*Senior Draughtsman (One Post) (Water Development Division), Ministry of Agriculture (No 59/72)*

*Salary scale—£1,494 to £1,866 PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT*

Applicants should be of at least School Certificate standard. They should have had an approved training in Engineering drawing, of three years' duration. They should also have had at least seven years' progressive post training experience in large engineering drawing offices, three years of which should have been at least at second in command level. Preference will be given to candidates with major water supply experience. Fluency in both written and spoken English is essential.

*Vacancies in the Ministry of Works*

*Architectural Assistant I (One Post) (No 60/72)*

*Salary scale—£1,212 to £1,614 PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT*

Applicants must possess School Certificate and the Ordinary Diploma in Building and Civil Engineering from the Kenya Polytechnic or their equivalents. In addition, they must have at least six years' practical experience in the drawing office of an Architect. They should have a comprehensive knowledge of building construction, the work of a Quantity Surveyor, Structural/Electrical Engineer and be acquainted with the practices and procedures applicable in the Building Industry. They must be able to take rough sketches and work them up to finished working drawing, and also to prepare site inspection reports.

*Executive Officer III (Statistical Assistant) (One Post) (No 61/72)*

Applicants should be of School Certificate standard of education or its equivalent, with at least three years' general clerical experience in a drawing office. They should have special aptitude for Mathematics and be able to calculate areas of buildings from drawings. A knowledge of building work and ability to read architectural drawings is essential. Duties include compilation of a Building Register, assessment of quarters for rental purposes and the preparation of statistical data in connexion with buildings.

Applicants must possess the School Certificate or its equivalent. THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of Republic of Kenya gives notice that the plots in Ruiru Township as described in the Schedules hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the individual plots

2 A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P O Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh 4 post free

3 Applications should be submitted to Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the District Commissioner, Kiambu, stating the plot required in order of preference. Applications should be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department, or District Commissioner, P O Box 32, Kiambu

4 Applications must be sent so as to reach the District Commissioner not later than noon on the 18th day of March, 1972

5 Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands

6 Applicants must enclose with their applications cash, postal order or money order for Sh 1,000 drawn on applicant's own banking account made payable to Commissioner of Lands as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows —

(a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him

(b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him

(c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

*General Conditions*

1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant

2 The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281)

3 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application

4 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant

5 Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the survey fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant (approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent). In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

*Special Conditions*

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage surface and sullage water) drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such

buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President of Republic of Kenya to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President of Republic of Kenya or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

5 The land and buildings shall only be used for —

*Schedule A*—Shops, offices and flats (excluding the sale of petrol and motor oils)

*Schedule B*—One dwelling house only. No guest house will be permitted

6 The buildings shall not cover more than 50 per centum of the area of the land or such lesser area that may be prescribed by the local authority in its By-laws

7 The grantee shall not subdivide the land

8 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed

9 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid

10 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess

11 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess

12 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon, including any contribution or other sum paid by the President of the Republic of Kenya in lieu thereof

13 The President of the Republic of Kenya or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains

14 The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the ground rental payable hereunder after the expiration of the 33rd and 66th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands

Place—Enkongo Narok Swamp Kajiado District

Purpose—A tourist lodge

Area—8 0616 hectares (approximately 19 92 acres)

Description of land—

This land is situated approximately 4 40 kilometres and lies south west of Ol Tukai Lodge. The boundaries are demarcated on the ground and are described as follows—

Starting from a point M1, which is an iron pin in concrete, from which the Air Strip (Earth), and the Ol Tukai Lodge are 6 60 kilometres and 4 40 kilometres distant, on bearings of  $354\frac{1}{2}^\circ$  and  $28^\circ$  respectively,

NAROK DISTRICT MASAI MARA GAME RESERVE—PLOT FOR  
TOURIST LODGE DEVELOPMENT

THE Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the Narok County Council gives notice that a plot of land having an area of approximately 20 acres in Narok District in that part of the Masai Mara Game Reserve shown on a plan available in the office of the Commissioner of Lands, Harambee Avenue, Nairobi, and at the office of the County Council of Narok, is available for alienation and applications are invited in terms of development and payment of percentage of gross income received for the direct grant of this plot on the conditions hereinafter specified. The site selected must be approved by the Narok County Council and the Ministry of Tourism and Wildlife

