(b) If the application is successful but the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the Commissioner of Lands will declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

5 The successful applicant shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved the fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty. In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the lease of the plot.

6 The lease of the lodge site will be made under the Trust Land Act (Cap 288) for a term of 33 years from the first day of the month immediately following notification of approval of the application and will contain the obligations set out hereafter.

7 The rent shall be that stipulated in clauses 22 and 23 following save that it shall be open to any applicant to offer to pay a higher percentage of the gross income than 12 per cent. Any applicant must therefore state which rent he is prepared to pay if the lease is offered to him.

Lessee's Obligations

1 The lessee shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term erect approved buildings on the land in such manner as to provide total sleeping accommodation for not less than 100 tourists and 64 drivers and staff together with adequate dining facilities and ancillary accommodation therefor, with proper and sufficient drainage and water supply and electrical installation for all such development.

17 The lessee shall be responsible for the construction and maintenance of any airstrip required in connexion with the lodge development.

18 The lessee shall collect on behalf of the lessor on an agency basis to be agreed between the parties hereto Range Guides' fees.

19 Except where the option under clause (f) of the lessor's obligations has been exercised to extend the term hereby granted the lessee shall at the expiration or sooner determination of the said term forthwith give the lessor the option to purchase within two months of such expiration or determination all movable property and loose assets on the land (including loose assets pertaining to the water supply and electric power installations) at the market value at that time as determined by an independent professional valuer accepted both by the lessee and the lessor. AWARD

Dismissal of Kitur arap Bune

3 Kitur arap Bune was suspended from his duties on 9th September, 1971, vide a letter written by the Warden Nairobi National Parks on 10th September 1971 This letter read as follows —

“In view of you being charged in Court for drunkenness while on guard duty, and in charge of rifle, and for threatening prominent Government official on gun point Because of the seriousness of the nature of the case I am advised to suspend you officially from your duties as from 9th September 1971 The suspension will be in force until, and when the case is finalized

On or about 9th September arap Bune was charged under the following two counts in the Resident Magistrate's Court at Nairobi —

Count I

Carrying firearm while drunk contrary to section 33 of the Firearms Act (Cap 114 Laws of Kenya)

Kitur arap Bune On the 7th day of September 1971, at about 7 p.m. at Nairobi National Park main gate, in Nairobi in the Nairobi area was found carrying a 303 rifle loaded with eight rounds of ammunition while drunk

Count II

Being drunk and disorderly in a public place contrary to section 28 of the African Liquor Act (Cap 122 Laws of Kenya)

Kitur arap Bune On the 7th day of September, 1971, at about 7 p.m. at Nairobi National Park, main gate, in Nairobi in the Nairobi area was found being drunk and disorderly in a public place

He pleaded not guilty to both the counts and the case was put down for hearing on 2nd October 1971. Subsequently the prosecutor applied for the case to be withdrawn under section 87 (a) of the Criminal Procedure Code (hereinafter referred to as C.P.C.) but the Magistrate allowed the case to be withdrawn under section 204 of the C.P.C.

Subsequently as a result of departmental action arap Bune was dismissed instantly but without loss of any benefits. He was paid a sum of Sh 1,600.

The Claimants acting on his behalf have challenged his dismissal and are seeking his reinstatement without loss of any salary and a sum of Sh 6,000 by way of compensation for all the mental pain, etc. caused by the Respondents to him. They maintained that his dismissal was not in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of Service applicable to him in that he should have been given three letters of warning before dismissal action was taken. Further, since the dismissal is an administrative action, principles of natural justice should be strictly adhered to. This was not done in this case as the Director of the Kenya National Parks acted as a prosecutor and a judge at the same time because he was directly involved in the whole affair in that the cause of the incident was a Permanent Secretary who happens to be the Director's personal friend. The Director's actions therefore could not be deemed to be impartial.

Finally they submitted that since arap Bune was acquitted by a Court of Law it should be taken as proved that he was not guilty of the offences for which he was charged.

The Respondents on the other hand strongly submitted that arap Bune had been dismissed for gross misconduct as he had acted in a manner dangerous to the public. They submitted that he was not acquitted but the Court allowed their application to withdraw the case as they decided to deal with the matter departmentally.

They also referred the Court to a previous warning which had been given to arap Bune in November, 1969, when as a result of an incident involving an Assistant Game Warden and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees he was demoted from the rank of Corporal to that of Private.

