Parties —

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and

South British Insurance Co Ltd

Issue in dispute —

Wage scales as per reopener clause (Clause No IV 2 (i) of the Recognition Agreement dated 31st December, 1966)

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and South British Insurance Co Ltd, shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 4th and 5th January, 1972, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The parties entered into an agreement in matters of recognition and negotiating procedure and terms and conditions of employment covering the Respondents' employees, on 31st December, 1966 This agreement is effective from 1st January, 1967 and was to remain in force for a period of five years from that date but due to the provisions of the Tripartite Agreement it has been extended by another year with the result that it is due to expire now on 31st December, 1972 Both the parties were in agreement on this point

Clause IV (2) (i) of this agreement provides as follows —

The scales referred to in this clause may be subject to review within the currency of this Agreement in the event of there being any major variation in the Kenya Cost of Living Index in force for the time being "

The salary scales which are attached to this agreement are in respect of subordinate employees (Staff Grade and Special Grade) and clerical employees (Grades II and I and Special Grade)

The scale for subordinate staff grade has 12 points and starts at Sh 250 per month and rises by Sh 20 per month every year The scale for special grade for subordinate employees has 10 points and starts at Sh 300 per month going up by Sh 25 per month every year

The Clerical scale for Grade II has 15 points starting at Sh 460 per month and going up by Sh 40 per month every year The Grade I scale for these employees has 15 points again and starts at Sh 825 per month going up by Sh 60 per month every year

The Special Grade with six points starts at Sh 1,680 per month and goes up by Sh 84 per month every year

On 18th February, 1969, the Claimants, relying on the afore-said clause IV (2) (i) raised the question of a review of the salary scales on the ground that there had been a major variation in the Kenya Cost of Living Index A meeting was arranged to discuss this matter but because the Claimants failed to turn up it could not take place Then several letters were exchanged between the parties and the Claimants reported the existence of a dispute to the Ministry of Labour on 9th April, 1969 The dispute was accepted on 24th May, 1969

A very unfortunate feature of this dispute is that on or about the same time industrial unrest erupted between the parties because of an alleged wrongful discharge of the shopsteward Mr B P W Wepukhulu and victimization of union members This resulted in a walkout by the Claimants' members on 23rd July, 1969 This matter was however, quickly settled with a return to work formula signed on the same day

The Court is not concerned with the items in dispute which led to this short strike as the matters appear to have been settled except in so far that the severe criticism which the Claimants levelled against the Respondents regarding the poor industrial relations in their undertaking emanate from these allegations which led to the walkout

The issue before the Court was referred to conciliation and the conciliator found that there had been a major variation in the Kenya Cost of Living Index and he relied on the following figures —

The conciliator recommended that the salary scales be adjusted accordingly The Respondents however, did not accept that this constituted a major variation and refused to amend the salary scales

During the hearing the Claimants bitterly attacked the Respondents' management and accused them of practising racial discrimination in that they did not promote non Europeans to high positions and kept them on lower salary scales. They cited a few examples of what they claimed was racial discrimination in favour of European employees.

The Claimants maintained that the salary scales in force were not very satisfactory as the clerks employed by the Respondents were men who had passed School Certificate and Higher School Certificate examinations. The starting salary point of Sh 460 for them was too low.

The Claimants further submitted that the Cost of Living Index in Kenya had certainly moved upward to an extent of 3 per cent per annum and this in their view was a major variation. They asked the Court to rule in their favour. They added that the Respondents had agreed in their discussions that if a 5 per cent increase in the Cost of Living Index was proved then they would amend the scales.

The Respondents on the other hand categorically rejected the various allegations made by the Claimants and pointed out that they ranked amongst the best employers in the country as their wage scales were high, they paid regular bonuses to their employees and even paid medical expenses incurred by them. They stated that recently two Africans had been promoted to managerial positions. Moreover, merit increases had been granted to various employees.

The Respondents drew the Court's attention to the fact that although in the 1963/66 agreement between the parties there had been a similar clause and the Cost of Living Index had gone up by about 3 per cent the Claimants had not sought any variation in the scales. They maintained that any increase in the Cost of Living Index which was less than 5 per cent per annum could not be considered a major variation as the yearly increments had a built in cushion for such loss of money value.

The Respondents quoted the figures from the Cost of Living Indices compiled by the authorities in Kenya and submitted that calculations based on these figures showed that at that particular juncture there had been a decline in the annual average rate of increase (2.3 per cent, 1.5 per cent and 5 per cent) of the cost of living. The Respondents asked the Court in the first instance to hold that the Claimants' demand at that particular point in time was completely invalid and rightly rejected by them.

