### THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE NO 35 OF 1972

Parties -

Printing & Kindred Trades Workers' Union of Kenya

East African Paper Bag Manufacturers Limited

Issues in dispute -

- (1) To determine house allowance to be paid to Union mem bers in lieu of housing
- (2) To determine the employers' refusal to include clause in agreement which provides for employees to be paid terminal payment when he/she loses a job on the account of warnings
- 1 The Printing & Kindred Trades Workers' Union of Kenya shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the East African Paper Bag Manufacturers Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on 23rd November, 1972, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

#### AWARD

3 The previous Collective Agreement between the parties relating to the terms and conditions of employment of the Respondents' employees, expired on 31st December, 1971 This expiry date included one year's extension under the Tripartite Agreement

The Claimants having submitted their demands for revising the Collective Agreement on 16th November, 1971, the parties met and negotiated and reached settlement on all the items except the two in dispute in this cause

The parties reached an agreement at a meeting held on 14th and 15th January, 1972, at Mombasa The items on which agreement was reached included wages and effective date and duration A new job classification was implemented with wage rates ranging from Sh 240 pm to Sh 650 pm In addition it was agreed that those workers who shall not be affected by the increase in job classification shall get the following increases —

- (1) Those earning up to Sh 300-10 per cent
- (2) Those earning from Sh 301 and over-5 per cent

On the issues of "House Allowance" and "Warning System" a deadlock was recorded

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 29th September, 1972, and the Labour Commissioner issued his certificate on 13th October 1972

During the hearing the Court was informed that all the items that had been agreed between the parties had been implemented with effect from 1st January, 1972, and that the duration had been agreed as follows —

- (1) Fringe benefits will not be changed for the next two years
- (2) Wages will be automatically revised during the month of January, 1973, by giving general increase of Sh 20 p m

With the aforesaid background the parties made their submissions on the two issues in dispute to the Court during the hearing

Issue 1—To determine House Allowance to be paid to Union members in lieu of Housing

There is no doubt that the parties have since the recognition of the Claimants paid a minimum consolidated wage to their employees in the various groups and this goes back about ten years, if not more

This time the Claimants included in their demands dated 16th November, 1971, under the item of wages —

Part 1-Job Classification, Group Q, the following -

"All employees with the company who are earning under Sh 800 pm will be given house allowance of Sh 175 pm or housed free"

The Court must express its surprise at the manner in which this important item had been introduced in the demands for the revision of the Collective Agreement

However, the parties embarked on negotiations and settled the most important item of wages. The Respondents' approach on the wage question was based on the premise that as in the past they were negotiating a wage increase on the minimum consolidated rates. The Claimants' approach however was different and they expected the payment of a house allowance in addition to wage increases.

The parties reached a deadlock at this point

The Claimants submitted that housing was a national problem and that their members were paying high rents for very poor accommodation in Mombasa They pointed out that many upaths.

should be given adequate house allowance to be able to live in decent accommodation. They referred the Court to relevant passages in the Ndegwa Commission and the Employment Act

The Respondents strongly maintained that they had always paid a consolidated wage and the current wage increases given by them were also based on the same principle. They stated that all their employees had reasonable accommodation

The Court has carefully considered the submissions on this issue and has come to the conclusion that if the Claimants are determined to have housing allowance as a separate item then it would be unfair not to give them an opportunity to do so, especially after about 10 years during which time there have been radical changes and the rents have also gone up considerably The Court, however, feels that in the present dispute the wage issue having been settled by the parties out of Court, and in the absence of any evidence on the element for housing in the negotiated wage, it would be not only unfair but also dangerous to go ahead and make an award on housing allowance The Court cannot proceed to make an award on such an important item as housing allowance in isolation of the wage agreement Items like house allowance and other fringe benefits represent both a very important part of income to many workers and a substantial cost to employers and wage assessments must therefore take them fully into account As has been pointed out, in this dispute the parties have already concluded a wage agreement

This has put the Court in a very difficult position and the best that the Court can do under the circumstances is at this stage to rule that the Claimants have won the right to a separate housing allowance which should however be negotiated when the present agreement which has come into force with effect from 1st January, 1972, is to be revised. The parties will then be in a position to take a realistic look at this issue along with the wage issue.

Issue 2—To determine the Employers refusal to include clause in agreement which provides for employees to be paid terminal payment when he/she loses a job on the account of warnings

The Claimants demand that if a worker is dismissed under the provisions of the clause on warning letters then he should be treated as if his services have been terminated by the employer in ordinary circumstances and he should be given salary in heu of notice and paid all his terminal benefits. They said there was no reason why a person who has been warned for minor offences and is unlucky to lose his job after three warnings should be treated in the same way as a worker who is summarily dismissed for gross misconduct

The Respondents on the other hand while accepting the principle of paying such a worker his terminal benefits strongly resisted the payment of pay in lieu of notice to such a worker on the ground that on the commission of a fourth offence he is liable to summary dismissal

It is accepted by both parties that there was no system of warnings in the previous Collective Agreement and the Court is satisfied that the parties have during negotiations agreed on such a clause in the following terms —

"An employee whose work or conduct is unsatisfactory, and/or who commits an offence which, in the opinion of the employer does not warrant instant dismissal shall be warned in writing

The following procedure will be followed —

- (a) The 1st, 2nd and 3rd warning/s shall be recorded on his/her record card and shop stewards informed
- (b) If an employee with three warnings recorded on his/her card commits a fourth offence he/she will be liable to summary dismissal
- (c) If an employee completes 365 consecutive days from the date of the last warning without further fault any warning/s recorded on his/her card will be cancelled
- (d) The third warning letter will be copied to the Union's General Secretary"

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that a worker who is dismissed under the provision of the aforesaid clause on the warning system should be paid his terminal benefits

The parties have agreed that the terminal benefits are to be as applied in the redundancy clause of their agreement

The wording is quite clear and the Court rules that a worker is not entitled to any notice pay but is entitled to terminal benefits only