2 Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands at P O Box 30089, Nairobi, for onward transmission to the Clerk of the Narok County Council. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Commissioner of Lands not later than 28th April, 1972

3 Applicants for the site must submit details of how the lodge development would be financed accompanied by evidence of finance available. At least 51 per cent of the equity share holding of the applicant company must be held by Kenya citizens. Applicants are expected to include the Kenya Tourist Development Corporation as a substantial shareholder. Participation by Kenya Tourist Development Corporation will be counted as part of its required citizen shareholding

4 Applicants must enclose with their applications either a cheque or money order for the sum of Sh 5,000 as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows—

(a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him

(b) If the application is successful but the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands will declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

5 The successful applicant shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty. In default of payment within the specified time the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the lease of the plot

6 The lease of the lodge site will be made under the Trust Land Act (Cap 288) for a term of 33 years from the first day of the month immediately following notification of approval of the application and will contain the obligations set out hereafter

7 The rent shall be that stipulated in clauses 22 and 23 following save that it shall be open to any applicant to offer to pay a higher percentage of the gross income than 12 per cent. Any applicant must therefore state which rent he is prepared to pay if the lease is offered to him

## Lessee's Obligations

1 The lessee shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term erect approved buildings on the land in such manner as to provide total sleeping accommodation for not less than 100 tourists and 64 drivers and staff together with adequate dining facilities and ancillary accommodation therefor, with proper and sufficient drainage and water supply and electrical installation for all such development

2 The erection of the building shall not be commenced until plans (including block plans showing the position of the buildings and a system of water supply and of drainage for disposal of sewage surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications thereof have been approved in writing by the lessor and by any authority whose approval is required by law. Such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications shall be submitted for approval in duplicate. Any delay over a period of one calendar month in obtaining such written approval shall be added to the period of 24 months mentioned in clause 1 above

3 The lessee shall maintain all the buildings, the water supply, drainage system, electrical installations and interior decorations in good repair and condition to the satisfaction of the lessor and shall at the expiration or sooner determination of the term hand over the demised premises free of charge and without payment of compensation providing that the option under clause (f) of the lessor's obligations is not exercised



4 No additions shall be made to the demised premises with out the prior consent in writing of the lessor

5 The land shall be used only for the purposes of a Safari Lodge together with such ancillary purposes in connexion therewith as may previously be approved in writing by the lessor

6 The lessee shall throughout the term and to the satisfaction of the lessor manage and operate the business of a Safari Lodge in a proper and efficient manner and shall maintain a shop and petrol station at the lodge and operate or cause to be operated a car hire service for use by tourists at all times

7 The land shall not be used in any manner which the lessor considers to be dangerous or offensive to the public or the neighbourhood

8 The land shall not be subdivided

9 The land shall not be charged, sublet, subleased or transferred without the prior consent in writing of the lessor. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until clause 1 hereof has been performed

10 The lessee shall maintain and keep in good state of repair all roads within the demised premises and shall be responsible for providing and maintaining any necessary access road to the site and for all infrastructure costs in connexion with the lodge development

11 The lessee shall be responsible for the payment of all rates, taxes, charges or duties of whatever description that may be levied imposed or charged by the Government or any local government authority upon the demised premises

12 The lessee shall on receipt of a notice in writing in that behalf from the lessor adequately fence or hedge the land and shall thereafter maintain such fence or hedge to the satisfaction of the lessor

13 The lessee shall permit the lessor and its agents at all reasonable times to enter the demised premises to view the state of repair and condition of the same and on receipt of a notice in writing given by the lessor of all defects and want of repair the lessee shall within three months after such notice repair and make good the same according to the notice

14 The lessee shall use its best endeavours to ensure that tourists entering on the land comply with the regulations and by laws of the local authority for the time being in force relating to the land

15 The lessee shall comply with all laws governing hotels, licensed premises and shops and shall obtain and keep all necessary licences

16 The lessee shall insure and keep insured the demised premises to the full value thereof in some responsible insurance office to be approved in writing by the lessor against loss or damage by fire, lightning and tempest and to cause all sums received in respect of such insurance to be forthwith laid out and expended in rebuilding or otherwise reinstating the premises

17 The lessee shall be responsible for the construction and maintenance of any airstrip required in connexion with the lodge development

18 The lessee shall collect on behalf of the lessor on an agency basis to be agreed between the parties hereto Range Guides' fees

