Issue in dispute -

Wages and salary increments

- 1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Machakos District Co-operative Union Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 14th day of June, 1972 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Respondents, who are a servicing organization, started negotiations with the Claimants as far back as 1968, the time when the Commissioner for Co-operatives was trying to introduce uniform terms and conditions of service to cover all co-operative unions in the country. However, due to various reasons much progress was not possible and the Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour which was accepted and a conciliator was appointed in January, 1970.

The conciliation proceedings resulted in the parties reaching agreement on all items in their Collective Agreement with the exception of the wages and salary increments. The effective date of the Agreement is 1st July, 1971, and its duration period is three years from that date

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A' on 8th January, 1972, and the Labour Commissioner signed the relevant certificate on 15th February, 1972

The Claimants' proposals on the issue in dispute are based on the job categories as they exist since 1969. In respect of an ordinary labourer, they demanded Sh 140 for the first year going up to Sh 160 and Sh 180 for the second and third years, and on the other hand for the top of Scale V they demanded Sh 2,500 for the first year, Sh 2,650 and Sh 2,800 for the second and third years

The Claimants subsequently modified their demands as follows —

The Respondents throughout these negotiations maintained that they were not in a position to meet these demands at all and submitted that the existing wages and salaries which they paid to their employees were fair and reasonable

During the hearing the Claimants main argument was that the Respondents' yearly turnover was between Sh 15 to 16 million a year and that since they were entitled to a commission of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent on this figure they could afford to meet their demands, further since the Respondents were a thriving cooperative union there was no reason why they should pay less than the Embu Co-operative Union Ltd and the Kirinyaga District Co-operative Union Ltd The parties tabled the respective collective agreements of these two unions for the benefit of the Court

The Respondents reiterated that they were not a profit making undertaking and that their $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent commission on their annual turnover did not leave them in a position to meet the Claimants' very high demands. They pointed out that their revenue in 1971 was Sh 7 million and in 1972 Sh $12\frac{1}{2}$ million. They referred the Court to the present uncertainty in the world coffee market situation which had great effect on the commission earned by them

The Court has taken into consideration the above submissions and also the fact that some of the primary societies are very small and are unable to stand on their own feet, and that the Respondents have had to advance finance to them and in some cases have to subsidize them by financing the cost of personnel. The Court has also taken into consideration the increased amounts which these primary societies have to spend on chemicals to combat Coffee Berry Disease and to overcome the naturally dry conditions which exist in this particular area The Court has compared the current wages paid by the Respondents with those of Kirinyaga and Embu Co-operative Unions and makes the following award on wages and salary increments —
