## Issue in dispute — Recognition

1 The E A Federation of Building and Construction Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the six companies shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 21st day of February, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

## AWARD

3 All the aforesaid Respondents have signed separate Notification of Dispute Form "A" but during the mention the parties agreed to consolidate these disputes and the hearing accordingly proceeded on that basis

The Claimants have a Recognition Agreement dated 1st April, 1968, with the Pre-Cast Manufacturing Group of the Federation of Kenya Employers (hereinafter referred to as the FKE) as sole representatives of this Group's employees. It is of interest to note that prior to this recognition two other unions also, namely Kenya Chemical Workers' Union and Kenya Quarry and Mine Workers' Union, were interested in representing the employees in this Group and were endeavouring to recruit them into their unions

This resulted in a demarcation dispute between the three unions and was referred to the Demarcation Committee which met on 8th February, 1968. As a result of the Committee's decision the Claimants were granted the right to represent such workers employed by the pre-cast manufacturers in Kenya

Thereafter the Claimants and the Pre Cast Manufacturing Group entered into two Collective Agreements on 7th August, 1968 and 4th February, 1970. The Court was told that negotiations are taking place for the third Collective Agreement

After the aforesaid 1968 Collective Agreement was signed the Claimants forwarded it to all their branches with instructions to secure its implementation by all the pre cast manufacturers in Kenya. The Claimants' Mombasa Branch also received these instructions and the Respondents were approached on various dates for recognition and implementation of this agreement

The Respondents, however, rejected the Claimants' demand and the branch reported the matter to the Claimants headquarters. The Claimants pursued this matter further but no progress was made. In August, 1970, they took up this matter once again with greater vigour and the Senior Labour Officer, Mombasa, was also involved in it but the Respondents were adamant

The matter was referred to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, and the Chief Industrial Relations Officer came into the picture. On 13th April, 1971, the Claimants officially reported the existence of a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour. The dispute was accepted and the Senior Labour Officer, Mombasa, was asked to look into the matter

From then on the matter dragged on with numerous letters being exchanged between the parties and the Senior Labour Officer, Mombasa, several joint meetings were held and others arranged but did not take place. The Senior Labour Officer tried his utmost to make the Respondents recognize the Claimants but without any success

An important letter was written by the Respondents' advocates to the Claimants on 29th November, 1971, in which it was stated that all the Respondents were engaged in manufacturing pre-cast concrete products only therefore they did not fall in the category of building and construction work and were not eligible to recognize the Claimants

The letter further pointed out that the Claimants' 1968 Collective Agreement clearly excluded the pre cast manufacturers from the scope of that agreement

The Claimants admitted that there was this omission in the 1968 Agreement but they rectified this in the 1970 Agreement

The other important events that transpired were two strikes towards the end of November and December, 1971, and November, 1972. One of these strikes lasted 24 days

On 2nd October, 1972, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, wrote to the Respondents as follows —

"In accordance with the Trade Disputes Act, Recognition Agreement is acceptable as a trade dispute and in this connexion your attention is drawn to section 2 (b) of the Act

There are three ways through which this trade dispute can be resolved—

- (i) you recognize the Union through the Pre-Cast Concrete Manufacturing Industries Group of the Federation of Kenya Employers by implementing the agreement between the Union and the Group on terms and conditions of service, or
- (ii) enter into a separate Recognition Agreement between yourself and the Union and then have new terms and conditions of service applicable to your employees concluded between both parties, through the necessary machinery, or
- (iii) refer the dispute on Recognition to the Industrial Court. You can then advance your reasons in the Industrial Court on your refusal to recognize the Union

Will you please consider the above points taking into account the contents of my letter quoted above and let me know immediately of the action you are taking to have this long outstanding trade dispute resolved"

This letter also had no effect and many further letters were exchanged between the parties, the Senior Labour Officer, Mombasa, and the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour. Eventually there was the 24 days' strike in November, 1972, which ended on 26th November after the following return to work formula was signed by the parties —

- "1 Work is to be resumed immediately
- 2 There will be no victimization by either party for either having or not having taken part in the strike
- 3 As the dispute has been referred to the Industrial Court, both parties undertake to maintain industrial peace"

During the hearing the Claimants severely criticized the Respondents' attitude right from 1968 when they were approached for recognition and said that they were avoiding recognition because they wanted to continue the exploitation of their employees. The Claimants submitted the details of rates of pay of the Respondents' employees which showed a much lower rate than the Collective Agreement with the Pre Cast Manufacturing Group of FKE and a complete absence of any fringe benefits

