AWARD

3 Mr J W Karinga's services were terminated by the Respondents on 17th April, 1971, vide the following letter —

We refer to your conversation with the undersigned of today's date and advise that your services with this Bank are terminated with immediate effect under section 4 (d) of the Collective Agreement

You will be paid one month's salary in lieu of notice together with any pio inta local leave and leave allowance entitlement

For your records, we enclose a certificate of service,

The Claimants took up the matter on his behalf and as a result an investigation was carried out by Mi A S Andele who was appointed by the Ministry of Labour On 29th October, 1971, after the investigation was completed the Permanent Secretary forwarded the following Findings and Recommendations' to the parties —

Mr Karinga had a clean record during his eight and a half years' service with the Baiclays Bank. The Bank had taken trouble to send him on a course overseas. The action taken against Mr Karinga, i.e. demotion, suspension of his signature and eventual termination of his services would appear to be rather excessive. I recommend that Mr Karinga be reinstated as a supervisor

Finally I appeal to both parties to accept the above recommendations as a basis for the settlement of the reported trade dispute"

The Claimants accepted this recommendation but the Respondents stated that the recommendation could not be considered either desirable or necessary and no proposals had been formulated upon which a settlement could be negotiated between them and the Claimants

Subsequently there were further discussions under the auspices of the Ministry of Labour and as a result the Permanent Secretary advised the Claimants on 10th December, 1971 that they should accept the Respondents offer that Mr Karinga would be taken back as a clerk at Sh 1,343 pm—only Sh 83 less than his salary when his services were terminated—further that his services would continue unbroken

The Claimants objected to this and expressed their desire to have the dispute settled by the Industrial Court. After further correspondence the parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form 'A" on 21st February 1972, and the necessary certificates were signed by the Labour Commissioner and the Minister for Labour on 22nd February, 1972

It is not disputed that Mr Kaiinga had over eight years' service with the Respondents and that he was a Section Head with "B" signing powers and that at the material time he was working at the Nyeri Branch During his service he had over-drawn his account on several occasions and although he was reprimanded for these lapses no written warning was issued. On one occasion on the day prior to his departure for UK he used the Respondents vehicle for going to Thomson's Falls whereas he had told the Manager Nyeri Branch, that he was going to a place which would involve a return journey of 56 miles only. During this trip the vehicle was also slightly damaged. Mr Karinga subsequently paid for the petrol but did not pay for the damage. Again no written warning was issued. All the relevant details of these incidents appear at length in the Respondents submission.

On 4th December, 1970, Mr Karinga typed, signed and gave the following letter to one Mr T T Chege who had a savings account with the Respondents at their Nyeri Branch—

"Mr Timothy Thiongo Chege is our customer and we recommend him for Sh 10 000 if considered for allocation of a plot in Nyeri Township

We hope you will consider him suitable for one in Nyeri Township" It is this letter coupled with Mr Karinga's background in the service with the Bank that caused his demotion from Section Head with 'B' signing powers to a clerk and on his refusal to accept demotion to termination of his employment

On 5th March, 1971, the Manager, Nyerr Branch, received the following letter concerning Mr Karinga and was asked to advise Mr Karinga of the contents—

"We acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 231d February, 1971, and as a result of Mi Karinga's behaviour his signature is to be suspended with immediate effect. His emoluments will now be paid at the rate of Sh. 13,428 p. a that is he will revert to the appropriate notch on the clerical scale.

In advising Mr Karinga of our decision, you may tell him that by attempting to commit the Bank without authority, he has abused his position and has shown that he does not have sufficient sense of responsibility to be accorded signing powers. An offence of this nature is in fact serious enough to have caused his dismissal from the Bank but we are prepared to restrict disciplinary action to demotion

We shall be giving consideration to transferring him to another Branch to avoid any embarrassment in your Branch but we shall delay this in the meantime as it is possible that Mr Karinga may resign from the Bank in which case he would raise no objection

Please convey the contents of this letter to Mr Karinga in writing and let us have an acknowledged copy for his file'

Shortly after Mi Karinga was informed of the above he stopped coming to work and was absent for nearly 21 days. On 10th March he wrote a letter to the Local Director on the subject of his demotion and gave a detailed explanation of the circumstances under which the aforesaid letter was given to Mr Chege by him

There is no doubt that Mr Karinga's demotion to a clerk was because of this letter he had issued to Mr Chege, and that this led to his subsequent dismissal. In fact the Respondents Staff Manager in the above quoted letter to the Manager, Nyeri Branch, anticipated Mi Karinga's resignation. It turned out that Mr Karinga did not resign but defended his action and challenged his demotion most vigorously. In addition to approaching the Claimants he made representations at several other places pleading that a great injustice had been done to him

