## THE TRUST LAND ACT (Cap 288)

KAKAMEGA—UNSURVEYED PLOTS FOR PRIVATE DWELLING HOUSES

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the Kakamega County Council gives notice that plots in Kakamega Municipality as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grant of the plots

- 2 Plans of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office, situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi or at the office of the Town Clerk to the Municipal Council of Kakamega, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, PO Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh 3 per copy, post free
- 3 Applications should be submitted to the Town Clerk to the Municipal Council of Kakamega Applications must be sent so as to reach the Town Clerk not later than noon on Monday, 28th February, 1972
- 4 Applicants must enclose with their applications their cheque for Sh 1,000 drawn on the applicant's own banking account (no other cheque will be accepted) made payable to the Town Clerk to the Council as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows
  - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 14 days, as required in para graph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
  - (b) It the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto
  - (c) If the applicant is unsuccessful his deposit will be refunded
- 5 The allottee shall pay to the Town Clerk, Kakamega, within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent) In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

#### General Conditions

- 1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township and trading centre grants of this nature shall apply except as varied hereby
- 2 The grant will be made under the Trust Land Act (Cap 288), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act. The term of the grant will be for 33 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant.
- 3 The grant will be issued in the name of the applicant as stated in the letter of application

#### Special Conditions

- 1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the County Council to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the County Council or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

- 3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land
- 4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the County Council that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the County Council shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised therein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the County Council shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any

- subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the County Council shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made
- 5 The land and buildings shall only be used for private residential purposes and not more than one private dwelling-house with the necessary office and outbuildings appurtenant thereto will be erected on the land. No guest house will be permitted
- 6 The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land
- 7 The grantee shall not subdivide the land without prior written consent of the Commissioner of Lands
- 8 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any building thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands no application for such consent except in respect of a loan required for building purposes will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed
- 9 The grantee shall pay to the County Council on demand such sum as the County Council may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid
- 10 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the County Council on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the County Council may assess
- 11 Should the County Council at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the County Council on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the County Council may assess
- 12 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon
- 13 The County Council or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains

#### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No 30 of 1971

Parties ---

Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers Union and

Lewis Paton & Co Ltd (Mombasa)

Issue in dispute -

Claimants -Non payment of service gratuity

Respondents—Whether certain employees who resigned from the service of the company on or about July or August, 1970 were entitled to receive terminal payments under the provisions of the Agreement between the Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union and the Motor Trade and Allied Industries Employers' Asso ciation

- 1 The Kenya Motor Engineering and Alhed Workers Umon shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Lewis Paton & Co Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The hearing commenced in Nairobi on the 16th day of November, 1971, and after the opening submissions it was resumed in Mombasa on the 20th day of December, 1971, as the parties wished to call a number of witnesses who were resident in Mombasa. The parties relicd on their written and verbal submissions and called the tollowing witnesses—

#### Award

3 The facts leading up to this dispute are that sometime in early 1970 the Claimants' branch secretary wrote to the Respondents on a matter concerning the grading of mechanics. On 5th February, 1970 the Managing Director of the Respondents replied to the Claimants letter and added the following para graph therein—

"In any case the company is shortly relinquishing agency of Mercedes and Datson vehicles and it is with regret that we have to inform you that it will be essential to declare a number of redundancies in the near future"

During the hearing the Court was informed that Messis D T Dobie & Co Ltd had told the Respondents that they would be opening then own branch in Mombasa very shortly with the result that they would withdraw the agency of Mercedes and Datsun vehicles from the Respondents

In the sequence of events the next development was that on 30th April, 1970 the Respondents tendered their resignation as members of the Motor Trade & Allied Industries Employers Association (hereinafter referred to as the Association) Their resignation was accepted by the Association at a meeting held on 2nd Jun. 1970, and the Association informed the Claimants and the Federation of Kenya Employers that the resignation was effective as from 30th June 1970 Then, between 11th July and 20th August, 1970, the Respondents received nine letters of resignation from the following employees—

