- 3 Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Town Clerk, Nakuru, stating the plot required in order of preference Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department, or Town Clerk, Nakuru
- 4 Applications must be sent so as to reach the Town Clerk not later than noon on the 8th October, 1971
- 5 Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands
- 6 Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows
  - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in para graph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
  - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him

#### General Conditions

- 3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land
- 4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised therein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. 
