5 The successful allottee of the plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been successful the conveyancing, stamp duty and registration fees, contribution in lieu of rates and provisional service charges. *General Conditions*

1 The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281)

2 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in the letter of application and will be subject to the Special Conditions set out below

3 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the 1st day of the month following the issue of the letter of allotment

*Special Conditions*

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee pro-

poses to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the commencement of the term complete the erection of such buildings and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in or implied by the Government Lands Act (Cap 280), if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any conditions herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the Commissioner of Lands shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of land comprised herein

5 The land and buildings shall only be used for the purpose of a Church, Church Hall and one residence for the Minister in charge

6 The buildings shall not cover a greater area of the land than that laid down by the local authority in its by-laws

7 The grantee shall not subdivide the land

8 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President

9 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sum as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid

10 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess

11 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess

5 Applicants must enclose a cheque for Sh 1,000 per deposit which will be dealt with as follows —

- (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for the plots within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
- (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him
- (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

*General Conditions*

1 The ordinary conditions applicable to urban grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant

2 The grant will be made under the Provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap 281)

3 The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application

4 The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following notification of the approval of the grant

5 Each allottee of a plot shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands within 14 days of notification that his application has been approved, the initial estimated amount for the construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, the assessed stand premium and proportion of annual rent, together with the legal fees payable in respect of the preparation and registration of the grant (Sh 225) and the stamp duty in respect of the grant approximately 2 per cent of the stand premium and annual rent) In default of payment within the specified time, the Commissioner of Lands may cancel the allocation and the applicant shall have no further claim to the grant of the plot

*Special Conditions*

1 No buildings shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the Commissioner of Lands and the local authority. The Commissioner shall not give his approval unless he is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily

2 The grantee shall within six months of the commencement of the term submit in triplicate to the local authority and the Commissioner of Lands plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and a system of drainage for the disposal of sewage, surface and sullage water), drawings, elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within 24 months of the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawings, elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the Commissioner

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Government Lands Act if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Lands or any person authorized by him on behalf of the President to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the President or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the Commissioner of Lands that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid the Commissioner of Lands

shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised herein

(a) Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given within 12 months of the commencement of the term the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or

(b) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the Commissioner of Lands shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

5 The land and the buildings shall only be used for shops and/or offices combined with residence (excluding the sale of petrol)

6 The buildings shall not cover more than 75 per centum of the area of the land if used for shop and/or office purposes only or such lesser area of the land as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws, and not more than 50 per centum of the area of the land if used for the combined purposes of shops, offices and flats or such lesser areas as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws

7 The land shall not be used for the purposes of any trade or business which the Commissioner of Lands considers to be dangerous or offensive

8 The grantee shall not subdivide the land

9 The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the President no application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until Special Condition No 2 has been performed

10 The grantee shall pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such sums as the Commissioner may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid

11 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the Commissioner of Lands on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the Commissioner may assess

12 Should the Commissioner of Lands at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard the grantee shall pay to the Commissioner on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the Commissioner may assess

13 The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges duties assessments or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any Government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum by the President in lieu thereof

14 The President or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains, service pipes and drains, telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the grantee shall not erect any buildings in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains

15 The Commissioner of Lands reserves the right to revise the annual ground rental of Sh payable hereunder after the expiration of the 30th and 60th year of the term hereby granted. Such rental will be at a rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands

1 The Kenya Union of Sugar Plantation Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Sugar Employers' Group shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Kericho on 29th and 30th August, 1972, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

## AWARD

3 In Cause No 12/69 the parties appeared before the Court on 17 issues including almost all the items which are in dispute again in this Cause

In that dispute the Court ruled as follows on "Effective Date and Duration" —

"The Court has decided that the effective date, as far as members of the Kenya Sugar Employers' Union are concerned, should be 1st May, 1969, because they had an agreement with the Claimants effective from 1st May, 1967, for 24 months. The Court is not prepared to break the existing agreement as it would be creating an undesirable precedent which in any case would be contrary to the parties' legal rights. As far as the other members of the Respondents' group are concerned the Court rules that the effective date for them should be 1st January, 1969

The Court rules that this award should remain in force for a period of two years from 1st May, 1969"

As a result of the Tripartite Agreement the aforesaid award was extended by 12 months and was effective until 30th April, 1972. Unfortunately the parties could not sign a collective agreement because of failure to agree on the wording of certain clauses. So there is no valid and binding agreement on terms and conditions of employment and the parties are subject to the Court award and the minutes of their Joint Industrial Council meetings where agreement was reached on various items