Badru Punjani
Joseph K Malusi

Ramadhani Hassan

Some of these employees are since then working for D T Dobie & Co Ltd

On 2nd November, 1970 the Claimants Organizing Secretary wrote to the Respondents' Managing Director inquiring as to what were the terms and conditions of employment of those employees who were still working for the Respondents as they (the Respondents) had resigned from the Association

On 16th November, 1970, the Claimants' General Secretary informed the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, that a serious trade dispute existed between them and the Respondents in the matter of 'service gratuity of our members in accordance with the Agreement between the Union and the Association'

On 21st November, the Respondents applied to the Association to rejoin them as they had taken a new agency for 'Colt' vehicles. They also requested the Association to re elect them to membership with effect from 1st July, 1970

The dispute was accepted and a Labour Officer was appointed to act as a conciliator On 11th January, 1971, the Respondents wrote to the conciliator setting out their main arguments the first one being —

This company resigned from the Motor Trade and Allied Industries Employers' Association with effect from 30th June, 1970, for the sole reason that having received notice of termination of our agency agreement with Messrs D T Dobie & Co (K) Ltd for the sale of Mercedes and Datsun vehicles, we could, at that time, see no alternative but to close our motor business"

In addition to above, they rejected the Claimants' demand for service gratuity on the ground that the employees had resigned of their own accord for various reasons set out in their letters and pointed out that the Industrial Court had ruled quite clearly that the workers who resigned did not qualify for this benefit

The Claimants' arguments in brief are that the Managing Director of the Respondents through his clever and cunning manoeuvres had misled the workers and that he had procured their resignations by promising to pay them their 'benefits' In fact the Claimants went as tar as to say that the Managing Director had cheated his employees. The Claimants also sub mitted in their written submission that—

'When did actually these workers tender their resignations? When their employer was still' a member of the Association or after their employer had resigned and was no longer a member of the Association? Sir, the answer is that most of these alleged letters of resignations were dated 28th July, 1970 when the employer was no longer a member of the Association. And we submit very strongly that the resignation clause between the Union and the Association could never have been applicable to either the employer or to the workers. By resigning after their employer's resignation from the Association, the workers nad jumped the gun. Sir, the Union would not be advancing this argument had workers actually resigned 'when their employer was still a member of the Association'.

Finally in paragraph 18 the Claimants made the following submission —

In view of the fact that our members who resigned did so after Messrs Lewis Paton & Co Ltd had already resigned from the Association, and in view of the fact that since their employer rejoined the Association they have all been re employed as new people—it is our strong submission that they should be paid their redundancy pay since their employer admitted having temporarily closed down his business Since their employer accepted their letters of resignation, there is no evidence that these letters of resignation have been rescinded or revoked'

In their final submission the Claimants stated that what they were seeking were the redundancy benefits as the Respondents had expressed their intentions quite clearly of declaring these workers redundant. They asked the Court to rule that the workers should be paid the redundancy benefits as laid down in their agreement with the Association.

The Respondents on the other hand stated that the workers were not entitled to any retirement benefit because they had resigned and pointed out that in their agreement (Association) Claimants agreement) there was no provision whatsoever for As far as the Claimants' demand for service gratuity redundancy pay was concerned, they argued that they had agreed to give up one agency but before the handover was finalised they had accepted another agency There had been no cessation or closing down of business They added that the fact that the Respondents had at one stage resigned from the Association and rejoined it did not affect the issue at all. They strongly denied that the Managing Director had ever called a meeting of the workers and had promised to pay them their benefits They said that this was a deliberate and malicious lie. Finally the Respondents categorically stated that all their members who had remained in their employment had continued in service without a break, further the Respondents had honoured in full the agreement between the Association and the Claimants and have continued to pay their employees in accordance with the award of the Industrial Court

After a careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence given by the various witnesses, the Court finds that the following facts are proved —

(a) From February 1970, the time when the Respondents informed the Claimants of the withdrawal of the Mercedes and Datsun agencies by D T Dobie & Co Ltd, all the workers, as is to be expected, were very worried about their future. The Respondents' Managing Director conveyed to the workers through the shopsteward, Mr Salim Ibrahim and his Workshops Manager Mr Tufail that the workers should (1) apply to D T Dobie & Co Ltd for a job, and (11) tender their resignations to him

