NOTICE is hereby given that The East African Power and Lighting Company, Limited, a limited liability company having its registered office at Electricity House, Harambee Avenue, Nairobi, Kenya, the holder of Distributing Licence No 8 (Nakuru and District) dated the 14th day of November, 1930 (hereinafter called the Applicant") will on the 16th day of April, 1973, pursuant to the provisions of section 36 and section 129 of the Electric Power Act (Cap 314), apply to the Minister for Power and Communications to extend the provisions and the area of supply the subject of the said licence by the inclusion for the remainder of the period of the said licence and for the period of any extension or renewal thereof of the area (hereinafter called "the Scheduled Area") the particulars of which are set out in the Schedule hereto.

The object of and the reasons for the application are to enable the Applicant to provide a supply of electrical energy by way of general supply or otherwise to such public or local authorities, companies, persons or bodies of persons in the Scheduled Area as may require the same. It is the opinion of the Applicant that the granting of the application will be equitable to the Applicant and to consumers in every area of supply concerned or affected and no licensee or consumer in any area of supply will be unduly prejudiced thereby.

No area will be affected by the grant of the application save and except the Scheduled Area, and the public or local authorities, companies, persons or bodies of persons who may be affected by such grant and the manner in which they may be affected is as follows—

- (a) The Municipal Council of Nakuru and the County Council of Central Rift to the extent envisaged by section 19 of the Electric Power Act
- (b) Public and local authorities, companies, persons and bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in the Scheduled Area in that they may become entitled to requisition from the Applicant a supply of electrical energy as provided by the Electric Power Act
- (c) Public and local authorities, companies, persons, or bodies of persons desiring to give a supply of electrical energy on sale in the Scheduled Area in that the giving of such supply will be precluded by such grant except so far as they may be authorized under section 4 of the Electric Power Act
- (d) The Government of Kenya and the Provincial Administration for the Rift Valley Province to the extent of their general interests in the development and welfare of the Scheduled Area

Copies of the draft endorsement and a plan showing the Scheduled Area may be inspected at the registered office of the company in Nairobi, and at the offices of the Provincial Commissioner at Nakuru.

Kenya Union of National Parks Employees

and

Kenya National Parks

Issue in dispute — Unjustified dismissal of a Union member, Mr Henry Chege

1 The Kenya Union of National Parks Employees shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Kenya National Parks shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 30th day of January, 1973 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. In addition the Respondents called two witnesses —

Mr Joseph Mburugu
Mr B Ashihundu

AWARD

3 Mr Henry Chege was employed by the Respondents in May, 1964. From that date until 10th September, 1971, he remained in Nairobi when he was transferred to Mt Elgon National Park. At some time in November he asked the Warden in charge for a transfer to either Nairobi or Lake Nakuru National Park claiming that his health was suffering as a result of being stationed at Mt Elgon. He was advised by the Warden that as no vacancy existed in these two parks he could not be transferred at that time, if his health was adversely affected he should obtain a medical certificate when his case could be reviewed.

On 1st December he was provided with an official Order Form for transport from Kitale to Nairobi by the Warden in charge of Mt Elgon and accordingly travelled on that day to Nairobi. Between 1st December and 4th December he reported to the Respondents' Personnel Officer at Nairobi and put forward his case in person for a transfer on medical grounds. He was told by the Personnel Officer that there was no vacancy which he could fill at either Nairobi or Lake Nakuru and in the absence of a health certificate relevant to his employment at Mt Elgon he must return to duty at that station.

On 4th December the Personnel Officer spoke to the Warden in charge of Mt Elgon and told him to expect Mr Chege's return to duty within a few days as his application for transfer had not been approved.

On 7th December the Warden issued a letter addressed to Mr Chege advising him that he had deserted from duty on 1st December, 1971, and that he was dismissed from the Respondents' services forthwith. At that date Mr Chege had not returned to duty at Mt Elgon.

On 12th December the Personnel Officer, in the course of his duties, met Mr Chege in Nairobi Park's compound. On 14th December a letter was issued by the Respondents' Director addressed to the Warden, Education Centre, Nairobi, and copied to the Warden, Elgon National Park, advising that Mr Chege had been dismissed from the Respondents' services with effect from 1st December, 1971. This letter asked the Warden to make the necessary arrangements to settle Mr Chege's financial entitlement at the date of dismissal. Mr Chege complained to the Claimants concerning his dismissal. Accordingly the Claimants wrote to the Respondents on 10th January asking for detailed grounds for Mr Chege's dismissal and on the same date the Respondents replied stating that he had deserted from Mt Elgon National Park without even informing his immediate superior of his movement.

