VACANCIES FOR RESIDENT MAGISTRATES AND DEPUTY REGISTRARS

APPLICATIONS are invited to fill vacancies as Resident Magistrates and as Deputy Registrars in the Judicial Department. The applications should be submitted to the Secretary, Judicial Service Commission, P.O. Box 30041, Nairobi, not later than the 15th January, 1973.

Applicants must be either-

- (1) advocates of the High Court of Kenya; or
- (2) barristers; or
- (3) solicitors; or
- (4) must possess either professional or academic legal qualifications as specified under the Advocates Act.

Applicants should, preferably be Kenya citizens under 55 years of age, have not less than four years' practical and professional experience, since admission or qualification, and have had experience of court work, both criminal and civil.

The terms of appointment for these posts will be in accordance with the conditions of service applicable to locally engaged officers of the Kenya Civil Service. The appointment will be on either permanent and pensionable terms or on agreement in the Job Group K scale which is £1,494 to £1,866. Terms of agreement, which would initially be for a period of thirty (30) months' service, would provide for the payment of house allowance in accordance with the regulations in force and for a terminal gratuity of 25 per cent of the basic salary drawn over the period of the agreement. A copy of the agreement, into which selected candidates would be required to enter, may be inspected at the Registrar's Chambers, Room 10, Law Courts, Nairobi.

Successful candidates with a minimum of four years' professional experience will enter the Job Group K scale at K£1,494 to £1,966. Further incremental credit may be given for approved experience in excess of four years, but subject to the maximum of the scale not being exceeded.

Applications from candidates who possess less than four years' experience may also be considered but their entry point would be calculated at a lower point in the scale, e.g. in the case of a candidate with one year's appropriate experience after admission, it would be in Job Group J at K£1,212.

THE GOVERNMENT LANDS ACT

(Cap. 280)

NYERI MUNICIPALITY—PLOTS FOR LIGHT INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES

The Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the President of the Republic of Kenya gives notice that the plots in Nyeri Municipality as described in the Schedule hereto are available for alienation and applications are invited for the direct grants of the individual plots.

- 2. A plan of the plots may be seen at the Public Map Office situated in the Lands Department Building, City Square, Nairobi, or at the office of the Town Clerk, P.O. Box 180, Nyeri or may be obtained from the Public Map Office, P.O. Box 30089, Nairobi, on payment of Sh. 3 post free.
- 3. Applications should be submitted to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, through the Town Clerk, Nyeri stating the plot required in order of preference. Applications must be on prescribed forms which are available from Lands Department or Town Clerk, Nyeri Municipality.
- 4. Applications must be sent so as to reach the Town Clerk, Nyeri not later than noon on the 31st January, 1973.
- 5. Applications must not be sent direct to the Commissioner of Lands.
- 6. Applicants must enclose with their applications cash, postal order or money order for Sh. 1,000 drawn on applicant's own banking account made payable to the Comissioner of Lands as a deposit which will be dealt with as follows:—
 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him.
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him.
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto.

General Conditions

- 1. The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant.
- 2. The grant will be made under the provisions of the Government Lands Act (Cap. 280 of the Laws of Kenya), and title will be issued under the Registration of Titles Act (Cap. 281).
- 3. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as stated in the letter of application.
- 4. The term of the grant will be for 99 years from the first day of the month following the notification of the approval of the grant
- 5. THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 33 of 1972

Parties:-

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers and

Kenya Breweries Limited

Issue in dispute.—Implementation of Job Evaluation.

- 1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya Breweries Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
- 2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 30th October and 10th November, 1972, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. There is a Collective Agreement between the parties in force dealing with the terms and conditions of employment of the Respondents' employees and is effective up to 28th February, 1974, including one year's extended life under the Tripartite Agreement.