The Court is satisfied that there was no meeting held be tween the Managing Director and the workers as such and that Mr Ibrahim, the shopsteward, was the go between" the Managing Director and the workers during all these discussions

(b) The workers time and again rejected the course sug gested by the Managing Director and insisted that they should first get a firm ofter of a job from D T Dobie & Co Ltd and then they would resign. The question of resignation assumes much importance considering that D T Dobie & Co Ltd had written to the Respondents on 18th June, 1970, as follows —

"In the event of your company wishing to release certain members of the staff for employment with D T Dobie & Co, Mombasa, the following points must be clearly under stood -

- 1 It is by now well known that we shall commence operations sometime in September
- 2 Any man desiring employment with our Organization must apply to me in writing
- 3 No such person will be employed by our Organization unless he has resigned from services with your com pany and in the proper manner
- 4 We will not engage any person without the knowledge and approval of your company
- 5 Applications should be forwarded to me with minimum delay '
- (c) The Respondents' Managing Director used his offices to secure jobs for some of his employees with D T Dobie & Co Ltd and in fact sat with two officers from D T Dobie & Co Ltd in his office when the various employees were interviewed
- (d) The Respondents' Managing Director at that stage, i.e. from June to August, was clearly trying to extricate himself from the burden of paying redundancy benefits to his employees in the very near future as at that time he was quite convinced that he would have to close down his business. The Court would not be surprised at all if in fact the real reason why he resigned from the Association was that he was under the mistaken impression that if he resigned from the Association then he would not be bound to honour the agreement between the Claimants and the Association and he would thus escape making redundancy payments to the workers workers on the other hand were also out to get what appeared to them to be the best under the cucumstances, and that was to secure jobs with a firm which was much bigger and better established than the Respondents They were only too willing to play along with the Respondents' Managing Director in this game, and once they were assured of jobs with D T Dobie & Co Ltd they had no hesitation whatsoever in tender ing their resignations. It is pertinent to note that each one of them has thought of different reason for resigning from the Respondents' employment
- (e) The Court is satisfied that the Respondents did not at any time make any promises to pay workers any benefits as otherwise one or two of them, if not all, would have made a point to mention in their letters of resignation that the Managing Director had promised to pay them their benefits despite the fact that they were resigning. The Court is not prepared to believe that the workers, particularly the shopsteward, were so innocent or ignorant as to be fooled by the Managing Director to the extent that they tendered their resignations on a merely verbal assurance from the Managing Director that they would be paid their benefits
- (f) The Court finds that the shopsteward M1 Salim Ibrahim kept in dark the Claimants' Head Office and indeed the Branch Office and did not inform them of the developments as they took place The Court must also find that the blame tor the predicament in which the workers find themselves is entirely due to the negligence of the shopsteward in not keeping the branch and national official informed of what was happening and to seek their advice

From the foregoing facts which the Court finds established, the Court must come to the conclusion, that the reason why the Claimants appeared to be shifting their stand from payment of service gratuity to payment of retirement benefits and finally to the payment of redundancy pay is entirely due to the fact that they were kept in the dark by the shopsteward as to what was happening at the relevant time. The Court appreciates the Claimants' difficult position in that they are trying to do their best for the workers who had, together with their shopsteward, decided to pursue a certain course of action entirely without the advice and co operation of the Claimants

The Court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that the workers resigned from the Respondents employment because they had better prospects before them in that most of them were offered jobs by D T Dobie & Co Ltd, and since they have resigned they are clearly not entitled to any retirement benefits which the Claimants submitted are covered in the term "service gratuity"

The Court also finds that these workers were at no time declared redundant by the Respondents although there is clear evidence showing that redundancy was looming but the workers did not wait for that time to come about for the reason which has been stated hereinbefore, i.e. that they were offered jobs by D T Dobie & Co Ltd In the event it transpired that the Respondents did not feel the need to close their business or to reduce their work force and to declare any workers redundant In these circumstances since the workers were not declared redundant they are not enutled to any redundancy pay either