On 17th January the Claimants wrote again to the Respondents asking for the date of the alleged desertion. In their letters dated 29th January and 29th February, 1972, the Respondents advised the Claimants that as Mr Chege had decided to transfer himself to Nairobi without the knowledge of the Warden and despite instructions to return to his place of work his desertion was effective from 1st December, 1971.

The Claimants rejected the grounds for dismissal and reported the existence of a trade dispute, on 13th April, 1972, a Ministry of Labour investigator was appointed and on 7th July his findings were reported to both parties —

"It is quite clear from the submissions by both parties that Mr Chege was stationed at Mt Elgon National Park. With

the knowledge of the Park Warden he proceeded to Nairobi on 1st December, 1971, where he represented his case for a transfer to Nairobi or Nakuru which request was turned down as had been the case previously. As a result of Mr Chege's request being turned down he chose not to return to Mt Elgon National Park as instructed by the Personnel Officer. Eventually when he was contacted he categorically stated that he would not return to Mt Elgon National Park. Whereabouts of Mr Chege from 2nd to 14th December, 1971, have not been accounted for nor is there a reason why Mr Chege could not have complied with instructions issued to him by the Personnel Officer. There is no evidence produced to the effect that Mr Chege was not liable for transfer. There is also no evidence to show that Mr Chege was only liable for a transfer subject to his consent. In the absence of such submissions it is assumed that Mr Chege was liable for transfer subject to exigencies of the service.

There is no evidence that Mr Chege could not continue serving at Mt Elgon National Park for health reasons or any other justifiable cause.

In conclusion Mr Chege's absence from 2nd to 14th December 1971, the date of his dismissal has not been accounted for and for this reason there is no doubt that he was absent from his work without the employers' permission which of course rendered him liable to dismissal.

Therefore the employers' action in dispensing with Mr Chege's services for absence without permission was a normal action on the part of an employer.

It is therefore recommended to both parties to accept the above conclusion as a basis for the settlement of the reported trade dispute."

On 10th July, 1972, the Claimants advised the Ministry of Labour that the recommendations of the investigator were rejected and on 22nd August, 1972, both parties agreed to refer the dispute to the Industrial Court signing the Notification of Dispute Form "A".

During the hearing the Claimants asked the Court to consider two main points: why was Mr Chege dismissed and was his dismissal justified? It was the Claimants' strong argument that Mr Chege had left Mt Elgon on 1st December, 1971, with the full knowledge and consent of the Warden in charge and that this was amply proved by the issue to him by the Warden of a travel document authorized for a journey on 1st December from Kitale to Nairobi. The Claimants submitted therefore that his absence from Mt Elgon on 1st December was authorized and no question of desertion on that date arose.

The Respondents maintained that Mr Chege's departure from Mt Elgon on 1st December, 1971, was permitted only to allow him to press his case for a transfer in the headquarters in Nairobi and having failed to obtain agreement from the headquarters he should have returned. The Respondents urged strongly that by his failure to return to Mt Elgon, having been instructed to do so he had disobeyed a lawful order and his desertion took place on the date on which he left his station at Mt Elgon.

After careful consideration of the submissions of both parties and the evidence of witnesses the Court is satisfied that Mr Chege failed to return to his duty station at Mt Elgon having been instructed to do so by the Personnel Officer, furthermore, that at no time did Mr Chege produce any medical certificate to account for his failure to resume duty. The Court finds therefore that Mr Chege deserted from his employment.

The Court accepts that Mr Chege left Mt Elgon on 1st December, 1971, with the authority of the Warden to press his case in Nairobi and had he returned to duty at Mt Elgon after receiving instruction from the Personnel Officer no action would have been taken against him. Taking into consideration a reasonable time for Mr Chege to make for his return to Mt Elgon after 4th December the Court rules that Mr Chege deserted from the Respondents' employment on 7th December, 1971, and accordingly his dismissal shall be from that date.