The present wage structure as embodied in the aforesaid Collective Agreement is based on a job evaluation which was carried out in 1967. There are six scales A-F with the rates effective from March, 1972, as follows:—

Sometime in 1970 the Claimants made a demand for a revision of the existing wage structure and a subcommittee was established. Both parties agreed at this subcommittee that certain jobs were under-rated and there was therefore a necessity for re-evaluating the wage structure. The matter was then discussed at the Joint Industrial Council meetings and eventually on 27th January, 1971, the parties agreed that a job evaluation exercise shall be carried out within the existing job scales.

The parties agreed that the job evaluation exercise would be carried out by an independent firm acceptable to both parties. A nine-point agreement was made on 25th May, 1971, and reference would be made to it hereinafter.

The new job evaluation was completed and a report was issued. A few outstanding matters were completed by the subcommittee and the initial exercise was completed on the 19th January, 1972.

The Respondents then embarked on a study of the new scales and their full implications, i.e. costing, etc. The Claimants, however, became impatient and insisted on the immediate implementation of the new job evaluation and threatened strike action.

Further meetings of the Joint Industrial Council took place on 15th/16th June, 1972, and 26th, 27th and 28th June, 1972. These meetings are rather important because the Respondents had tabled new proposals on wage structure based on the new job evaluation. They had proposed an incremental scale for each of the six grades. They also proposed reducing the entry point for each of these grades. At the meeting of 27th June, the Management observed that according to the current agreement the Council should not discuss wage increments at that stage and particularly because of the parties' agreement over the Tripartite Agreement. They, however, explained that the new structure will not affect those in employment but the new-comers plus those who might be promoted.

This indicates that Management understood that the wages of existing employees should remain within the framework of the current Collective Agreement.

There is no denying that discussions did take place on the minimum and maximum of each scale, the yearly increment and number of years in scale for new entrants. There were three movements by each side and agreement was reached on the yearly increment and on the number of years in each scale. However at the end of the minutes of the final meeting of the Joint Industrial Counci! the following is recorded:—

"After uncompromised views were put across by each side the Union representatives decided to record the following statement: 'It is not our intention to take the Management anywhere but we refuse to accept the wage structure given to us and suggest that we are doing away with sliding scales because of the figures given by the Management and maintain

the present scale along with Job Evaluation findings and if Management wish to invite a third party, can do so as they wish'

The Management, referring to last paragraph of Minute No. 9/72—Implementation of Job Evaluation—reaffirmed that they could only implement Job Evaluation findings on condition that the sliding scales are introduced based on the final figures they had given."

On 5th July, 1972, the Claimants reported the existence of a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour on the issue of "Implementation of Job Evaluation". The dispute was accepted and a conciliator was appointed but the matter could not be settled.

The parties' respective stand was as follows:-

The Union's Stand

"The Union maintains that there should be no changes in the current wage rates as a result of the latest Job Evaluation exercise. Anomalies obtaining after the evaluation should be corrected, i.e. employees downgraded and ungraded by the said evaluation should be affected appropriately. The terms of reference of the subcommittee should be adhered to.

Management's Stand

The implementation of Job Evaluation must be accompanied by the costing/pricing of the jobs according to the grades as per Management's 'Proposed Sliding Scale Wage Structure'."

During the hearing the Respondents have relied on paras, 6, 7 and 9 of the Job Evaluation Agreement dated 25th May, 1971. For ease of reference these paras, are reproduced below:—

- "6. Both parties understand that some jobs may be degraded, others may remain static while others may be up-graded.
- 7. In case of undergrading jobs, those holding these will retain their present salaries. The new entrants into the jobs will join in the new wage scale.
- 9. Both parties undertake to abide by the findings of this job exercise which will supersede any previous job evaluation exercise. These findings will be implemented from the 1st day of the month following the completion of the exercise."

They pointed out that if what the Claimants had submitted, that is those jobs that are now to be up-graded should be done so immediately, then there would have been a very limited and restricted job evaluation exercise and not a complete one as had been undertaken and successfully completed. The Respondents wanted the Claimants to honour their part of the agreement by accepting the new wage scales on which extensive negotiations had taken place during Joint Industrial Council meetings.

