give a high standard of technical supervision to Armourers' inspection

reports is essential. Duties include being the Technical Adviser to the Kenya Police on arms and ammunition, and responsibility under the Force Quartermaster for the correct maintenance of the Force Arms Records; the day to day control of the stocks and issues of arms and ammunition, and accounting thereto. A thorough knowledge of Government stores accounting iin respect of arms, components and ammunition is essential together with the ability to estimate and cost annual requirements.

Assistant Education Officer (Five Posts), Ministry of Education (No. 71/71)

Salary scale.—£684 to £1,119. PENSIONABLE or AGREE-MENT.

Applicants must be serving P.1 or S.1 teachers, and of mature age, with at least five years' satisfactory teaching experience. 
