THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya gives notice that the plot in Nanyuki Town as described in the Schedule hereto is available for aliena tron and applications are invited for the direct grant of the plot

- 2 A plan of the plot may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Land Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the Clerk, Nanyuki, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office PO Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh 3 post free
- 3 Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi through the Clerk Nanyuki Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Depart ment, the Clerk, PO Box 4, Nanyuki
- 4 Applications must be sent so as to reach the Clerk not later than noon on the 5th November, 1971
- 5 Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands
- 6 Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh 1,000 as a deposit, which will be dealt with as follows
  - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of seven days as required in para graph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
  - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him
  - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfened and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

#### General Conditions

- 1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township giants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant
- 2 The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kunya) and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281)
- 3 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application
- 4 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant
- 5 Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the unitial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent) In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

### Special Conditions

- 1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithtanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of

any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to reenter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

- 3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time creeked on the land