The facts on which there is no dispute in the incident which led to arap Bune's dismissal are that on 7th September 1971 at about 7 p.m. he was on duty at the main gate of the Nairobi National Park with another ranger namely Kipkoech arap Bet. He was armed with a loaded rifle.

A few cars were coming out of the exit gate of the park as it was closing time and the entry gate was closed. It was not completely dark. A car approached the gate and it was challenged by arap Bune to stop. At some stage at that time arap Bune had brought the gun to a firing position pointing it towards the car. There was some shouting and after an Assistant Game Warden Education had identified the visitor he was allowed to proceed into the National Park to Mr. Olindo, the Director's house. After about ten minutes the Director and the visitor came back to the gate. arap Bune was disarmed, the police were called to the scene, a police inspector came in a 999 car, emptied the loaded gun, talked to arap Bune and took him in custody and drove off. Mr. Olindo asked the police inspector to get arap Bune medically examined.

arap Bune in his evidence denied that he was drunk and said that he brought the gun to a firing position because the approaching car failed to stop when he ordered it to do so. When the car had proceeded to some towards him he had to take the necessary action to be on the alert in case there were undesirable characters in the car. He denied that he had behaved abnormally and maintained that he had done nothing more than his duty.

The three witnesses called by the Respondents on the incident said that arap Bune was excited, that he was shouting and that when he pointed the gun at the visiting car he swayed from side to side. They also said that at one stage he said to the visitor, "You will eat a bullet and that you will get a bullet". One of the witnesses said that arap Bune kept on murmuring that the man should have stopped when he had told him to stop. They denied that Mr. Olindo snatched the gun from him but said that after Mr. Olindo had talked to him quietly he gave the gun to him after some hesitation.

The evidence of all the witnesses taken together shows a few discrepancies which, however, do not materially alter the picture very much. But on the whole, the evidence is not of such a nature as to convince the Court absolutely that arap Bune was drunk to such an extent as not to know what he was doing. It is possible that he had taken a drink or two before coming on duty and that during the incident he was excited and slightly aggressive. But he certainly seemed to be aware of what he was doing.

The Court however, is very much influenced by the fact that no evidence of a medical examination of arap Bune on the night of 7th September was produced. In fact the Court was told that no medical examination was carried out. This is all very strange because Mr. Olindo made a clear request to the police inspector to get arap Bune examined by a doctor. Further the police inspector was not called to give evidence and the Court was told that he was not called because the police might decide to reinstitute the proceedings against arap Bune and his evidence in this Court might prejudice the criminal proceedings. The Court must however point out that in the certified copy of the criminal court proceedings it is clearly recorded that the Magistrate allowed the case to be withdrawn under section 204 C.P.C. under which section such withdrawal amounts to an acquittal. There is therefore no question of arap Bune being charged again for the same offences.

One other point which the Court finds of great importance is that no guidelines or instructions, either written or verbal, are issued to rangers in possession of loaded guns as to the circumstances under which how and to what extent they can use their discretion, admittedly for defensive purposes, in using their firearms. In the absence of any such instructions if a ranger uses his discretion under certain circumstances which he thought warranted the pointing of a firearm at a car or at a certain person he can hardly be blamed for doing that. It is unfair to give the person a certain discretion and at the same time when he uses it to penalize him for doing that. The Court hopes that the National Parks authorities will do the needful in this regard.

In view of the above factors the Court has come to the conclusion that arap Bune's dismissal under the circumstances was not warranted and the Court finds that he has been wrongfully dismissed. Having come to this conclusion the Court has to decide whether or not he should get his job back. After a careful consideration of all the circumstances and the length of arap Bune's service which the Court was told was 14 years the Court has come to the conclusion that in the best interest of both the parties it would not be advisable to award his reinstatement. Instead, the Court has decided that arap Bune should be given compensation for the wrongful termination of his services and the Court awards that he should be given six months' salary by way of such compensation. This is to be in addition to the sum of Sh 1,600 which he has already been paid.

Dismissal of Kipkoech arap Bet and Edward K. Muthuka

The Claimants have accepted in full the facts as laid down in the Respondents' submission leading to the dismissal of both these persons. These facts are as follows —

Kipkoech arap Bet

Kipkoech arap Bet was employed by the Kenya National Parks as a Gate Ranger at Nairobi National Park. Early in September 1971 while on night duty and in charge of a firearm Ranger arap Bet left his rifle unattended in an unsafe place, thus contravening the Firearms Regulations. This was the time as in the case of Ranger Kitur arap Bune (above) when there were almost daily armed robberies in the country.

