THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 5 OF 1971

Parties:—

Kenya Local Government Workers' Union
and

Association of Local Government Employers

Issue in dispute:—

Arbitrary increase of house rents.

1. The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Association of Local Government Employers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 4th day of March, 1971 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The four Municipal Councils involved in this dispute are: Eldoret, Thika, Kisumu and Nakuru. They comprise Committee No. 2 of the Respondents. Another member of Committee No. 2 is Kitale Municipal Council but they are not a party to this dispute.

At a National Joint Negotiating Council—(Committee No. 2) meeting on 13th February, 1970 a decision was taken on the question of house rents. The decision is recorded in Minute No. 17/70 as follows:—

"Due to the fact that housing had now been consolidated into the salaried grades it was agreed that in the event of Councils increasing their rents the Union would have the right to reopen discussions on salaries."

There is no dispute on the fact that a salary increase of 15 per cent was agreed to be granted on existing salaries to compensate the officers for merging of existing house allowances with salaries. Both parties are agreed that after this 15 per cent increase on the salary to consolidate housing and salary, each employee would be moved up to the next higher point in the scale.

The Respondents pointed out that prior to this arrangement the normal rent paid by the employees or the subsidies received by them averaged about 10 per cent. However as some of the higher salaried staff and middle salaried staff were receiving subsidies or paid rent between 10 and 15 per cent, it was agreed that all workers would receive equal benefit and be increased by the same percentage, thus 15 per cent was agreed so that no one would be the loser.

What has happened and what is the bone of contention in this dispute, is that after the above agreement the four Councils now require their employees to pay the rent for the accommodation rented from them on the basis of rent paid by the general public.

The Claimants argued that no officer occupying Council houses should be required to pay a higher rental because it would be contrary to their agreement with these Councils and further that it was a clear violation of the provisions of the Tripartite Agreement. They maintained that the crux of the matter was not whether an employee was better off under the new arrangement. The important point was that it was clearly agreed *vide* Minute No. 17/70 that there would be no increase whatsoever in the rent being paid by the officers.

They asked the Court either to order the Councils to refund the extra rent they had charged since the above agreement was made or alternatively they should be allowed to re-open negotiations with a view to securing salary increases.

The Claimants charged the Kisumu Municipal Council of having increased the rents at Arina Estate from Sh. 100 p.m. to Sh. 125 p.m. The Eldoret Municipal Council was alleged to have increased the rents paid by its manual workers. In the case of Thika, the alleged increase in rent is Sh. 10.

The Respondents on the other hand pointed out that the Claimants are confusing the issue by stating that where an employee was previously paying a rental which was subsidized by the Council he should not now pay the rental charged to the public. The Respondents said that this was quite wrong as the whole conception of the increase was to take the question of housing out of negotiations and to ensure that all salaried staff received a level of salaries which would enable them to choose their own housing and if they so decided to live in a Council house they would then pay the economic rent or the rent the same as that paid by the general public.

The Court notes that all the employees received their increments in January, 1971, despite the Tripartite Agreement. Therefore, there would appear to be little merit in their allegations against the Councils for having violated the provisions of the agreement when the grant and receipt of this annual increment would appear to be in itself contrary to the Tripartite Agreement.

The Court finds that the position established is somewhat like this. In the case of Nakuru, an officer in Grade "C" was previously at the scale of £1,500 p.a. His new salary scale is £1,740 p.a. His new rent is Sh. 590 as against the old rent of Sh. 385 the difference being Sh. 205 p.m. The salary increase however under the new agreement is Sh. 400 p.m. The officer therefore is better off than before by some Sh. 195 p.m. The Court quite believes that the Council concerned can probably get a rental of Sh. 1,000 p.m. in respect of the house occupied by this officer who is required to pay only Sh. 590 p.m. This is just one example and the Court has no reason to doubt the statement made by the Respondents' representative that in fact only two officers appeared to be at a loss under the new arrangement and the Court accepts his assurance that their cases would be looked into with a view to rectifying the situation.

