1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya Co operative Creameries Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 5th September, and on 5th and 6th October, 1972. In addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions the parties called a number of witnesses. They were —

Claimants

Messrs Nyanjom Wahundi and Walter Barrack Rahudo

Respondents

Messrs Stephen Mbogua and Patrick Kariuki Muiruri

AWARD

3 When the Court assembled on 5th September, the Claimants challenged the issue in dispute as recorded on Form A submitting that an amendment had been made to Form A by the Respondents, which amendment had not been countersigned by the Claimants. As the amendment deleted the word "wrongful" before termination and could have a significant effect on the dispute the Court ruled that the hearing should be adjourned until 5th October during which time the parties should endeavour to reach an agreed text.

On resumption the parties having failed to reach agreement on a text the Court ruled the issue in dispute to be —

- (1) Was the termination of services of Messrs John Munyobi, Nyanjom Wahundi and Anderson Rubulela wrongful or not?
- (2) In the event of the Court finding their termination to be wrongful then the Court to make such orders as it may deem fit in accordance with section 9A (i) of the Trade Disputes Act.

The background to the dispute is that on 30th September, 1971, the services of Messrs Munyobi, Wahundi and Rubulela were terminated by the issue to each of them of a letter of notice in identical terms. Three months' notice was provided and it was specified that during such time they would not be required to work and would continue to occupy a company house.

According to the Claimants this action was taken as a result of incidents which occurred at a meeting called by the Assistant Factory Manager and held on 28th September, 1971. The Claimants challenged the justification for the termination of these employees' services and after meetings with the Management, reported by letter to the Ministry of Labour dated 13th October, 1971, that a trade dispute existed. On 23rd November, 1971, Mr B G Saka was appointed as an Investigator. The parties were advised on 11th April, 1972, that as a result of the findings of the Investigator it was recommended that the three employees be reinstated, given written warnings and if the Company deem it desirable transferred to another section.

This recommendation was not acceptable to the Respondents and Notification of Dispute Form A was signed by the parties on 10th May, 1972.

It is the claim of the Respondents that having given three months' notice under the terms provided in paragraph 12 of the Company/Union Agreement there is no dispute within the meaning of the amended Trade Disputes Act as the employees were not dismissed from their employment but their services

were terminated lawfully, and secondly that the Court has no power to reinstate in any event as the employees were not wrongfully dismissed but their services were terminated lawfully.

The Court would deal with these legal submissions first. On the question whether the circumstances under which the services of these three workers were terminated constitute a trade dispute or not, the Court has no hesitation in finding that there is a trade dispute. The definition of "trade dispute" in the Trade Disputes Act as amended by Act No 22 of 71 reads as follows —

"trade dispute" means any dispute or difference between employers and employees, or between employees and employees, connected with the employment or non employment, or with the terms of the employment or with the

conditions of labour, of any person, and includes disputes regarding the dismissal or suspension of employees, allocation of work or recognition agreements and includes an apprehended trade dispute.

This definition is very wide indeed and there can be no doubt that in the circumstances leading up to the present dispute, a "trade dispute" within the meaning of this definition exists. The Court would like to add that major trade disputes have erupted in some industries when the services of trade union members have been terminated and the unions through threats of strikes have pressured the employers to submit to the jurisdiction of the Industrial Court. The Minister for Labour has accepted in the past as it did in this case, the reports of trade disputes and processed them in terms of the Trade Disputes Act. This is how it should be otherwise the only other alternative would be "strike" action which the Trade Disputes Act envisages a weapon to be used as a last resort only. Were the Court to hold otherwise the whole purpose of the Trade Disputes Act would be defeated.

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 10th May, 1972, the Labour Commissioner issued the necessary certificate on 30th June, 1972, and the Minister for Labour issued his authority as required under section 9 (9) (f) of the Trade Disputes Act on 5th July, 1972. In accordance with the directives of the Court issued on 5th September, the parties tried to agree to the issue in dispute but failed. They referred the matter back to the Court on 13th September, 1972, by setting out their respective versions of the issue in dispute and requested the Court to frame the issue for them which it did.

