Transport and Allied Workers' Union (Kenya)

Kenatco Transport Co Ltd

Issues in dispute —

- 1 Wages increase
- 2 Mileage allowance
- 3 Payment of overtime to taxi drivers for public holidays

1 The Transport and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenatco Transport Co Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 5th day of January, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The parties had entered into a Collective Agreement effective from 1st July, 1971, for a period of 12 months. The Court was told that the duration period in the past had also always been 12 months only

The Claimants forwarded a comprehensive new Collective Agreement to the Respondents reviewing major items like wages, mileage allowance, overtime and other fringe benefits

A meeting of the parties was arranged for 27th July, 1972, for the purpose of discussing the revision of the Collective Agreement. However, prior to this meeting the Respondents held a meeting with the shop stewards on 25th July to discuss the company operations. The minutes of this meeting were made available to the Court and show that the Chairman had referred to the historical development of the company particularly the many financial difficulties it has had to face over the years 1968-1970. He informed the meeting that unless steps and care were taken the company may face eventual collapse. The operating costs were also discussed, these showed them to be very high in a tight competitive market and that some departments were operating at a loss.

Forward planning was also discussed and the Chairman explained that with the present trend and sacrifices recovery was possible during the next couple of years.

With this background the parties met on 27th July to discuss the Claimants' demands. The Respondents' stand was that because of their current financial position which had already been made known to the shop stewards they found it considerably difficult in considering a rise in salary. They laid all the confidential facts before the meeting. Apart from a few minor adjustments in the salary of Receptionists, Typists and Telephone Operators, nothing else was offered.

The Claimants in a spirit of give and take dropped all their demands except those on wage increases, mileage claims and payment of overtime to taxi drivers for public holidays.

On 19th August, 1972, the Claimants declared a dispute with the Ministry of Labour on the said three items.

A Conciliator was appointed and on 13th September he reported a deadlock. At the conciliation the parties' stand was—

"The Union claims were that their negotiated agreement had expired and they wanted to review the whole structure of salaries and allowances for their unionizable members either to be effected by a percentage rise or in actual figures in all categories. Messrs Kenatco argued strongly that the due economic conditions prevailing in the firm and noting the competitive nature of the transport industry, they felt strongly that they could not effect changes of salaries and allowances. Their argument was backed up by the fact that of late due to the policies of Zambia, Tanzania and Uganda Governments a business at that end has become very slack and in some cases Kenatco was operating some routes at a loss. What they wanted was at least a breathing space of at least one year, when the whole matter should be reviewed. The Union did not agree with the Management's claim and as such they agreed to disagree on all three issues. The Conciliator therefore has the honour to report back that he recorded a deadlock on all the issues."

The parties then decided to refer the dispute to the Industrial Court and signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 24th October, 1972, and the Labour Commissioner issued his certificate on 30th October, 1972.

During the hearing the Respondents maintained their original stand and pleaded financial inability to meet the Claimants' demands for an increase in wages, mileage allowance and overtime rates for taxi drivers during public holidays. They put forward in details the setbacks they had suffered and strongly submitted that despite their numerous difficulties the level of their wages and fringe benefits were very reasonable and in many cases much higher than their competitors.

The Respondents pointed out that in their industry drivers were the people who really mattered and they were highly paid by them. At present a driver on the Zambia run did two round trips in a month and earned Sh 900 by way of mileage allowance in addition to a safari allowance of Sh 35 per day on top of his wage.

On the issue of overtime for drivers they submitted that a fixed allowance had been agreed because it was felt by all concerned that due to the practical difficulties involved this was the best way of remunerating their drivers who would be involved in working longer than their agreed working hours. They asked the Court not to tamper with this agreement and in view of their financial difficulties to leave the agreed fixed allowance as at present.

The Respondents produced to the Court the financial statements duly audited in support of their plea of financial inability to meet the Claimants' demands. They asked the Court to award a standstill until at least 30th June, 1974.

The Claimants on the other hand maintained that the Respondents enjoyed good business and were making a lot of money. They stated that in the previous 24 months ending on 30th June, 1972, some workers had received a negligible increase of Sh 14 and others only a 5 per cent increase.

The Claimants stressed that it was impossible for them to accept a standstill as suggested by the Respondents because the workers would not accept it and it would lead to much industrial unrest.

The Claimants informed the Court that in July, 1972, they had accepted the redundancy of some 20 workers on the clear understanding that the Respondents would favourably consider their demand for a wage increase when the time came. The Claimants put in various other agreements in their industry in support of their argument that the Respondents' wage rates and fringe benefits were low.

The Court notes that about 400 workers are involved in this dispute and that the Collective Agreement which is being revised contains the following provisions on the three issues in dispute —

After a careful consideration of all the submissions and after perusal of the financial statements produced by the Respondents the Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents are entitled to some consideration in this respect. The Court is satisfied that the Respondents have gone through a very difficult period but indications are that things are improving and if this trend continues the Respondents will soon be in a satisfactory position.

The Court awards that from 1st July 1972, to 31st December, 1972, there should be a wage increase of Sh 10 p.m. and from 1st January, 1973, the workers should get a further wage increase of Sh 20 p.m.

The Court rules that the award should remain in force up to 31st December, 1973.

The Court further directs that the adjustments in the salaries of Receptionists, Typists and Telephone Operators should be

implemented as proposed by the Respondents and these employees will also be entitled to benefit from the Court award.

The Court rules that the mileage allowance and payment of overtime to taxi drivers for public holidays should continue as at present.

The Claimants had asked the Court to rule that the Court award should apply to their members only but the Court would like to point out that this is not an issue in dispute and in any case the parties are bound by the provisions of their Recognition Agreement. In these circumstances the Court cannot comply with the Claimants' demand on this matter.

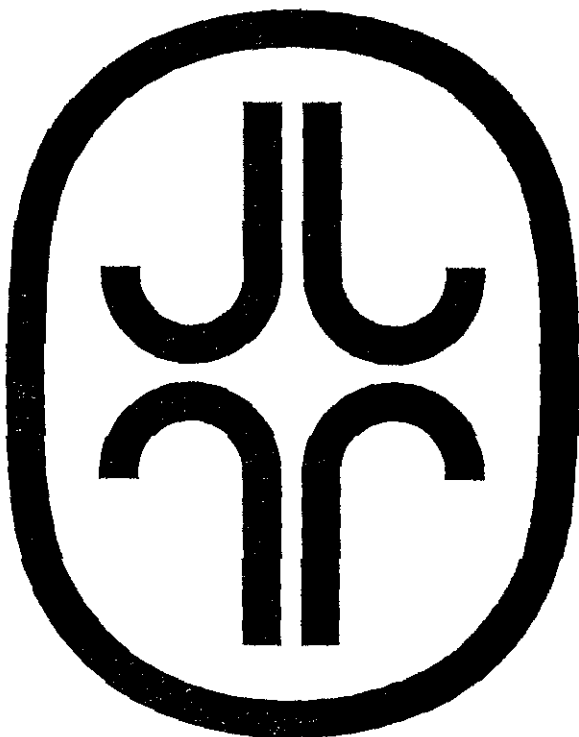