Another offence committed by Ranger arap Bet was that on the same night he left his place of work without permission and while under the influence of alcohol and without a valid driving licence took and drove the Parks' Land-Rover through the Park. He was apprehended by the Park Assistant, Mr. Kipkiech arap Marasin as witnessed by another Gate Ranger, Mr. Abdi Gedi.

The Management viewed these offences by Ranger arap Bet with serious concern and found it not only necessary but also desirable—in the interest of the smooth running of the Park—to relieve him of his duties. He was dismissed but awarded full benefits.

Edward K Muthuka

While in the service of the Kenya National Parks and employed at Tsavo National Park (East), M Muthuka was arrested on 20th July 1971, and detained in Police custody at Voi, in Taita District. He was later charged with being in possession of Cannabis Sativa Bhang contrary to section 10 (e) as read with section 18 (2) (b) of the Dangerous Drugs Act (Cap 245 Laws of Kenya).

He was convicted of the offence preferred against him but was discharged under section 35 (i) of the Penal Code by the District Magistrate Class II, Voi, on 30th August, 1971, after having been in custody for a period of 40 days, which the Magistrate deemed to be sufficient punishment for the offence.

We as the Management believe, therefore that under clause 3 (j) of the Memorandum of Agreement (Termination of Employment) mutually agreed between the Kenya Union of National Parks Employees and Kenya National Parks, we acted within our right and beg to submit that with the evidence available, this person was correctly dismissed. Otherwise he would have been a detrimental influence to the rest of our staff in the park."

It is obvious that the offences committed by them are serious indeed. The Claimants, however, have made a very strong plea to the Court to exercise leniency in their favour and to give them another chance by ordering their reinstatement. The Claimants stressed that because arap Bet had fully apologized for his mistakes the Respondents should have accepted his apology and given him back his job.

In the case of E K Muthuka they submitted that the offence for which he had been charged and convicted was committed at a time when he was off duty, as such what he did in his own free time was no concern of the Management, it was more a question of an individual's private life and morals.

The Court notes that although the Claimants had in their written submission alleged that the dismissal of both these persons was improper and unfair they appear to have abandoned this ground during the hearing. In any case the Court is satisfied that their dismissal was not wrongful.

In view of this the Court is merely concerned with the question of whether it should give them another chance and order their reinstatement in view of the strong plea of mitigation which has been put forward by the Claimants on their behalf.

The Court has given very careful consideration to this matter and has come to the conclusion that the provisions of section 9A (1) of the Trade Disputes Act as amended preclude the Court from ordering reinstatement or compensation in such cases. The section clearly states that in any case where the Industrial Court determines that an employee has been wrongfully dismissed by his employer the Court may order the employer to reinstate that employee in his former employment, and the Court may in addition to or instead of making an order for reinstatement, award compensation to the employee.

In view of the fact that the Court has ruled that their dismissal was not wrongful the Court must reject the Claimants' plea on their behalf for their reinstatement or award of any compensation to them.

The period for lodging notice of opposition may be extended by the Registrar as he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct. Any request for such extension should be made to the Registrar so as to reach him before the expiry of the period allowed.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the applicant for registration so as to afford him any opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the notice of opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

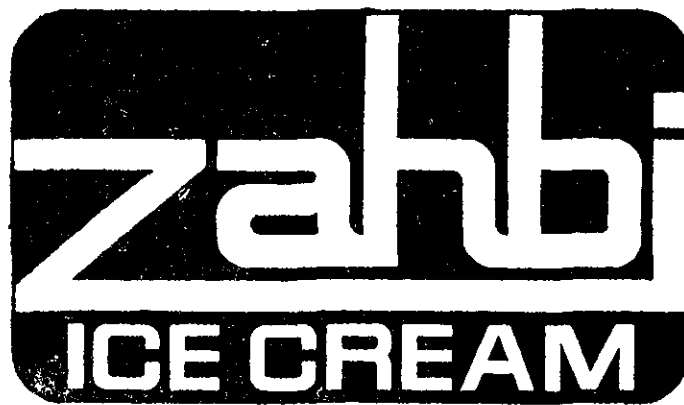