For these reasons the Court must overrule the Respondents submission that there is no trade dispute.

Now coming to the other point that once an employer has complied with his contractual obligations then that is the end of the matter and the workers have no further remedy. This matter however is not so simple as that. Over the years since the Industrial Court was established it has made the position clear that the Court has every right to satisfy itself that the order terminating the service of a worker is not passed merely to camouflage an order of dismissal for misconduct.

If it is found by the Court that the termination is in fact founded on misconduct, negligence, or inefficiency then the Court must find out if the facts support the allegation made against the worker. In such cases, the Court will not, however, easily set aside the Management's decision. It will interfere only —

- (1) When there is want of good faith
- (2) When there is victimization or unfair labour practice
- (3) When the management has been guilty of a basic error or violation of principles of natural justice
- (4) When on the materials the finding is completely baseless or perverse

Once the Court comes to the conclusion that it must interfere in the Management's decision to terminate a worker's services then it naturally follows that the termination was not justified and was wrongful. The Court must add that in this context there is no material difference in the words "termination" and "dismissal". The Court is then empowered to make necessary orders in accordance with the new section 9A of the Trade Disputes Act which was passed by Parliament last year.

The Court would like to state that were it to accept the Respondents' submission on this point then every employer would get rid of unwanted workers by giving them the agreed notices of termination. This would make a mockery of the whole industrial relations machinery and plunge industry into serious confrontation with the trade unions.

Therefore the Court must overrule the Respondents' second submission also.

Now reverting to the facts of this dispute the Court was placed in a singularly difficult position by the lack of any inquiry or investigation having been carried out immediately after the alleged incidents and further more the contradictory evidence submitted by the witnesses called on the one hand by the Claimants and on the other by the Respondents. The Court was surprised to learn that the employees concerned were not given any opportunity to defend the allegations against them nor were any statements from witnesses taken before the decision to terminate their services was reached and implemented by the Management. The Court can only judge the facts as presented and reach the most plausible interpretation of the case when examined in the light of known sequence of events.

Certain facts are clear. Sometime before 28th September the Management had decided to introduce a routine system of attendance recording through time clocks. Meetings at which this system was discussed were held with the shop stewards on at least two occasions and on the 24th August, the shop stewards advised that there were certain objections by the employees to the clock system these were specified and Management gave its replies in justification. This meeting was consultative and required no decision.

On 27th September, the Assistant Factory Manager called a meeting of all employees for the following morning. In evidence he stated that he had come to this decision in consultation with the Personnel Manager because he had heard that there were some objections to the clocking system and a rumour was circulating that its implementation was designed to terminate the employment of long service employees.

Neither the Union nor the shop stewards were co-opted by the Assistant Factory Manager to assist in putting over to the employees the Management's points at the meeting.

As this meeting is the crucial factor in setting the atmosphere for the events which followed it is pertinent to note that there are obvious dangers in holding mass meetings between individual Managers and the whole group of employees. It must be anticipated more particularly when the meeting is called to deal with a subject which has emotional impact on the workers, that the authority of the Manager is put at risk and that the calling of this type of meeting presupposes that he is prepared for some degree of verbal criticism and 'rough and tumble' at the meeting. It would be normal to communicate in such cases through the recognized Union officials and by use of their good offices avoid any risk of confrontation with an individual Manager.

In the event these fears were justified. Though the evidence is contradictory in some details there is no doubt that after the Assistant Manager had tried to reassure those present that the use of the clocks was justified and that no hidden motive to release from employment long service workers was contemplated, he invited questions from the workers. In his evidence he explained that he considered these questions should be solely related to the clocks. This may be rather a naive view and in fact critical remarks were addressed to him by at least three of those present including two, Messrs Anderson Rubulela and John Muniyobi whose services were subsequently terminated. From the evidence in both these cases the remarks were based upon rejection of the clock system but extended to criticism of the Assistant Manager himself as the alleged instigator of the system.

The evidence also showed one other employee irritated the Assistant Manager by his remarks to an extent which caused him to be told to 'shut up'. There is little doubt that by this time groups of the employees and the Assistant Manager were becoming heated.

