CAUSE No 28 OF 1971

Tailors and Textiles Workers' Union
and

E A Bag & Cordage Co Ltd

Issues in dispute—

- 1 Wages
- 2 Duration of agreement
- 3 Effective date

1 The Tailors and Textiles Workers Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and E A Bag & Cordage Co Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 24th day of November, 1971, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3 The parties had appeared before the Industrial Court in Cause No 45/68 when the Court awarded the following wage rates for the various groups—

In the same award the Court also ruled that the duration of the collective agreement between the parties in which the above rates were to be incorporated should be 18 months with effect from 1st October, 1968.

The Respondents in their submissions in that dispute had sounded warnings that they were passing through a very difficult period in view of the importation into the country of the products which they manufactured. Unfortunately the Respondents' gloomy forecast did come about and they had to reduce their work force to 1,001 by October 1970 from a figure of 1 800 in 1968.

The collective agreement expired on 31st March 1970, and the Respondents enjoyed a further 12 months standstill because of the Tripartite Agreement despite the fact that they were

exempted by the Government from increasing their work force by 10 per cent as required. Prior to the expiry of the Tripartite Agreement the Claimants forwarded their demands for revising the collective agreement and two meetings took place on 16th February and 4th March, 1971. The Court notes that the Claimants had asked for Sh 60 p m increase for all the employees and the Respondents consistently maintained that they could not make any counter offer due to the fact that their financial position was very serious. The Claimants stressed that the Respondents had never in the history of their collective bargaining ever concluded an agreement outside the Industrial Court.

The hearing proceeded from this point with the Claimants demanding a Sh 60 p m wage increase for all employees and the Respondents maintaining that in view of their precarious financial position a standstill was justified until such time as their employment figure had returned to the 1968 level.

The Claimants submitted that it was their legitimate function to raise the standard of living of their members and because of very low wages paid by the Respondents and in view of the increase in the cost of living they had no alternative but to press for an increase. They fully appreciated the points put forward by the Respondents but could not accept another wage standstill for 18 months. They complained that the Respondents had not given them an opportunity to negotiate on their demand for a wage increase of Sh 60 p m for all the employees.

The Respondents criticized the Claimants for making unrealistic wage demands under the circumstances. They pointed out that Sh 60 p m represented an increase of Sh 1,200,000 p a on the wage bill. They maintained that the fact that 800 persons had lost their employment has had no effect on the Claimants. They submitted that a profit in the year 1969 of £131,989 was translated into a loss in 1970 of £50,462 and so far this year they had lost £39,904 in their operations. They also pointed out that the manufacturing costs had increased and they were further hampered in their attempts to return to normal by the retention of two rather unfortunate features which resulted in their paying heavy overtime to some workers. In these circumstances they asked the Court to grant their request for a standstill until such time as they achieved the 1968 employment figure.

The Court has carefully studied the report and accounts for the three years ending 31st March, 1969, 1970 and 1971. The Court appreciates the difficult time through which the Respondents have passed in the last few years. The Court, however, notes that things have considerably improved and are still improving with the result that the Respondents have now in employment about 1,660 workers. The Court has also taken into consideration the two agreements (with lower wage rates than the Respondents') which the Claimants have entered into with two other firms who compete with the Respondents.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence put forward by the parties the Court has come to the conclusion that the workers deserve a wage increase. The Court awards that the aforesaid rates for the various groups should be increased by Sh 15 p m. This wage increase should also be granted to any employee who may be above the rates for their grades. In view of the Respondents' submissions the Court is of the view that they should be allowed a further six month wage standstill from 1st April, 1971, the date when the 12 month standstill under the Tripartite Agreement expired. The Court therefore awards that the wage increase awarded by the Court should be effective from 1st October, 1971, and it should remain in force for a period of 18 months from that date.

Special Conditions

1 No building shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands, plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for

the Commissioner of Lands or any persons authorized by him on behalf of the President to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands may (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

5 The land and the buildings shall only be used for shops, offices and flats (excluding the sale of petrol)

7 The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive

8 The grantee shall not subdivide the land

9 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed

10 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sums as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid

11 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess
