CAUSE No 4 OF 1973

Parties —

Kenya Motor Engineering & Allied Workers' Union
and
Sagoo Enterprises

Issues in dispute —

- 1 Recognition of the Union by the employer
- 2 Terms and conditions of employment
- 3 Wages
- 4 Effective date and duration of the agreement

1 The Kenya Motor Engineering & Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Sagoo Enterprises shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 27th day of March, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Claimants having recruited according to them a majority of the Respondents' employees into their membership on 1st May, 1971, approached the Respondents for recognition and for operating a check off system in respect of the new union members. This was on 1st August, 1971

The Claimants followed this by forwarding to the Respondents on 13th November, 1971, their comprehensive proposals covering recognition and terms and conditions of employment

The Claimants several attempts to elicit a favourable response from the Respondents on their approaches failed and on 9th March 1972, they reported the existence of a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour on the several issues which are now before the Court

On 15th March, 1972, the Assistant Registrar of Trade Unions wrote to the Respondents on the question of the deduction of union dues and gave them the appropriate warning

The Ministry of Labour accepted the dispute on 21st March, and appointed a Conciliator. The Conciliator arranged three meetings on 25th April, 16th May and 22nd June, 1972, but they did not take place because the Respondents failed to turn up on every occasion. Finally at a meeting of 24th August, 1972, the Respondents did turn up and the meeting ended in a dead lock

The Conciliator informed the Permanent Secretary that "after lengthy discussion Management representatives could not concede to the Union's demand of recognition. They maintained that since recognition of Union is a voluntary aspect, they see no point of recognizing it and that they are prepared to meet Union representatives any time should need arise regarding representation of employee(s)"

The parties then signed a Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 31st August 1972, which was forwarded to the Industrial Court on 3rd February, 1973, with the Labour Commissioner's Certificate dated 29th January, 1973

During the hearing the Claimants maintained that the only reason why the Respondents did not want to recognize them was because they did not want their employees to be represented by a union so that they would continue treating them as previously regarding terms and conditions of employment

They submitted names of some 22 workers who they alleged were employed by the Respondents and who had become their members on 1st May, 1971, and 1st August, 1972

The Claimants stated that the grounds for non-recognition which the Respondents had now put forward were an after thought as they had not raised them during the conciliation meeting as otherwise the Conciliator would have mentioned them in his letter

The Claimants strongly maintained that although the Respondents were extending their building the fact remained that they were engaged in panel beating on a commercial basis. They produced the result of their search at the Registrar General's Department which showed the Respondents were engaged in body building, heavy engineering, etc

They asked the Court to reject the letter of the Labour Officer, Industrial Area, which had been exhibited by the Respondents on the ground that they, the Claimants, had clashed with the said Labour Officer

Finally the Claimants rejected the reference of the dispute to the Demarcation Committee because no other union was objecting to them being recognized by the Respondents

The Respondents pointed out that there was a certain amount of confusion in this dispute as Mr P S Sagoo who is the Respondents' proprietor, used to be a partner in the business of City Panel Beaters from where he had retired after an accident. He had another brother who ran a business under the name of Sagoo Transport Co

The Respondents explained that they were engaged in building work and were currently about to finish the extensions to their property in the industrial area, part of their business was also concerned with investments. They strongly denied that they were engaged in any activity which would bring them within the constitution of the Claimants' Union

The Respondents added that they had at present a labour force of about 50 building workers among whom are five mechanics who are involved in repairing the plant used in the building construction and on a few occasions they had assisted in doing some outside repairs

They requested the Court to note that the Labour Officer in charge of the Industrial Area had carried out an inspection at their premises on 26th January, 1973, and he had applied the Building and Construction Industry Wages Regulation Order to their employees

They completely rejected that they were engaged in motor repairs or panel beating and informed the Court that out of the list of 22 workers produced by the Claimants, only four were on their pay roll