Particular contradiction arose in the evidence given on the actions of the third ex-employee Mr Nyanjom Wahundi. His case differs from the other two in so far as it is claimed by the Respondents that he left the circle of employees and actually caught the Assistant Manager by his neck or tie and shirt. If true, his actions were quite incomparable with the other two concerned who merely gave voice to their personal opinions. Both witnesses for the Claimants denied that Mr Wahundi touched the Assistant Manager and indeed claimed that he had intervened to prevent another employee, Mr Masila Kilonga, from moving forward to threaten the Assistant Manager.

At this stage the Court must revert to the unfortunate absence of any inquiry documents or statements which it would expect to have been prepared at the time in view of what is claimed to be a very serious offence, assaulting a Manager. The Court learned through evidence that identical letters were issued by

the Assistant Manager after consultation with the Management on 29th September, 1971, in which the following clause is to be found —

Owing to your insolence to the Assistant Factory Manager in language and behaviour on 28th September, 1971, I hereby inform you that your services with the company have been terminated with effect from today, Wednesday, 29th September, 1971."

The employees refused to accept these letters and they were withdrawn and replaced on the following day with similar letters but with this clause excluded.

It is difficult to understand why it was decided to deal in exactly similar fashion with two employees who merely made remarks and the third who, it is alleged by the Respondents, committed the far graver action of using a degree of violence against the Assistant Manager. No explanation was given by the Respondents except that length of service had influenced them, in explanation as to why the Police had not been called in a case of this nature, the Respondents indicated that in their view it was a relatively minor case not worthy of Police action. It was the Claimants' submission that the alteration of the letters was a skilful device to permit them to use clause 12 of the Agreement, which they thought would avoid any need to prove justification. The Court concurs with this view and finds that the notices of termination were prompted by the incidents at the meeting of the 28th September. The Court must therefore decide whether these incidents were sufficiently grave to justify the termination of the services of these three employees.

Clearly from the evidence which left a great deal to be desired from both Claimants and Respondents' witnesses the Court cannot establish with absolute certainty what happened.

The Court is very anxious to ensure that young or newly appointed managers have the authority necessary to carry out their responsibilities, nevertheless this authority must be used with care and wisdom and if through lack of experience the manager himself unnecessarily creates the conditions under which a degree of challenge to his authority can be reasonably anticipated, the Court cannot protect him when set against the risk of permitting an injustice to an employee.

Taking into account the unlikelihood of a man with 16 years unblemished service attacking a Manager with so little reason and the very contradictory evidence given on the part taken by him at the meeting, the Court has come to the conclusion that it must give Mr Wahundi the benefit of the doubt.

After most careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence particularly of the words alleged to have been used and bearing in mind the risks clearly taken by the Assistant Manager in initiating a meeting of this nature outside normal working procedures the Court is not satisfied that they constitute sufficient justification for the termination of employment either by dismissal or termination with notice. Accordingly the Court finds that these three employees were wrongfully dismissed.

For the reasons set out the Court awards that the three employees, Messrs John Muniyobi, Nyanjom Wahundi and Anderson Rubulela be reinstated with immediate effect on normal salary, and that the intervening period from the date on which their termination took effect will be counted as service. No salary will be payable for this period during which they did not work but a flat rate sum of Sh 2,500 will be paid to each of them to provide some compensation for loss of earnings.

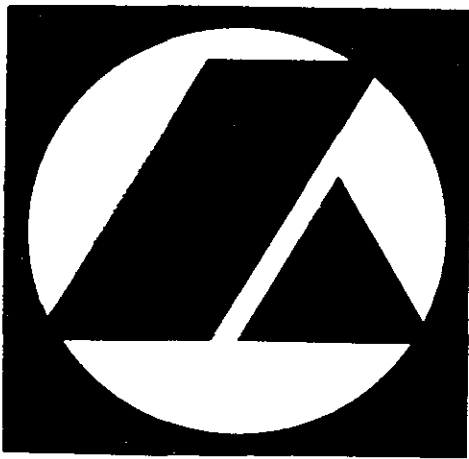