The Claimants submitted their proposals for varying the existing terms and conditions of employment of workers in the Sugar Industry in April, 1972, and these were received by the Respondents on 24th April. Two meetings of the JIC were held on 6th and 8th May, 1972, during which several items were settled

The dispute having been reported to the Ministry of Labour little or no progress was made on any of the issues and the parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form 'A' which was forwarded to the Industrial Court accompanied by the Labour Commissioner's certificate dated 5th July, 1972

After the parties had made their opening submissions the Court toured the various sugar estates and saw the housing provided by the Respondents' members for their workers. Reference to this will be made in the award hereinafter under the appropriate issue in dispute. The Court also saw the workers performing their cane cutting tasks in the green and burnt fields

The main bone of contention in this dispute is the Respondents' allegation that the workers' productivity leaves much to be desired. They submitted that it was most unfair to the Sugar Industry as a whole that the workers should finish their task of 26 cwt in a couple of hours and then do nothing for the whole day when the factories stood idle or worked at half steam for lack of sugar-cane. They made a strong plea for the task of 26 cwt which was laid down in 1963 to be increased to 40 cwt for green cane and 120 cwt for burnt cane. For this increase in task they offered the current daily rates to be brought up as follows —

## TASK 1—GREEN CANE

De-trashing, cutting cane, topping, clearing the rows and piling the cut cane in heaps

The Respondents submitted in great detail the various factors which contributed to the lean period through which the Sugar Industry was passing. They stressed the necessity for the industry to employ as many as possible. They referred the Court to the following table which they submitted proved the necessity to fix on this occasion realistic tasks and wages —

The Respondents further submitted that the production of sugar in 1970 from the three factories amounted to 109,728 tons but for the first six months of 1972 the production only amounted to 39,142 tons which if continued for the second half of the year would mean a total production for 1972 of approximately 80,000 tons, a reduction of over 29,000 tons

The Claimants on the other hand strongly maintained that the workers were underpaid on the present task of 26 cwt and indicated that they would strongly resist any increase in task unless it was accompanied by a wage increase and then increasing it further to match the increased productivity demanded by the Respondents

They strongly submitted that in other countries where the task of cane cutters was more than in Kenya, the wages were much more superior than those paid here. They pointed out that during negotiations they asked the Respondents to double the wages for doubling the task but the Respondents had flatly refused this offer. They asked the Court to grant them wage increases as demanded by them related to the old task and leave the question of increased productivity to be negotiated between the parties either in the shape of an incentive scheme or a bonus payment

The Court notes that the parties have agreed to a new job classification as a result of which there are now nine manual grades and four clerical grades

The Court has taken fully into consideration the very important points made by both the parties relating to the plight of the Sugar Industry and the workers' expectancy of increased remuneration to give them a better standard of living. The Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents are entitled to the performance of a greater task everyday by the workers as it is not proper that able bodied men should work only half a day or even less when there is ample demand for their labour. At the same time the Respondents have to realize that they cannot expect the workers to complete a task which is double and in case of burnt cane treble for the same remuneration. Keeping all these points in view the Court has made an award on the various issues in dispute and feels that this new and fair deal to both sides will herald a new era in the Kenya Sugar Industry with all its attendant benefits to the economy of the country as a whole

1 *Staff safari allowance*—The Court awards that workers on safari should be paid an allowance of Sh 37/50 when they have to spend a night out from their place of work. In the case of a worker who goes on safari but does not spend a night out he will get an allowance of Sh 17/50

2, 4, 10 and 11 *Tasks, incentives, wages and Nyanza allowances*—The Court has decided to tackle these four issues together because they are very closely related and interlinked. After a careful consideration of all the submissions made by the parties the Court has decided to award the following tasks and the rates in respect thereof —

(i) *Green cane*—De-threshing, cutting cane, topping, clearing the rows and piling the cut cane in heaps —

(ii) The Court further awards that Nyanza allowance should continue to be paid as before to all workers except those who are now in grades VI, VII, VIII and IX and the four clerical grades

(iii) The Court awards the following rates for the various grades —

(iv) The Court further awards that all those workers who are above the rates for their grades should get an increase of 6 per cent on their present wages and those who did not get any increase as a result of the Court award in Cause No 12/69 should get a 10 per cent increase

(v) The Court further awards that all the workers shall get an increase of 7 per cent after 18 months of the effective date as awarded hereinafter

3 *Employment*—(i) The Court awards that in all those cases where the Respondents wish to utilize their right of the law of contract then properly drawn up documents approved by the Labour Commissioner should be used and should contain an express condition that the workers engaged by the contractors shall not under any circumstances get a lower rate of wage than that specified in this award

(ii) The Court would like to draw the parties attention to its award on casual labour in Cause No 12/69 where the Court ruled as follows —

On the question of casual labour the Court finds that the employees have the right to offer monthly or casual employment as indeed a worker has the right to work on casual or monthly terms. What is not right is that this system of casual employment should be abused. The Court has very carefully examined the policy document of the Federation of Kenya Employers and finds that it is a fair document and can form a basis for eliminating abuse of casual employment. The Court awards that the Claimants and the Employers should ensure in accordance with the said FKE directive that casual workers are not exploited at the various sugar estates. The local union official and the estate manager should see that the provisions of the document are being complied with.