In view of the aforesaid submissions they asked the Court to award that they being an investment and property company, should not be required to enter into a Recognition Agreement with the Claimants. In any case, they submitted, the dispute should have gone to the Demarcation Committee

The Court finds itself in a very difficult position in this dispute because of the very contradictory submissions made by the parties on the relevant and material points and the complete absence of documentary evidence like pay roll, etc, or the evidence on oath of some workers who are alleged to be working for the Respondents as panel beaters

What complicates the matter further is the letter written by the Labour Officer in charge, Industrial Area, dated 26th January, 1973, addressed to the Respondents requiring them to comply with the Building and Construction Wages Regulation Order. It is evident that there is more to this dispute than has been put forward in the submissions by the parties

There is no doubt that in the absence of any other union also trying to win recognition from the Respondents, this dispute could not have gone to the Demarcation Committee. So this leaves the Claimants alone and the issue before the Court is whether the Respondents' activities are such that they fall within the ambit of the Claimants' constitution

In view of this if the necessary evidence had been produced before the Court showing that the Respondents' main activity was panel beating and a majority of their employees were members of the Claimants, the Court would have had no hesitation in awarding that the Respondents should recognize the Claimants. Alternatively if there had been satisfactory and conclusive evidence supporting the Respondents' submissions the Court would have found in their favour

Keeping in mind the aforesaid points the Court has decided that having given its view on the matter, the Chief Industrial Relations Officer should carry out the necessary on the spot investigations that is interview the various employees and peruse the relevant records including pay roll to determine what is the main activity of the Respondents and the total number of employees working for them, how many are Claimants' members and the type of work they do. The Chief Industrial Relations Officer should carry out this investigation in conjunction with the parties' representatives one from each side. Once he has made his findings then the parties should review their stands on the issue of recognition in the light of his findings and resolve the issue in line with the Court's view expressed hereinabove

In case the Claimants win recognition then the parties should embark on negotiations for a collective agreement

Issue in dispute—Alleged wrongful application of rule No 10 (a) and (e) of the terms and conditions of service with particular reference to the appointment of Deputy Chief Fire Officer

1 The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Mombasa Municipal Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 15th day of March, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Respondents, through the Association of Local Government Employers—Committee No 1, are a party to a Collective Agreement (terms and conditions of service for employees in the Salaried Grades) with the Claimants, the effective date of the latest agreement being 1st January, 1970

In this agreement rule 10 (a) provides that appointments to scales 1-19 shall be made by the Council as a result of a public advertisement or on the recommendation of the Head of Department by the promotion of an officer. This rule has four other subsections which will be referred to as the need arises

This dispute has arisen following the vacancy of the post of the Chief Fire Officer which was filled by the existing Deputy Chief Fire Officer whose post as a result fell vacant

There is no dispute that the vacant post of Chief Fire Officer was properly filled, i.e. the vacancy was advertised and the Appointment Sub-committee met and considered the various applications and after interviewing two candidates the selection was made. The unsuccessful candidate for the post of Chief Fire Officer was M A Sururu

This was done at a meeting of the Appointments Sub-committee held on 20th January 1972. The Sub-committee having made the appointment of the Chief Fire Officer also proceeded to make the appointment to the now vacant post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer and selected Mr Sururu for that post despite the Town Clerk having pointed out the requirements of the aforesaid rule 10 (a)

The staff of the Respondents' Fire Brigade, having realized that proper procedure was not followed, sent a petition on the subject to the Town Clerk on 25th January, 1972. The Claimants followed it up by a letter to the Town Clerk on 3rd February, 1972. The Respondents however did not accept the complaint

The Claimants then declared a dispute with the Ministry of Labour on 4th May, 1972. This dispute evoked Press statements from the workers and the Claimants at the material time. The dispute was accepted by the Ministry of Labour and the Senior Labour Officer, Coast Province, was appointed the Conciliator. A meeting was held by the Conciliator with the parties on 20th July, 1972, and the matter ended in a deadlock