The Respondents made a strong plea to the Court to find that since the Claimants had negotiated the new wage scale, this coupled with para. 7 of the Job Evaluation Exercise Agreement, had committed them to it and they should not be allowed to withdraw from this position.

The Respondents also referred the Court to what they claimed was a very progressive wage policy in their industry and that the implementation of the new wage scale was expected to cost them £40,000 per year.

The Claimants were strongly opposed to the reduction of the entry points for the various scales from the current level. They said that they had at no time agreed to any such arrangement or visualized that a new wage scale would have lower entry points than the current ones. They made it clear that they would never accept such a situation.

Regarding the participation of their representatives in negotiations on a new wage scale and the subsequent movements made by them, the Claimants stated that their representatives had no mandate to negotiate on the basis of reduction of the entry points for the scales. In any case, they maintained, that they had eventually withdrawn all their offers and were therefore not bound by them.

The Claimants further submitted that they were not opposed to a sliding scale but the scale should be based on entry points being the existing rates for the scales.

The Claimants also referred the Court to various other agreements in their industry to refute the claim by the Respondents that they were the leaders in the country in the field of wages.

The Court finds that certain features of this dispute are very unsatisfactory. To begin with it is questionable whether it is prudent to embark on working out a new wage scale and then expect to implement it during the life of a current Collective Agreement.

There is no objection to a job evaluation exercise being undertaken but it should be in preparation for negotiations when the current Collective Agreement expires. The Court was informed that the Respondents were under intensive pressure to embark on a major job evaluation exercise and although they

resisted it initially, they eventually gave in. But this was subject to the discussions of the meeting of 27th January, 1971, mentioned hereinbefore.

The difficult position in which the Respondents find themselves is evident from their demand whereby they have asked the Court to implement the new wage scale with the entry points as suggested by them and to make it effective for a minimum period of five years. The issue of duration is not in dispute and the Court cannot make an award on it.

On the other hand the Claimants' approach in the whole affair is not above reproach either. The position in which they find themselves in this dispute is very much of their own making. Their two senior officials participated fully in negotiations on the proposed new wage scales on the lower entry points for each of them, with about 10 other union officials.

There is not much substance in the General Secretary's statement that these officials did not know what they were doing and that they did not have a mandate to negotiate a reduction of entry points. If what he says is true the Court hopes that appropriate disciplinary measures will be taken against these officials by the Claimants.

Both the parties are out to secure the best advantage for themselves from this exercise. The Claimants want their members whose jobs have been up-graded to benefit immediately without wanting to agree to a new wage scale with lower entry points than the existing ones. The Respondents on their part feel that this is a good opportunity for them to secure new entry points which are lower than the ones in current Collective Agreement.

The Court is aware that the Respondents are not proposing to reduce the wage of any of the existing employees and that the new entry points would affect the new entrants only but there is an important principle at stake in this dispute: one which is of vital importance to the trade union movement as a whole and that is to what extent should a union agree to a reduction of wage rates which they have achieved over the years in an industry.

It is all very well for the Respondents to seek such a reduction by the introduction of a new wage scale giving annual increments but the fact remains that through their own efforts as much as pressure from the Claimants they have arrived at the present rates for the various scales. The Court is of the view that in these circumstances unless there was a dramatic change in the economy of the industry or of the country as a whole the present rates for the various scales should not be disturbed.

In the foregoing circumstances the Court has to find an answer which would be fair to both sides. The Court finds that despite the complete turnabout by the Claimants on the stand taken by them during negotiations, they are technically within their right, to do so. They have decided to withdraw all their offers made at the Joint Industrial Council meetings. This being so the Court must find that the Respondents are also entitled to revert to a status quo as far as negotiations on a new wage scale are concerned. It should be noted that these negotiations had taken place with the recommendations on the new wage scales made by the firm of Consultants in the background and that these recommendations were available to the Respondents only as they only had paid for the job evaluation exercise.