19 Except where the option under clause (f) of the lessor's obligations has been exercised to extend the term hereby granted the lessee shall at the expiration or sooner determination of the said term forthwith give the lessor the option to purchase within two months of such expiration or determination all movable property and loose assets on the land (including loose assets pertaining to the water supply and electric power installations) at the market value at that time as determined by an independent professional valuer accepted both by the lessee and the lessor. The decision of the valuer on what are "movable property and loose assets" shall be final

20 The lessee shall maintain full and accurate records of all tourists accommodated overnight at the demised premises and shall at all reasonable times permit the lessor or the lessor's authorized representatives to have access to such records

21 The lessee will as far as practicable give preference to the employment of local people resident within the area of the jurisdiction of the Council in any capacity for which they are suited in the operation of the demised premises

22 The lessee shall pay half yearly in arrears on the 1st day of December and 1st day of June a rent equivalent to 12 per cent of the gross income (as hereinafter defined) as certified by the lessee's auditors

23 As from 1st August, 1992, the rent shall be increased by adding 3 per cent to the percentage stipulated in the immediately preceding clause

24 The lessee shall not later than four months after the end of the lessee's financial year and in the year 2005 produce to the lessor audited accounts for the previous year prepared in compliance with the Companies Act (Cap 486) and including an audited statement of the number of tourists accommodated overnight at the demised premises during the year to which the accounts relate

#### *Lessor's Obligations*

(a) The lessor shall maintain the Masai Mara Game Reserve open to tourists at all times during the term hereby created except when vehicle access thereto is in immediate danger of material deterioration owing to climatic conditions

(b) The lessor shall arrange for the lessee to have the services of a minimum of 12 game scouts who shall be available for hire by tourists

(c) The lessor shall if it intends to construct or lease any further hotel or lodge or site thereof catering for the accommodation of tourists during the term of the present lease within the area shown hatched in red on Plan No 74167/20/B annexed hereto shall invite the lessee to lease such further hotel or lodge or site for such term and on such conditions as the lessor may state before offering the lease on the same terms and conditions to any other person

(d) The lessor shall give the lessee the exclusive right within a radius of one mile of the demised premises to keep such shops as may be approved by Council

(e) The lessee paying the rent hereby reserved and performing and observing the covenants, conditions, restrictions and stipulations herein contained or implied on its behalf may peaceably and quietly possess and enjoy the demised premises during the term without any interruption from the lessor or any person lawfully claiming under it

(f) If at the expiration of the term hereby granted the lessor desires to grant a new lease of the demised premises it shall offer the same to the lessee upon appropriate terms and conditions before offering a new lease to any other person upon the same terms and conditions

#### *And further provided that*

1 If the rent or any part thereof is in arrear for the space of 30 days after it has become due whether it has been formally demanded or not or if there has been any breach, non performance or non observance by the lessee of any of the conditions herein contained and on its part to be performed and observed or if the lessee goes into liquidation, whether compulsory or voluntary (not being a voluntary liquidation merely for the purpose of the reconstruction) or has a receiver of its property appointed or if any assignee of the lessee not being a company becomes bankrupt or enters into any arrangement with his creditors for the liquidation of his debts by composition or otherwise then and in every such case the lessor may at any time thereafter enter upon the demised premises or any part thereof in the name of the whole and the term hereby created shall thereupon determine but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the lessor in respect of any antecedent breach of any of the conditions by the lessee

2 Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained this lease may be determined at any time by the lessee giving to the lessor not less than 12 calendar months' notice in writing in that behalf expiring on the last day of any year, but such determination shall be without prejudice to the remedies of the lessor against the lessee in respect of any antecedent breach of the conditions of this lease

#### *3 In this lease—*

(i) 'demised premises' means the land hereinbefore described together with all the buildings, fixtures and improvements at any time thereon and all the appurtenances enjoyed therewith but shall not include any movable property or loose assets,

(ii) "land" means the same as 'demised premises',

(iii) "gross income" means the gross income obtained by the lessee from all charges in respect of meals and accommodation for visitors to the lodge but excluding any charge made for meals consumed by persons who are not accommodated at the lodge for one or more nights and any charge made by lessee for service