The Court does award, however, that if a worker has been offered work regularly as a casual for a period of three months, he should immediately be converted to monthly terms."

The parties should realize that non-compliance with the Court's directives can lead to industrial strife. In order to protect such workers, the Court directs the Senior Labour Officer, Nyanza Province, to institute regular checks to ensure that the Court's directives are being carried out.

5 *Discipline*—The Court awards as follows —

Without derogation of an employer's right to summarily terminate employment for lawful cause, an employee may be warned. The warning shall be confirmed in writing. Warnings may be issued in circumstances where the employer considers the employee's misconduct to be of insufficient degree to warrant summary dismissal. An employee who has been warned thrice and who commits further misconduct shall be summarily dismissed. Provided that an employee who completes a period of twelve months' service without further fault after being warned shall have all or any warnings expunged from his record. Provided further than where misconduct by an employee requires investigation then the employee may be suspended from duty with half pay for a period not exceeding one month whilst such an inquiry is being carried out.

6 *Hours of work (watchmen)*—The Court has decided not to reduce the hours of work in case of watchmen but the Court has taken into consideration the submissions made by the Claimants on this issue in arriving at the new wage rates for these workers. The new wage rates are set out hereinabove under the appropriate heading.

7 *Injury on duty*—The Court reviewed this issue in its award in Cause No 12/69 and is not inclined to vary any further this time. This demand is accordingly rejected.

8 *Housing*—This issue came up before the Court in Cause No 12/69 when the Court made the following comment —

"The President and members of the Court undertook an extensive tour of the sugar estates and visited several housing units and factories at Muhoroni, Chemelil and Mrwani. The

Court found that whereas in some estates the houses provided were of reasonably good standard, at other places some of the houses were shocking and should have been condemned. It is disgraceful for the employers concerned to house their employees in such conditions. It is apparent that the Government and County Council officers whose function it is to ensure that housing which is provided for workers on the estates is up to the statutory standard have failed to do their duty.

The Court directs that these officers should immediately visit these places and take the necessary action. In fact sanitary conditions in some of the places were of the worst kind and if urgent measures are not taken there is a grave danger of an outbreak of an epidemic. Unfortunately housing is such a problem in the agricultural industry that the Court cannot do much other than to draw the authorities' attention to the state of affairs it found."

This time the Court members again visited the housing estates and were disappointed to see that at the 'Okech' Housing Estate of the East African Sugar Industries Limited instead of there being an improvement there was in fact a deterioration in the standard of houses provided. The Court was shown mud huts with thatched roofs which were almost in a state of collapse. To make it worse one such small hut was being shared by two families. This is all very disgusting and the employers should realize that they cannot expect much from workers who are housed so poorly with such inadequate facilities.

The Court hereby directs this particular employer to improve its housing facilities to acceptable standards consistent with the maintenance of human dignity within a period of eight months from the date of the award. In case this employer fails to comply with the Court directive the Senior Labour Officer, Nyanza Province, in conjunction with the Health Authorities, should initiate appropriate action against the firm.

The Court was satisfied with the housing facilities at the Chemelil Sugar Co and feels that other members of the Respondents group should emulate their example.

At Mrwani the Court noticed that a few stone blocks had been erected since the last Court visit. The Court finds this to be a step in the right direction but would advise this company to accelerate its housing programme.

(ii) The Court feels that there should be a uniform policy on housing in the Sugar Industry. The Court was told that East African Sugar Industries Ltd are the only employers who charge rent for the accommodation provided to certain higher categories of unionisable employees. The Court awards, as first step to eliminate this practice, that such employees should pay only half the rent which they are being charged at present with effect from the effective date of the award.

(iii) The Court awards that those workers who are not housed by the Respondents should be entitled to the following house allowance —

All workers up to Grade V	Sh 15 p m
Others	Sh 40 p m

9 *Medical treatment*—The Court made an award on this issue in Cause No 12/69 as follows —

"The Court cannot at this stage make an award which would place the responsibility of medical treatment of worker's family on an employer, more so in view of the fact that the Government is rapidly moving towards providing free medical treatment to everyone in the country.