Now reverting to the immediate background of this dispute the Court finds that Mr Child's (the former Manager of Nyerr Branch) assessment of Mi Karinga's ability workwise and his weaknesses to be a fair one. He set out his views in his report on Mr Karinga dated 21st April 1970, which appears as Appendix E in the Respondents submission After Mr Child left the Nyeri Branch, Mr Kabii took over and quite frankly admitted in his evidence that the Bank customers thought that Mi Kaiinga was the Assistant Manager He added that although he transferred Mr Karinga to Savings Section he still continued to deal with matters of loans and advances to customers The Court has formed the opinion that Mr Kabii did not like this particularly not only because Mr Kaiinga's efficiency in his own section was suffering, but also because he felt that his position as a Managei was being undermined Mi Kabu's feelings in this matter have an important bearing on this dispute as will become evident later on

Sometimes in August, 1970 Mi T T Chege approached the Bank for a loan which he needed to acquire a plot in Nyeri Township and as he had a savings account he mentioned it to Mr Karinga who was in charge of that section. He was directed to Mr Kabii s office and was told by him to approach the Bank when applications for the plots are invited and his request would be looked into. In November Mr Chege came back for the loan but found that Mr Kabii was on leave and there was a European Acting Manager, Mr Barnes, in his place. He discussed the matter with Mr Barnes who told him that a loan of Sh 30,000 was out of question but on Mr Chege producing a satisfactory security a loan of Sh 7000 would be approved.

On or about the end of November Mr Chege brought the title deeds of a piece of land belonging to him by way of security and handed them over to Mr Baines All the necessary charge papers were prepaied and signed by Mr Chege and Mr Baines The necessary application for the consent of the Land Control Board was also prepared and signed Mr Chege said in his evidence that all the papers were retained by the Bank

On 4th December the Plot Allocation Committee was to meet and Mr Chege was to appear before it in support of his application for a plot. He came to the Bank and saw Mr Karinga and asked for a letter of recommendation from the Bank. This letter which has been referred to above, was typed and signed by Mr Karinga and handed to Mr Chege who presented it to the Plot Allocation Committee. He handed this letter to the District Commissioner, Nyeri who was on his Committee and on 5th December the District Commissioner came to the Bank and saw the Manager about it. On that day Mr Bennett, the Local Director of the Respondents, was visiting the Nyeri Branch and was in the Manager's office when

the District Commissioner came in and inquired about the genuineness of the letter which had been signed by Mr Karinga on behalf of the Bank. The District Commissioner was told that Mr Karinga had no authority to sign such letter and in any case since the charge in favour of the Bank in respect of Mr Chege's property had not been registered, the contents of the letter were not true

Mr Bennett then proceeded to call Mr Karinga and started his inquiries. He found the duplicate copy of the letter in Mr Karinga's drawer. It is alleged by the Respondents that Mr Karinga inferred when he was questioned by Mr Bennett that he had issued the letter on the authority of the substantive Manager. Mr Kabii, who was away on leave. Mr Karinga has denied that he inferred any such thing. From what trans pired subsequent to this the Respondents' submission on the reason why immediate action was not taken against Mi Karinga cannot be upheld. Mr Barnes when giving evidence in Court handed a photostat copy of the duplicate of the letter of 4th December 1970 on which he had made certain notes in his own handwriting. Towards the end of his notes he has written as follows—

- 'Mr Bennett pointed out-
- 1 He had written letter committing Bank
- 2 Kept file copy in his drawer
- 3 Admonished him severely but no action taken '

Then there is Staff Circular No 128 dated 18th December, 1970, which, because of its bearing on this dispute, is set out hereinbelow —

BANK NOTE PAPER

In Staff Circular 100/69 we reminded Branches that staff were not permitted to use Bank headed note paper for unauthorized correspondence. Despite this warning it has come to our notice that a signing official has, without the authority of his Manager, attempted to give an opinion on a customer which mentioned a completely unjustified figure.

Managers must warn staff once again that they may not use Bank note paper for unauthorized purposes and that a serious view will be taken in future of any such cases reported to this office"

It is pertinent to note that in the above circular staff are being warned that in future a serious view will be taken of any such cases reported

Mr Kabii returned from leave towards the end of December 1970, and signed the take over certificate on 29th December There is nothing to indicate that at that stage there was any thing pending regarding Mr Karinga's incident as far as disciplinary action was concerned Mr Kabii in his evidence stated that in January 1971 he interviewed Mr Karinga and talked to him for a short time and he expected an apology from him but Mr Karinga insisted that what he had done was right and went on to say that if Managers became unduly difficult then he Mr Karinga will give such letters to customers Mr Kabii further said that he asked Mi Karinga to go away and think about it and he interviewed him again in the middle of February, 1971, when Mr Karinga again repeated his earlier stand On 23rd February Mr Kabii wrote a letter to the Local Head Office regarding Mi Karinga which appears as Appendix J in the Respondents' submission. It is very significant that neither in this letter nor in any other letter M1 Kabii has referred to the allegation that he had given Mr Karinga authority to issue this letter to Mr Chege on 4th December If what the Respondents say is true that the matter was kept pending for Mr Kabii to give his views on it then he would surely have mentioned this point and denied having given such authority. In fact his letter of 23rd February is nothing but a continuation of correspondence regarding Mr Karinga's work performance starting with the letter from the Head Office dated 10th November, 1970 It was a report which Mr Kabii was preparing after about two months nothing more