CAUSE No 29 OF 1971

## Parties —

Kenya Local Government Workers Union  
and  
Nairobi City Council

## Issues in dispute —

- 1 Refusal by the Nairobi City Council to pay house allowance in lieu of duty houses to shift foremen and shift foremen/fitters
- 2 Refusal by the Nairobi City Council to allocate duty houses or pay house allowance in lieu to some officers working at the Pumwani Maternity Hospital

1 The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Nairobi City Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 28th day of December, 1971, and 25th and 26th January 1972. The Claimants, in addition to their written and verbal submissions, called the following persons to give evidence on their behalf —

Charles James Ngaruiya  
Yakub Mohamed  
Waithaka Joshua Njoroge

The Respondents did not call any witnesses and relied on their written and verbal submissions only

On 25th January, 1972 the President and members of the Court visited Pumwani Maternity Hospital where they were shown around the living quarters for the hospital staff by Dr Mathai, the Superintendent of the Hospital. The parties representatives were also present during the visit

## AWARD

3 The Claimants have based this dispute on the Industrial Court award in Cause No 40/69 between the same parties and their agreement on Terms and Conditions of Service in the Salaried Grades effective from 1st January, 1970

The Industrial Court in Cause No 40/69 had ruled that the past practice of providing free duty houses to certain officers should continue. The Respondents in that dispute had made an attempt to get an award from the Court to the effect that the provision of free duty houses should be discontinued. In the written submissions to that dispute the Claimants had included 'Shift Foremen Fitters' amongst the list of officers entitled to free duty houses. It should, however, be noted that the question of which officers were entitled to free duty houses was not gone into at that time

The Court made the following award —

"The Court awards that the old practice of providing a free duty house should continue. The Court feels that the least the Respondents can do for officers who have to be on duty, in many cases in most unpleasant surroundings and circumstances, is to provide them with free houses if they want them to live there. The Court would like to make it clear that its award is not to be taken beyond this special item as had there not been special circumstances to warrant it the Court would not have made its award"

In the aforesaid Terms and Conditions of Service for employees in the Salaried Grades, clause 40 reads —

'The provision of a free duty house will continue in respect of those posts where a duty house is provided (See lists of posts named in Appendix A)

Appendix A' referred to in clause 40 is in three parts (a), (b) and (c). Para (a) lists by name the posts which carry free unfurnished quarters or where quarters are not available, duty house allowance in lieu thereof. Paras (b) and (c) are as follows —

- (b) "Duty house allowance if granted where free quarters are not available shall be related to the rental value of the house which the officer would normally occupy were he to be accommodated on a Council housing estate
- (c) Staff employed at the Maternity Hospital other than

## Issue 1

It is pertinent that in para (a) the posts of Shift Foremen Fitters are not mentioned. The Claimants stated that this list was compiled by the Respondents as part of "management prerogative" and maintained that these posts were omitted by the Respondents though in the past these officers were entitled to free duty houses. The Respondents, however, denied this and submitted that these officers were never entitled to free duty houses

The background to this dispute subsequent to 1st January 1970 (the effective date of the Terms and Conditions of Service) is most illuminating

In February, 1971 the Respondents allocated these officers free duty houses at Juja Road where ten new houses had been constructed. The houses were ready in December, 1970, but the Shift Foremen Fitters refused to occupy these houses on a rental basis and asked through the Claimants that these houses be allocated to them as duty houses. The Respondents rejected this demand on the ground that they were not listed in Appendix "A" referred to in the aforesaid clause 40 in Terms and Conditions of Service

The Claimants then successfully negotiated the inclusion in Appendix A of these posts sometime in the middle of February, 1971. The relevant part of the minutes of the meeting of Water and Sewage Committee reads as follows —

"The Town Clerk told the Committee that at a meeting held on the 4th February 1971 between himself and the representatives of the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union, the Shift Foremen's request for free housing was agreed upon subject to the approval of the Committee No 1. He informed the Committee that approval of the Committee No 1 to the effect that the post of Shift Foreman Fitter be included in Appendix A of the terms and conditions of service for employees in the salaried grades had since been received and accordingly they were now entitled to free duty housing"

Having secured the above benefit the Claimants put forward a claim in respect of arrears for house allowance in lieu of free duty houses for these officers with effect from 1st January 1970 to 20th March 1971 the date when they occupied the said houses