CAUSE NO 36 OF 1972

Parties —

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and

Distributive and Allied Trades Association

Issue in dispute —

Increase in leave travelling allowance of non-clerical staff

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Distributive and Allied Trades Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 1st day of February, 1973 and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The parties had entered into an Agreement on 6th June 1968 and provided therein that terms and conditions of service shall be open for revision again on 30th November 1970. However, the Tripartite Agreement extended the life of this Agreement by 12 months. Accordingly the Claimants submitted their proposals for revising it in early 1971

Following these proposals and counter proposals by the Respondents a Joint Industrial Council meeting took place at Mombasa on 12th and 13th November 1971. Another meeting of the JIC took place on 9th December, 1971

As there was deadlock on certain items the Respondents took the initiative and reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour on three items namely overnight rate of safari allowance, proposals on discipline and wages

While the dispute was being handled by the Ministry of Labour the Respondents made approaches to the Claimants with a view to making another effort to settle their differences at their own level, i.e. at a JIC meeting. On 26th January, the Ministry of Labour appointed a conciliator but the parties met at a JIC meeting on 28th January, 1972

Since agreement was reached on the items in dispute as reported by the Respondents it was withdrawn from the Ministry of Labour. The Respondents then prepared a draft agreement and forwarded it to the Claimants on 1st February 1972

The Claimants spotted a few errors and pointed them out to the Respondents. It was at this time that the Claimants mentioned to the Respondents that although agreement had been reached in respect of leave travelling allowance for non-clerical staff granting them an increase of Sh 50 this amendment had not been made in the agreement which the Respondents had forwarded to the Claimants. The Claimants asked for a meeting to clear this point along with one or two other matters. The Respondents rejected the idea of a meeting although they made certain amendments to the agreement as pointed out by the Claimants but on the issue in dispute they pointed out that no agreement had been reached as claimed by the Claimants and the Respondents were of the firm view that the Claimants had dropped their demands in respect thereof

The Claimants reported a trade dispute on this item on 17th July, 1972 and a conciliator was appointed on 24th July but he was unsuccessful. The parties then signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" which was forwarded to the Industrial Court on 30th October, 1972 along with the Labour Commissioner's Certificate signed on 11th October 1972

The leave travelling allowance applicable prior to the current negotiations read as follows —

"Non clerical"

Those employees whose salaries are Sh 300 or less shall get a leave allowance of Sh 75 p.a. when proceeding on leave and those employees whose salaries are above Sh 300 shall get Sh 100 p.a. when proceeding on leave

Clerical

Those employees whose salaries are Sh 650 or less shall get Sh 100 p.a. when proceeding on leave and those employees whose salaries are above Sh 650 shall get Sh 150 p.a. when proceeding on leave "

This item was raised at the JIC meeting of 12th and 13th November, and the discussions that took place are recorded in para 7 of the relevant minutes. As this has an important bearing on the dispute it is reproduced below in full —

"Leave travelling allowance"

The Union's representatives proposed that the clause be changed to provide for social distinctions in the application of this particular clause and also to discriminate on the basis of service. Specifically they proposed that employees earning from Sh 100 to Sh 500 per month and with less than five years' service be granted an allowance of Sh 250 p.a., employees with over five years' service Sh 350. Employees earning in excess of Sh 500 a month and less than Sh 999 p.m. with less than five years' service should be granted an allowance of Sh 350 and with over five years' service Sh 450. Employees earning Sh 1,000 a month and over and with less than five years' service an allowance of Sh 450 and with over five years' service an allowance of Sh 600. The employer representatives expressed the view that this clause could more properly relate itself to employees' actual travelling costs. If this view was unacceptable, then it was proposed that the non clerical categories receive an allowance of Sh 100 and that in the clerical categories the allowance of the first group of employees be increased to Sh 150 and in the second category Sh 200 "

The Claimants submitted that after the above discussions they were left with a clear impression that this item was not posing any serious problem and it would be settled quite easily. They were given this impression when there was a break in the JIC meeting at 2.36 p.m. to 3 p.m. on 13th November, 1971

The Claimants maintained that if there was no agreement then why did the Respondents not table their proposals on this item at the next meeting of the JIC. The Claimants also stated that when the Respondents offered Sh 100 by way of leave travelling allowance they were under the impression that they were offering Sh 25 increase on the first category of non-clerical which had become defunct as there was no employee now earning less than Sh 300 p.m. It was at this stage that the Claimants urged the Respondents that any increase must maintain the present differential between the various categories