The Court would like to point out that it is not creating a new precedent by not pinning down the Claimants to their position during the negotiations because when the negotiations broke down the Claimants at that very meeting, before it ended withdrew all their offers and reverted to their original demand for the implementation of the job evaluation and the maintenance of the present scale. This is perfectly legitimate and the unions and the employers have done this on many occasions. In fact this is a regular occurrence in collective bargaining.

The Court is entitled to take cognisance of the parties' positions at every stage of negotiation but is not bound to accept and award on those lines. The Court has to take into consideration numerous other factors including, like in the present case, the existence of a valid and proper current agreement which runs until 28th February, 1974.

Now the Court comes to the issue in dispute which is the implementation of job evaluation. The Respondents want the implementation of the results of the job evaluation to be tied to the introduction of a new wage scale as proposed by them. The Claimants want the job evaluation to be implemented immediately and they have no objection to sliding scales being introduced provided the entry point for each scale is the same as the current one.

Job evaluation is an attempt to determine and compare the demands which the normal performance of particular jobs makes on normal workers without taking into account the individual abilities or performances of the workers concerned. The job evaluation rates the job not the man.

It is also accepted that job evaluation is an important aid in the fixing of relative wages and in determining a "wage structure" subject to collective bargaining procedures. In fact the Consultant's own report makes it clear that the joint exercise was limited to (a) preparing an agreed rank order of jobs and (b) deriving an acceptable grade structure for that rank order.

This does not necessarily mean that a job evaluation must be followed by a new wage scale. A job evaluation can be fitted in the existing wage structure in that some jobs may be upgraded and others downgraded but on the condition that an employee would not suffer a reduction in his wage on being downgraded. As already pointed out any wage structure is subject to collective bargaining procedures.

In the aforesaid Job Evaluation Agreement it is nowhere stated that the existing Collective Agreement would be thrown open to negotiation on completion of the job evaluation exercise. It would be stretching things a bit too far to read into one indirect reference to a new wage scale, to mean that the wages in the Collective Agreement would be renegotiated, particularly in view of what took place at the meetings of 27th January, 1971, and 26th to 28th June, 1972.

The situation now is that a job evaluation exercise was completed and as a result certain jobs have been up-graded. No existing employees will be downgraded. The Court was told that 29 of the 341 employees promoted to higher grades, will move up two grades.

The current Collective Agreement will expire on 28th February, 1974, when the Claimants will no doubt submit fresh demands to revise it including the item of wages. The Court feels that that would be the proper time for the parties to negotiate a new wage scale. In the meantime the Respondents should implement the agreed rank order of jobs and grade structure for that rank order established by the job evaluation exercise with effect from 1st July, 1972, within the existing wage structure, in view of the fact that the Claimants were a party to the discussions on job evaluation which continued until the end of June, 1972.

The Court has come to this conclusion after a very careful consideration of all the submissions and weighing the probable consequences on the stability of industrial relations in the Respondents' undertaking as this issue is potentially an explosive one.

The period for lodging notice of opposition may be extended by the Registrar as he thinks fit and upon such terms as he may direct. Any request for such extension should be made to the Registrar so as to reach him before the expiry of the period allowed.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the applicant for registration so as to afford him any opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the notice of opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

Where it is stated in the advertisement of the applicant that the mark, upon its registration, is to be limited to certain colours, the colours are, as far as possible, indicated in the accompanying representations of the mark in the usual heraldic manner.

Representations of the marks advertised herein can be seen at the Trade Marks Registry, Kenya School of Law, Nairobi.

Applications for registration in Part A of the Register are shown with the official number unaccompanied by any letter. Applications for Part B are distinguished by the letter B prefixed to the official number.