The Court notes that it is clearly stated in the above extract that these officers were now entitled to free duty housing. There is no mention of any retrospective date from which these officers were to be considered entitled to a free duty house or house allowance in lieu thereof. Further from the correspondence exchanged between the Claimants, the Acting Town Clerk and the Association of Local Government Employers, it is clear that although the Claimants sought the payment of arrears of rent with effect from 1st January 1970, they succeeded only in getting free duty house allocated to them with effect from 20th March 1971. There is no mention of any approval back to January 1970

The crux of the matter however is to determine whether or not Shift Foremen Fitters were entitled to free duty houses prior to the Industrial Court award in Cause No 40/69

It is established that these officers were allocated free duty houses at Juja Road in March 1971, but there is a great doubt if in fact these officers were enjoying free duty houses prior to 1st January 1970 or in terms of the Claimants submission as far back as 1963

The Claimants called three witnesses on this issue to substantiate and establish their claim that Shift Foremen Fitters were entitled to free duty houses before 1970. The Court has very carefully considered their evidence and the documentary evidence in rebuttal produced by the Respondents. The Respondents have candidly admitted that the three witnesses called by the Claimants had been allocated free duty house but stressed that they were the only officers who, due to very special circumstances enjoyed free duty houses and that no other Shift Foreman Fitter was ever allocated a free duty house

These special circumstances are that there were two houses built at Sewage Works which were given to two expatriate officers in charge of the sewage station. They were not scheduled as duty houses and the Housing Department kept no record of them. They were left under the control of the City

The Respondents written submission on the evidence of the three witnesses is as follows —

4 Hence witness No 2 Mohamed Yakub was given one of these houses in 1962 when he was entitled as an expatriate to a free house as he was on non established terms—when he became a citizen in 1964—he should have been put on established staff and charged rent. This was not done as in the Personnel Records he was not shown as having a free house. The witness admitted he received the house as an expatriate and he also stated that when he moved to his own house in January, 1969, he did not claim a housing allowance as he obviously knew he was not entitled to it.

5 When Mr Yakub left his house in the Sewage Works the City Engineer or his Assistant gave the house to Mr Charles Ngaruiya the first witness. In doing so he made no report to anyone and the Establishment Officer continued to deduct rent for the house he rented from the Council Block D2 Door 1988.

6 If the matter had been reported the witness would have been required to pay rent and he would also have lost the use of the Council house which was sub letting against Council's regulations.

7 This witness has no claim is entirely wrongly he was enjoying a Council house without paying any rent.

8 With regard to the third witness he was originally in the Manual Workers scale and entitled to a free house or house allowance. In 1963 he was promoted to the salaried grades but did not pay rent so on 10th November, 1965, he was required by the City Treasurer on request of the Auditor to pay back to the Council Sh 1 463 for rent which he should have paid. The City Engineer then obviously was sorry for him and when an expatriate left the other house which was under the direct control of the Engineer he gave the house to Joshua Njoroge without reporting to Establishment as he should have done.

9 This witness is not a Shift Foreman Fitter but is a Labour Foreman, he should therefore be paying rent and will be required to do so in the future."

The Court is satisfied, after carefully weighing all the circumstances and the evidence of the witnesses that out of some eight officers concerned only three because of the aforesaid irregularity lived in the two free duty houses. The fact that free duty houses were allocated as a general rule to Shift Foremen Fitters prior to 20th March 1971 is not proved. The Court is not prepared to extend a benefit enjoyed by one or two officers through an irregularity to the other six officers thus committing the Respondents to an additional expenditure of about £2 200 which they would have to incur in paying arrears of rent if the Claimants' submission had been upheld.

The Court has satisfied itself after perusal of Pay Records that Shift Foremen Fitters (with the above exceptions) were all paying rent to the Council and are therefore in accordance with the award of the Court, not entitled to a duty house as at January, 1970 as at the relevant time they were not housed in a duty house but were in fact paying rent.

The Court has given due consideration to the decision of the Staff Committee taken at the meeting on 16th July 1971 to the effect that authority be given to pay arrears of house allowance in lieu of free duty houses to the Shift Foremen Fitters working at Council's Sewage Disposal Works with effect from 1st January 1970 to the time they occupied the free duty houses at Juja Road. The Court finds that this decision of the Staff Committee was not confirmed by the Finance Committee at its meeting on 22nd September 1971 in fact it was deferred pending the decision of the Industrial Court.