The Claimants submitted that—

- (a) the Respondents did not reject their last demand at the JIC meeting of 12th-13th November, 1971, therefore it should be deemed to have been accepted by them and formed the basis of an agreement,
- (b) even if there was no agreement their demand for an increase of Sh 50 on the existing leave travelling allowance of Sh 100 was reasonable since it had stood unvaried since 1964 and the Court should make an award in their favour

The Respondents' submissions in brief are —

- "(a) There is no doubt that at the Joint Industrial Council meeting held on the 12th and 13th November, 1971, no agreement was reached on Leave Travelling Allowance
- (b) The Claimants had a further opportunity of raising this question when they approved the minutes at the next meeting on the 9th December, 1971. This they did not do and Respondents assumed they had dropped this claim
- (c) The Claimants received a copy of Respondents' letter to the Minister of Labour dated 28th December, 1971, reporting a dispute. They therefore had a further opportunity before the Tripartite Committee met of adding to the items in dispute. This they failed to do
- (d) They had another opportunity of adding to the matters in dispute when they received the letter from the Permanent Secretary dated 26th January, 1972, accepting the dispute on three items but not including Leave Travelling Allowance. This they failed to do
- (e) In an endeavour to reach final agreement a further JIC meeting was held on 28th January, 1972—Claimants never mentioned Leave Travelling Allowance
- (f) Claimants first mentioned this item in their letter dated 7th February, 1972, after Respondents had circulated the new agreement and advised employers to implement the increased rates and conditions as from 1st December, 1971 "

The Respondents asked the Court to reject the Claimants' demand

The Court finds it quite clearly established from the minutes of the JIC meeting on 12th-13th November that there was no agreement either specific or implied on this item. In fact the difference between the parties was considerable

It is futile for the Claimants to argue that during the break they were given to understand that agreement would be reached on this item on certain lines. The Respondents denied any such indication having been given by them. The Court must state that was it to pay any credence to such without prejudice and very informal talks then very soon an impossible situation would be created. The Court must be guided by the minutes of these meetings which were not challenged.

The Court finds it important that despite it having been agreed at the conclusion of the J I C meeting of the 12th-13th November, 1971, that the Claimants would set down in writing their views on the outstanding items they did not include the issue of leave travelling allowance in the paper they tabled at the next J I C meeting on 9th December, 1971, when they made proposals on wages, probationary period and some eight other items.

To make matters worse for the Claimants and which the Court finds puts the matter beyond any doubt is the fact that it was clearly agreed at the J I C meeting of 28th January, 1972, that other matters would be left as at present. It was at this meeting that final agreement was made on the three items in respect of which the Respondents had reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour.

The Court is satisfied that a final agreement was reached on the basis of a package deal as the Claimants had ample opportunity of raising this item as being in dispute but they had failed to do so all along.

The Court would like to emphasize that if it allows the Claimants to go back on their agreement with the Respondents by agreeing to this demand then it would be creating a most undesirable precedent which would have serious repercussions on the industrial relations in Kenya. The Court cannot do that and the Claimants' demand is accordingly rejected because a final agreement on all matters was reached between the parties at the J I C meeting of 28th January, 1972.

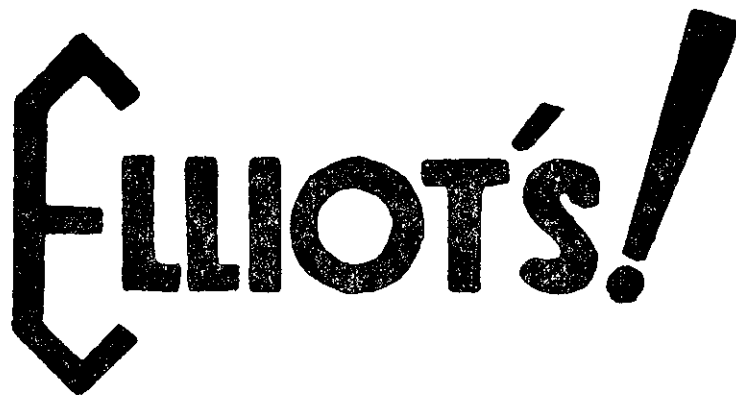