The Court does, however, feel that the employers should provide free transport to workers' families to the nearest health centre, dispensary or hospital and so awards."

The Court is not inclined to vary this at present but would like to stress to the Respondents that they should properly carry out their obligations as set out in the above award.

12 *Effective date and duration*—The Court rules that the effective date of its award should be 1st July, 1972, and that it should remain in force for a period of three years from that date.

Provided that the award in respect of task work should be implemented as follows —

- For all task work done on the old basis the workers should be paid an increase of 50 cts per task on the old rates with effect from 1st July, 1972.
- The new task work with new rates should come into force seven days after the date of the Court award.
- All other increases awarded are to be implemented from the aforesaid effective date of 1st July, 1972.

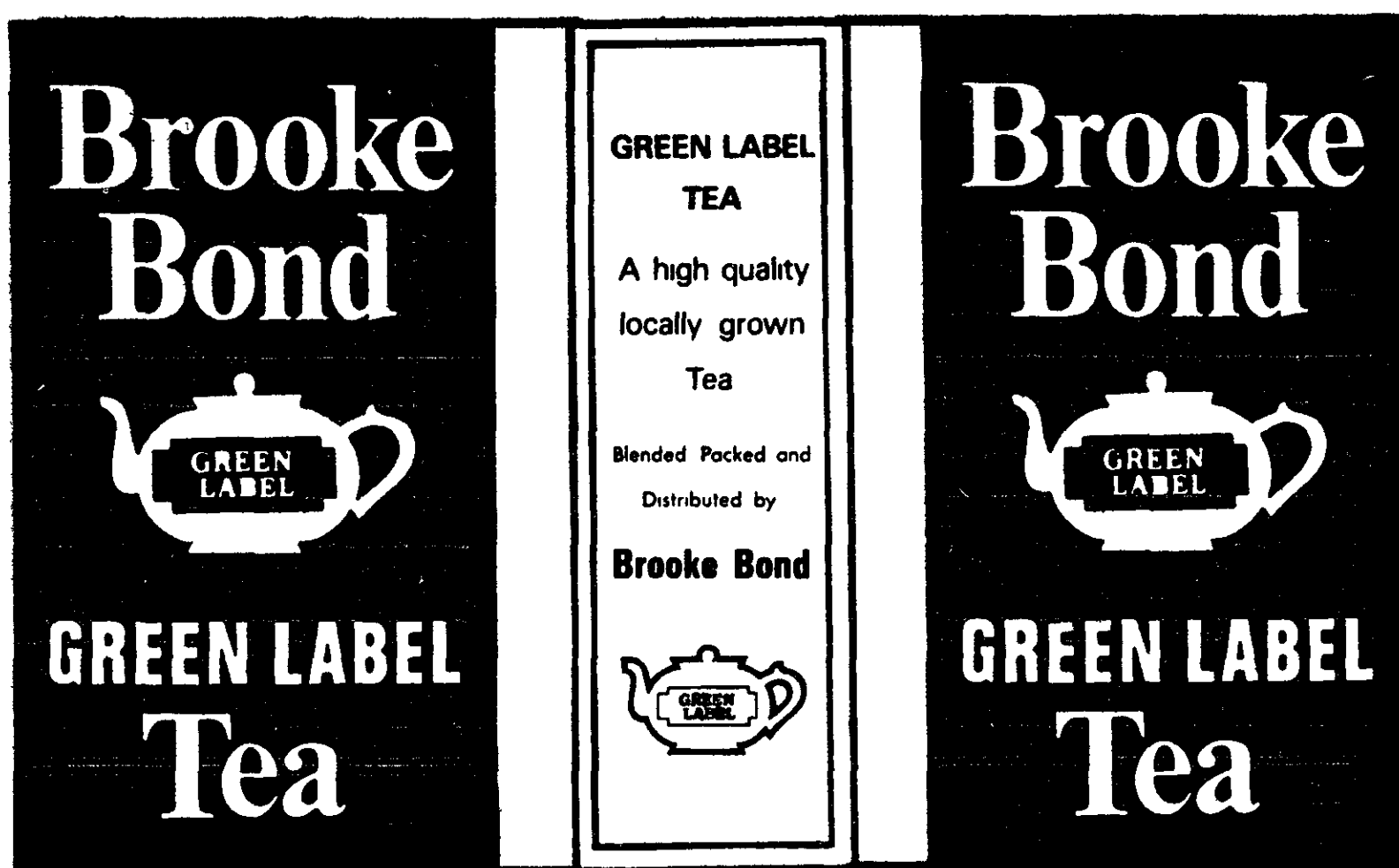