It is inconceivable that the Councils would agree to a 15 per cent salary increase and yet allow the subsidy of rentals to remain at the same level. Had they agreed to such an arrangement it would be a poor reflection on them. The Court, however, is satisfied from the submissions made that what the Claimants stated to be an increase in rents is in fact not so. The Nakuru Municipal Council have done no more than to regularize the question of rents as a result of the 15 per cent increase to salaried grades consolidating housing into salaries.

As far as Kisumu Municipal Council is concerned the dispute mainly relates to Arina Estate, where 105 new houses have just been completed and were allocated to tenants in January, 1971. The original 70 houses are still charged Sh. 100 although a request has been made to the Minister for Local Government to seek his approval to charge all the 175 houses a rental of Sh. 125 per month. It is clearly established that the rent being charged at present in respect of houses affected by the 15 per cent salary increase is Sh. 100 per house per month, the same as before. There is therefore no increase and the Claimants' allegation is not proved. In case the Ministry of Local Government approves the Council's request to increase the rents to Sh. 125 p.m., then the Claimants would be justified in their demands. The Court, however, hopes that the Minister would not approve such an increase in rents at the present time.

In respect of Eldoret Municipal Council the complaint regarding increase in rents relates to non-salaried grades only but the present dispute concerns the salaried grades. The Respondents indicated their willingness to look into these complaints provided the Claimants raised them through proper channels. In any case the Respondents strongly refuted the allegations of any rent increases as per the letter of 16th February, 1971 addressed by the Municipal Treasurer to the Secretary of Association of Local Government Employers. In these circumstances the Court would advise the Claimants to pursue their complaints, if any, in respect of non-salaried grades through proper channels before bringing them to the Industrial Court.

The Respondents admit that the Thika Municipal Council have increased the rents by Sh. 10 but they maintained that this is not an increase in rent but is an extra charge in respect of conservancy, water and electricity. The original rents are Sh. 48 per month for a single room and Sh. 84 p.m. for a double-room house inclusive of water, conservancy and electricity. The Court, however has some doubt on whether the increase of Sh. 10, in case where an inclusive rent is paid, can be considered to be an increase only in respect of conservancy, water and electricity charges. The Court has decided to give the benefit of doubt to the employees but only to the extent that Sh. 5 is to be considered an increase in house rents, the remaining Sh. 5 is to be considered an increase in respect of other charges. The Court therefore directs that the extra rent of Sh. 5 p.m. charged by Thika Municipal Council should be refunded to the employees from the date when it was increased.

For the foregoing reasons the Court is unable to find that the three Municipal Councils of Kisumu, Nakuru and Eldoret are in breach of rule 41 of the Terms and Conditions of service or that they have acted contrary to the joint resolution passed on 13th February, 1970. Further the Court finds that these three Councils have not acted contrary to the provisions of clause 11 (d) of the Tripartite Agreement. The question of any refund in respect of the employees of these three Councils therefore, does not arise. The Court rejects the Claimants' contention that they have the right to reopen discussions on salaries with these four Municipal Councils.

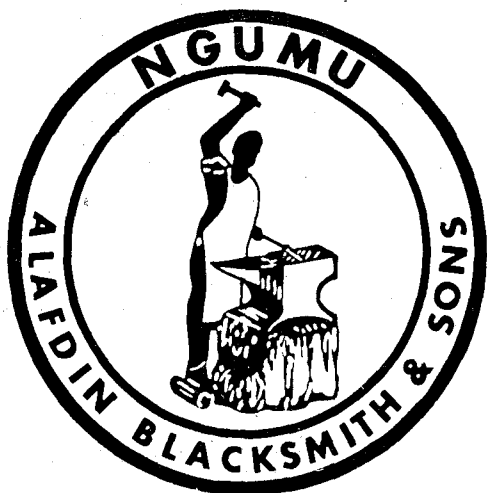