The Respondents reminded the Court that the scales are the same as in the 1963/66 agreement but major changes were made in the rates involved so as to invalidate any charge that they might have become outdated and unrealistic. The comparison given by the Respondents are as follows —

The Court has carefully considered the various aspects of this dispute but finds that it is inhibited from going into and making any finding on the various allegations made by the Claimants against the Respondents over alleged racial discrimination and favouritism in favour of European employees. The Court has repeatedly pointed out that it would be fatal for it to go beyond the issues in dispute and it is about time that the parties take heed of this warning and restrict themselves strictly to the issues in dispute when putting forward their respective arguments before the Court.

The Court would, however, like to draw the parties' attention to paragraph 3 of an agreement which they made at a meeting on 27th October, 1971, under the chairmanship of Hon P F Kibisu whereby both the parties undertook to set up a local consultative committee charged with the duty of holding two consultative meetings each calendar month, or at such more frequent intervals as may be necessary. This committee was intended to serve as a forum for disposing of day to day grievances that may arise at the work place. The Court would like to state that this is a step in the right direction and should lead to the establishment of harmonious industrial relations between the parties.

Now reverting to the issue in dispute the Court finds it is established that the three Cost of Living Indices in Kenya have changed as follows —

The Court also notes that in the aforesaid agreement under Mr Kibisu's chairmanship the parties agreed as follows in para (1) —

‘Both parties agree to refer the issue of wage scales to the Industrial Court for period 1969/72, bearing in mind the automatic extension of the existing agreement, by reason of wage increases having been given to employees during the Tripartite Agreement period.’

The Court is of the view that there is considerable merit in the Respondents' submission that there should be no review of the scales for the years 1969 and 1970 but is not prepared to find that there should be no review of the scales until the expiry of the relevant agreement including the extra year under the Tripartite Agreement.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that the changes in the Cost of Living Indices in Kenya warrant a review of the scales and the Court therefore directs that the parties should revise these scales to an extent of 3.5 per cent per annum with effect from 1st January, 1971.

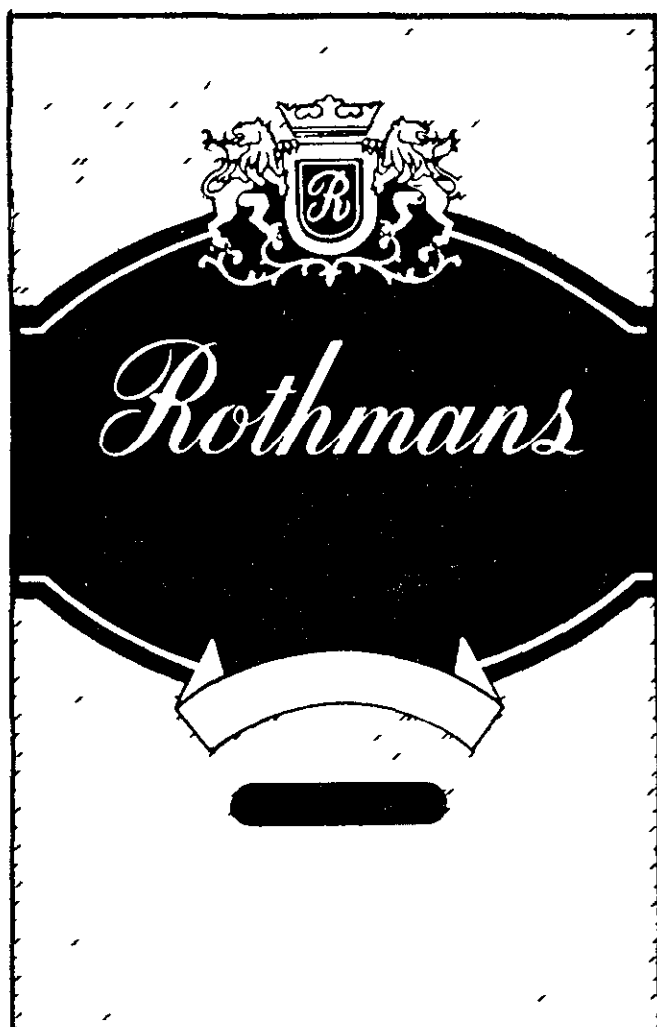

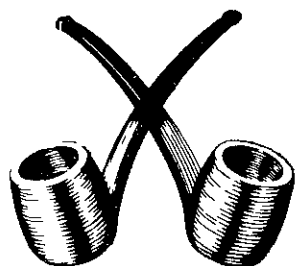