The Claimants added that the Respondents had completely defied the advice of the Ministry of Labour and had persisted in refusing the Claimants due recognition. The Claimants referred to the ILO Convention No 98 of 1949 which guarantees the promotion of machinery for voluntary collective bargaining, consultation and co operation at all levels of the undertaking

The Claimants submitted that the demarcation dispute they had with the other unions had cleared the way for them to be the sole representatives of workers engaged by the pre cast manufacturers and since the Respondents were wholly engaged in this business they had no valid grounds to refuse them recognition

The Claimants asked the Court to award the following —

- "(a) The reinstatement of all employees of the Respondents who are either locked out or suspended or dismissed

during this period of unexpected event without loss of their entitlements due to them and seniority

(b) The immediate recognition of the Claimants either individually or through Pre Cast Concrete Manufacturing Group of the F K E and implementation of the agreement (wages, terms and conditions of employment) between the Union and the F K E's group as a national condition

(c) The payment of salaries and wages backdated from 1st July, 1968, and in conformity with the agreement of Pre-Cast Concrete Manufacturing Group of F K E and our Union "

The Respondents maintained that while they were prepared to recognize a trade union the Claimants were not that union because the Respondents were not engaged in building and construction work but manufactured one of the items from numerous others which were used in the building trade

They stated that the Kenya Quarry & Mine Workers' Union had also approached them but denied any collusion with them against the Claimants. They produced a list of firms which they alleged were engaged in the business of block manufacturers but had recognized the Kenya Quarry & Mine Workers' Union. The Respondents also pointed out that Bamburi Portland Cement Co also manufactures pre-cast concrete products but recognized Kenya Chemical Workers' Union. Finally the Respondents doubted if the Court had the power to order an employer to recognize a union to the exclusion of the others and submitted that recognition was a matter of agreement

The Court finds it proved that the Claimants' constitution enables them to accept as members and represent workers engaged in pre-cast concrete manufacturing trades further the Pre Cast Manufacturing Group of the F K E had recognized the Claimants after a demarcation dispute between the three unions namely the Claimants, the Quarry Workers' Union and the Kenya Chemical Workers' Union in 1968. Since then two Collective Agreements had been negotiated and the third one was in the process of being finalized

There is no doubt that a large number of pre-cast manufacturers in Kenya have recognized the Claimants and the Court accepts the Claimants' explanation regarding the activities of the firms which were referred to by the Respondents which is that most of them are engaged in quarrying work and do not manufacture pre cast concrete products

During the hearing some doubt was cast as to the major activity of the Respondents—whether they were predominantly engaged in quarrying work or the manufacture of pre cast concrete products. The Court decided to resolve the doubt by calling for a factual report from the Senior Labour Officer, Mombasa. The Court has had this report and in view of its contents and that of the Respondents' own advocate's letter referred to hereinbefore in the award, the Court has no doubt that the Respondents are engaged mainly in the manufacture of pre cast concrete products

The Court has also no doubt that the Claimants have established their position and won the right to recognition from employers engaged in this business

The Court must reject the demand made by the Respondents that they should choose the trade union which they feel is suitable for their industry and also that since they are only connected with the building industry they could not be deemed to be directly within the building and construction industry. Were the Court to accept this demand then it would be going contrary to the well established pattern of trade unionism and industrial relations system in Kenya. That would be a retrograde step and the Court must reject it

The Court has jurisdiction to hear and make awards on "recognition agreements" such jurisdiction having been conferred on it through the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1971

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that the Claimants are entitled to recruit the Respondents' employees as members and should be recognized as being the sole organization to represent their interests and the Court so awards

It is immaterial whether they recognize the Claimants as a group or on an individual basis but the recognition should be finalized within 10 weeks of the date of the award

Now the Court would like to turn to the Claimants' demand for reinstatement of all those employees who they allege were victimized for their trade union activities. The Court has had no details on this matter and in any case this is not an issue in dispute. Neither is the Claimants' demand that the Respondents should implement their Collective Agreement with Pre-Cast Manufacturing Group of the F K E from 1st July, 1968, an issue in dispute

The Court rules that once the recognition is finalized then the parties should embark on negotiations for a Collective Agreement. The Claimants will be at liberty to table their Collective Agreement with the Pre Cast Manufacturing Group of the F K E at such negotiations

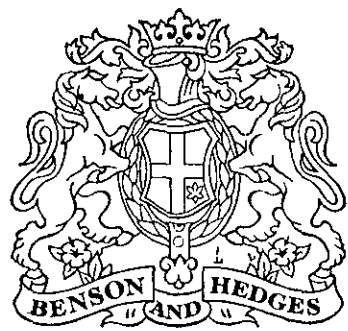