Further the Court finds that Shift Foremen Fitters were not included in Appendix "A" referred to in clause 40 of the Terms and Conditions of Service because they were not included in a similar list which was valid prior to 1st January 1970. In these circumstances the Court must reject the Claimants' demand. But the Court rules that the two officers who are at present enjoying free duty houses due to the aforesaid irregularity to which the Respondents are very much a party, should continue to enjoy the same and they should not be penalized either financially or otherwise in respect thereof. This is the least which the Respondents can do to cover their own slack and rather negligent management in this regard. The Court further directs that the third witness, Mr W J Njoroge, although not a Shift Foreman Fitter should continue to occupy the accommodation which he occupies now without the payment of any rent until such time as he vacates it himself or is required on genuine grounds to move elsewhere.

## Issue II

Appendix A (c) is quite clearly worded in that staff employed at the Maternity Hospital other than administrative and clerical staff shall be entitled to free furnished quarters.

The Claimants' demand is that the following officers should be paid their house allowance entitlement because the Respondents have failed to provide them with free furnished quarters —

- 17 Ward orderlies
- 2 Cateresses (one housed since the dispute was registered with the Industrial Court)
- 1 Chef
- 16 Sisters (three have since resigned)

- 41 Staff nurses
- 2 Anaesthetists (now housed in unfurnished quarters)
- 2 X-Ray staff
- 1 Health visitor
- 1 Domestic bursar

The Respondents on the other hand maintain that the only staff needed to be housed in or near the hospital grounds are those whose services are required outside the normal working hours and those who could be urgently called upon to assist during emergencies. They maintained that such employees are as follows —

- 1 Doctors
- 2 Matron
- 3 Assistant Matron
- 4 Home Sister
- 5 Anaesthetist
- 6 Assistant Anaesthetist
- 7 Radiographer
- 8 Laboratory Technician
- 9 Laboratory Assistant
- 10 Nursing Sisters

The Respondents further submitted that the non-essential employees who are now housed by them within the hospital grounds are there for their own convenience and therefore must comply with the conditions imposed by the Respondents. One of these conditions being that they must not live in the accommodation provided for them within the hospital compound with their families or dependants. The Respondents asked the Court to give a similar ruling as it gave in Industrial Court Cause No 18/71 at the Nairobi Hospital.

The Court has carefully considered the submissions and finds that the wording of para (c) of Appendix "A" leaves no doubt that all staff other than administrative and clerical staff are entitled to free furnished quarters. In view of this the Respondents are totally wrong to draw a further distinction between essential and non-essential staff in providing them with free furnished quarters. There is also no question of some members of staff staying at the hospital for their convenience. If they are administrative and clerical staff then they have no business to be there and if they are not then they are entitled to free furnished quarters, and if the quarters are not available then they are entitled to house allowance in lieu thereof.

The Court is of the view that in the case of married female staff it would not be appropriate for them to be housed in free furnished quarters with their husbands and families. The reason being that it is not desirable to have a large number of men who are not working at the hospital and children in the hospital grounds and further because the husbands of married female employees shoulder the responsibility of providing a house for their families. It would be contrary to international practice to allow married female employees to live in free furnished quarters with their husbands and children.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court rules that para (c) of Appendix "A" should be implemented as follows —

### (i) Male staff

That all male members of staff entitled to free furnished quarters should be provided with them or appropriate house allowance in lieu thereof with effect from 1st January, 1970.

### (ii) Unmarried female staff

That all unmarried female staff entitled to free furnished quarters should be provided with such accommodation and their children if any, not exceeding two, should be allowed to live with them. If necessary accommodation is not available they should be given house allowance in lieu thereof.

### (iii) Married female staff

That all married female staff entitled to free furnished quarters should be provided with such accommodation if they are prepared to come and live there without their husbands and families and if they are prepared to come and live alone and there is no accommodation available then they should be paid house allowance in lieu thereof from the date such married female employees signify their intention to come and live alone.

### (iv) Additional special provisions for married female staff

If a married employee's husband is out of work or under such other extreme case of hardship—

- (a) the employee should be allowed to have her children, again not more than two, to reside with her in the free furnished quarters or alternatively—
- (b) if accommodation is available in furnished quarters for male married employees then in such extreme case of hardship she should be allowed to live in that accommodation with her husband and children until such time as the hardship ceases but not exceeding six months or alternatively—
- (c) if no accommodation is available in furnished quarters for male married employees then in the case of (b) above, she should be paid house allowance for such period again not exceeding six months.