Keeping the aforesaid sequence of events in view and the points that emerge therefrom, the Court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that the incident regarding the letter of 4th December, 1970, which had been signed by Mr Karinga was dealt with and closed by the Ag Manager Mr Barnes, and the Local Director Mr Bennett, on 5th December, 1970, after Mr Karinga was severely admonished. In view of this the Court finds that Mr Karinga's demotion which was conveyed to Nyeri Branch on 5th March, 1971 was not justified. The main reason of his demotion was the letter of 4th December but this matter had been concluded by the Local Director on 5th December, 1970.

The Court while upholding the Respondents submission that the Bank could not be said to have a charge against Mr Chege's property until such time as the charge was duly registered by the Land Office, must point out that it is a normal practice for the Banks to accommodate their customers in emergencies like the one in which Mr Chege found himself on 4th December when he was to appear for an interview before the Plot Allocation Committee At that stage the Bank had the title deeds in their possession and if the title deeds were not in their possession at least they had seen the title deeds and had

prepared the charge on that property in their own favour. In these circumstances it would have been quite proper for the Bank to have given some sort of recommendation to their customer although the charge had not been registered in their favour. But the letter should have been signed by the officer authorized in that respect. The Court must find that Mr Karinga was not authorized to sign such an important letter on behalf of the Bank notwithstanding the fact that Mr Karinga has all along claimed that as far as he was concerned he thought he was entitled to sign such letters. There is no doubt that Mr Karinga exceeded his powers as those of a Section Head with "B" signing powers. In these circumstances the reprimand he got from the Local Director was quite proper

The Court having made the above two findings to the effect that Mr Karınga issued an unauthorized letter and that he was promptly disciplined by the Ag Manager and the Local Director on 5th December when this particular incident was concluded cannot find a good reason as to why this incident was used to demote Mr Karınga in Maich 1971 It is significant that everyone concerned knew that his demotion would either compel him to resign of on his refusal to work as a clerk his services would be terminated. After a very careful considera tion of all the submissions and evidence given by the various witnesses the Court has come to the conclusion that the real cause of Mr Karinga's demotion and subsequent termination of employment is the fact that Mi Kaiinga having in the past assisted the European Managers at Nyeri in discussing and assisting in matters of loans for various customers had continued to do the same after Mr Kabii had taken over which fact was resented by Mr Kabii The Court does not condone Mr Karinga's action in not concentrating wholly on his job as that of a Section Head in Savings Section but at the same time allowance must be given to Mr Karinga in view of his past duties in that Branch regarding loans to customers. It is not fair to expect that the customers in a short time would cease to approach him in the first place for bank loans as they used to do during the European Managers' time The underlying cause in this whole incident is this conflict between Mr Kabii and Mr Karınga although the letter of 4th December was prominently used to justify his demotion

The Court has fully taken into consideration the various allegations against Mr Karinga during his eight years and five months' service with the Respondents but in the absence of any written warning to him over any of these incidents even during the time he was non-unionizable has come to the conclusion that they were minor and were treated accordingly by the Respondents

The Court has applied its mind fully to the various points which the Respondents have put forward in their written and verbal submissions but finds that Mr Karinga's demotion and his subsequent termination which arose out of his refusal to accept demotion, were unjustified and unfair particularly after the Local Director Mr Bennett had dealt with the matter and finished it on 5th December 1970. In these circumstances the Court after a very careful consideration has come to the conclusion that Mr Karinga's dismissal was wrongful and awards that he should be reinstated in his employment as a Section Head with 'B' signing powers with effect from the day following the date of this award and his services should be deemed to have continued unbroken. The Court further recommends that Mr Karinga should be transferred from Nyeri

The Court now comes to the other important point that arises in this dispute, and that is whether it should award full salary as a Section Head to Mr Karinga from 17th April, 1971, up to the date of his reinstatement

It is the view of the Court that had Mr Kaiinga followed the normal and national procedure expected of an employee who in his opinion considers that he has been wrongly disciplined, and accepted the demotion under protest and subject to his right to pursue his case through his Union to the Industrial Court if necessary, the claim now before the Court would relate merely to salary lost as a result of demotion

Though he may well have been provoked by the manner in which he considered his case had been handled the fact remains that his refusal to accept demotion led inevitably to his termination and therefore must be attributed to his own actions

No employee can expect the Court to condone and support a refusal to work and then ask the Court to award full salary for the intervening period out of employment. In such case the Court would not normally award salary or compensation, however, having due regard to the historical sequence of the events in this case the Court considers some monetary compensation justified and accordingly awards a sum of Sh six thousand and six hundred to Mr Karinga as compensation for demotion and subsequent loss of earnings from 17th April 1971, to the date on which he resumes employment






