3 As a result of an Industrial Court award in Cause No 31 of 1968 between these parties, they entered into a collective agreement effective from 1st September, 1968 and expiring on 31st December, 1970 The expiry date, however, was extended by one year by the Tripartite Agreement

On 18th February, 1970, both parties met and agreed that they would review both grading and salary structure of all Union-represented posts. It was further agreed that the first step would be to review job specifications of all union represented posts after which job evaluation and salary structure was to be discussed and agreed. A job specification exercise was commenced then but could not be completed until 8th October, 1970. The Court notes that both the parties have blamed each other for this delay but this point is immaterial at this stage. After the completion of the job specification exercise a series of meetings took place between the parties which tidied up this exercise completely.

Thereafter on 18th January 1971, the Claimants put forward a request in writing for a grading committee meeting to discuss job evaluation and salary grading structure and based their proposals on 25 salary/wage grades. Eventually, however, the Claimants agreed to a grading exercise being undertaken and completed under an independent chairman. During this time the Claimants reported a dispute to the Ministry of Labour and on 31st March it was agreed at the Ministry that grading and salary/wages should be dealt with separately

The grading exercise was completed on 29th July and the consultants' report submitted to both parties. The Respondents accepted the report in toto and the Claimants accepted it with some reservations on 13th August. On 27th August. 1971, the parties agreed that the old 13 grades should be incorporated into eight new grades. The Respondents then started working on a salary structure based on the eight new grades. The

Claimants were exerting pressure on the Respondents to start negotiations on salary structure and salary scales immediately and issued a strike threat on 4th November, 1971, which they withdrew on 17th November and negotiations commenced between the parties

Agreement was reached on five minor issues and the remaining items were referred to the Joint Industrial Council and the first meeting took place on 29th November Thereafter continuous meetings took place until 9th December and the Court notes that these meetings were held in a tense atmosphere and wild allegations were bandied about by the Claimants After further two meetings on 22nd and 29th December the Claimants reported the existence of a dispute to the Ministry on 31 items but the dispute was accepted on 29 only Through the assistance of a conciliator appointed by the Ministry, the items in dispute were reduced from 29 to 11. The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 11th February 1972 referring the dispute to the Industrial Court

In this dispute the Court is confronted with two voluminous submissions in which are incorporated very detailed submissions by the parties including their respective proposals on salary structure and salary scales (increased pay for Union-represented employees). A comparison of the two salary structures and scales clearly reveals that the difference between the parties on this very vital issue was enormous. The Claimants' proposals range from a minimum of £227 p a for Grade A to a maximum of £1,256 in Grade H. They have worked out their salary structure mostly on ten segments in each grade. The Respondents on the other hand start their Grade A with £180 with a maximum of £1,065 p a in Grade H.

The Court finds that the Claimants' arguments seeking big increase in salary and fringe benefits are understandable and motivated by their desire to better the lot of their members. The Court has also taken into consideration the various comparable rates which the Claimants put forward in support of their demands. The Court must, however, at the same time keep very much in mind the fact that the Respondents, by nature of their undertaking are required to invest in uneconomic projects. This is essential in the interest of nation building, therefore any award that the Court makes must take into account this fact so that the Respondents are able to continue developing as determined by the requirements of the nation

The Respondents have in their employment 2472 workers including the 226 additional staff under the Tripartite Agreement. The Claimants were quick to point out that the Respondents had in fact fallen short of their employment target as projected in the National Power Development Plan. The Court has noted that in 1971 the Respondents' monthly average wage bill was £53,700 an increase of £9,400, or £112,800 p a and that the Respondents final offer as reflected in their salary structures and scales is an increase of 64 per cent. As against this the Claimants' proposals are based on a 16 per cent increase which they claimed was at par with the increases which had been granted by the Respondents to their management staff

One other very important item in dispute is housing and housing allowance, and it was not disputed that all salaries paid by the Respondents are consolidated and employees make their own housing arrangements. Although the Respondents made houses available to their employees who are required for operational reasons to be available near their place of work, such employees pay subsidized rents

The Claimants pointed out that an element of Sh 35 pm by way of housing allowance was consolidated in salary/wage structure of the employees in Groups 1 and 2 at the Respondents' request in Cause No 11 of 1965. They alleged that the Respondents had devised a method whereby they were recovering more than Sh 35 pm from their employees. They strongly challenged the Respondents contention that housing had been consolidated for all groups.

The Court has given considerable attention to this issue which is causing a lot of discontent among the workers in Kenya just now but has come to the conclusion that during these negotiations the system of consolidated wage should continue and the Court has taken into consideration in working out the new salary structure and scales this important point of rent growth in the country over the last few years

After a careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties in respect of each issue in dispute, the Court makes the following award —

- 1 To devise salary structure of the Union-represented employees
- 2 Increased pay for Union-represented employees

The Court awards the following salary structure and salary scale —

It is, however, agreed that where an employee acts in a higher post for a period of more than one month and provided that he meets the job specification or has the ability or practical experience for the post, and is carrying the full responsibility of the post, he shall be entitled, after such period of one month, to receive acting allowance equivalent to the difference between his existing salary/wage and the bottom step of the negotiated rate/scale for the higher post
