*Chief Industrial Relations Officer (One Post) (No 267/71)*

*Salary scale—£2,334 to £2,820 PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT*

Applicants should preferably possess a degree from an approved University with experience in an administrative professional or managerial assignment involving industrial relations. Candidates who do not possess a degree should have gained wide specialized and practical experience in the field of industrial relations acquired either in Government service or in any other relevant organization or institution. They should have a thorough knowledge of labour legislation. Duties of the post include the supervision of the Industrial Relations Section in the Labour Department which is responsible for the efficient implementation of the provisions of the Trade Disputes Act, the settlement of trade disputes and procedures thereof, processing of collective agreements and advising on joint consultative machineries, supervision of trade union elections, and advising employers' and workers' organizations and consulting with the field Labour Officers on matters concerning industrial relations generally. The successful candidate will be the chief adviser on industrial relations.

*Director Management Training and Advisory Centre (One Post) (No 268/71)*

*Salary scale—£2,334 to £2,820 PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT*

Applicants should possess a degree in Economics, Business Administration or Industrial Engineering from an approved University. They should have substantial administrative and organizing ability and have held positions at senior management level. Preference will be given to candidates who have experience in consultancy practices, or in organizing and conducting training in management development and in management services. The Director will be responsible for implementing the objectives of the Centre, which are to promote manpower productivity. The Centre provides training and practical advice on business and management practices for industrial and other enterprises with emphasis on rural development, and on the development of Kenya entrepreneurs, businessmen and traders. The successful candidate will be wholly responsible for the running of the Management Development Centre, and will work in liaison with the Chief of Project who heads a team of international experts.

*Careers Adviser (One Post), Kenyanization of Personnel Bureau (No 269/71)*

*Salary scale—£1,494 to £1,866 PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT*

Applicants should possess a degree or its equivalent from an approved institution and must have considerable teaching experience at a secondary school level and be conversant with Kenya's educational administrative procedure. Preference will be given to candidates who have had experience as careers advisers in schools or have held administrative posts in education. Duties will include collection and compilation of information on careers and training facilities available to school leavers, processing of applications from school leavers and their placement into jobs. THE Commissioner of Lands gives notice that the plots in Nakuru Municipality as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grant of the individual plots

2 A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situate in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the District Commissioner, Nakuru, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P O Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh 3 post free

3 Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Town Clerk, Nakuru, stating the plot required in order of preference. Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department or Town Clerk, Nakuru

4 Applications must be sent so as to reach the Town Clerk not later than noon on the 8th October, 1971

5 Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands

6 Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows —

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

*General Conditions*

1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant

2 The grant will be issued under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281)

3 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application

4 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant

5 Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and the proportion of the annual rent together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment and within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the land

*Special Conditions*

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case), by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap 280) if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him

on behalf of the President to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised therein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

5 The land and buildings shall be used for workshop, garage or godown purposes only

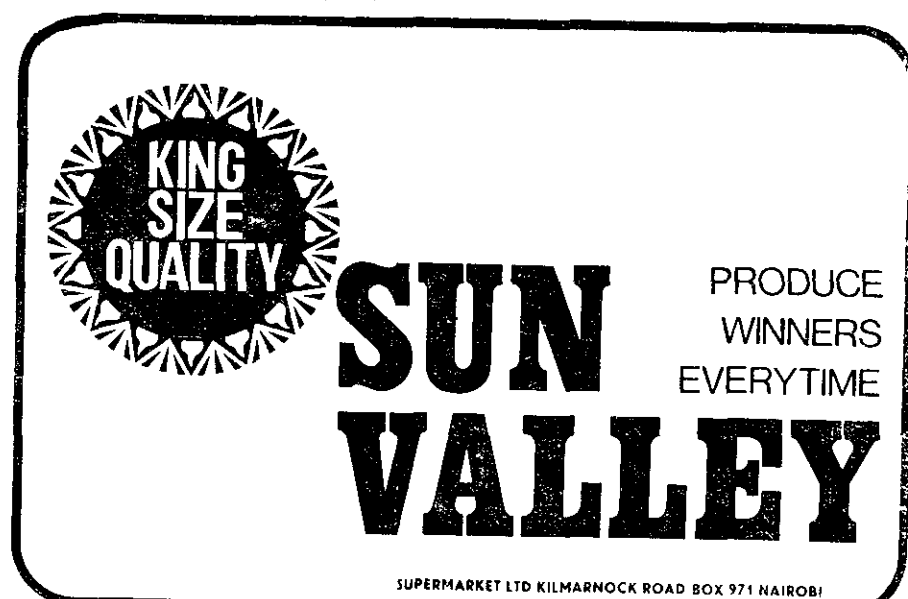