The parties then signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" and the Labour Commissioner forwarded it to the Industrial Court with his certificate dated 3rd February, 1973

During the hearing the Claimants stressed that this was a serious violation on the part of the Respondents of the agreed procedure in case of vacant posts being filled and as a result the serving officers and other members of the public who might have been interested in the post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer had been deprived of the opportunity of trying for it

They pointed out that at one stage the Chief Engineer had recommended Robert Katana, a serving officer, to be promoted to the post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer but had subsequently changed his mind and had strongly supported M A Sururu for this post. The Claimants denied that they were canvassing in favour of Mr Katana and maintained that they were only doing their duty as a trade union which was interested in fair play. They also denied that they were interfering in the Management's right to hire and fire

The Claimants submitted that the posts of Chief Fire Officer and his Deputy were two entirely different posts with different salary scales, it was therefore clear that when the post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer fell vacant it should have been advertised publicly because Mr Sururu was not a serving officer who could be promoted on the recommendation of the Head of Department

The Claimants asked the Court to find that the Respondents had violated rule 10 (a) and (e) and to nullify the appointment of Mr Sururu and give a directive that the post should be filled in accordance with the agreed laid down procedure

The Respondents maintained that they had not violated the agreed rule because they had advertised "a post" for which Mr Sururu had applied and it was perfectly in order because of his qualifications that he was accepted for another post which was inter-related to the one he had applied for

The Respondents strongly submitted that the Claimants were guilty of canvassing in favour of Robert Katana and they should be asked to refrain from doing so and not to interfere in the Management's right to hire and fire

The Respondents pointed out that as a result of the controversy the Ministry of Local Government had asked for details and an explanation regarding the filling of the post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer. An explanation was given and the Ministry was satisfied that nothing irregular had taken place

Finally the Respondents warned that the Claimants were trying to introduce a system of closed shop system through the back-door and that such a move should be nipped in the bud

They asked the Court to completely reject the Claimants' demands. The Court finds that clause 10 (a) is very clearly worded and there is no ambiguity about it. It requires that appointments to scales 1-19 shall be made by the Council as a result of a Public Advertisement or on the recommendation of the Head of Department by the promotion of an officer. The words "promotion of an officer" leave no room for doubt that the "officer" means a person already in service with the Council. It is admitted that Mr Sururu was not an employee of the Respondents prior to his appointment as Deputy Chief Fire Officer, the appointment which has been challenged. In view of this he could not have been promoted to this post on the recommendation of the Head of Department. The Court cannot accept the Respondents' submission that he was an "officer" within the meaning of clause 10 (a) as there is no merit in this submission

This then leaves only the first part of 10 (a) under which he could have been appointed. The Court has now to determine if his appointment complies with the procedure laid therein

It is not denied that there was no Public Advertisement for the post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer and that the only relevant Public Advertisement was in respect of the post of the Chief Fire Officer. Mr Sururu applied for this post but the Respondents preferred the then Deputy Chief Fire Officer and selected him. If a serving officer had been appointed to the now vacant post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer on the recommendation of the Head of his Department then there would be no problem. But the Respondents appointed Mr Sururu an outsider to the unadvertised vacant post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer

The Court cannot accept the Respondents' submission that because Mr Sururu had applied for the post of Chief Fire Officer therefore he could be appointed as Deputy Chief Fire Officer. The Court finds that the vacant post of Deputy Chief Fire Officer should have been publicly advertised. It is immaterial that Mr Sururu had the necessary qualifications for that post—the fact remains that other persons in the country including serving officers were deprived of the opportunity of applying for and competing for this job

It is clear that the whole object of filling vacant posts by public advertisements has been defeated in this case. The Court has no hesitation in finding that the Respondents did not apply correctly rule 10 (a) of the Terms and Conditions of Service with particular reference to the Deputy Chief Fire Officer

Now the Court would like to turn to clause 10 (e) which reads —

"Where a serving officer has applied for a post in response to a public advertisement and has the required qualification or experience and is recommended by the appropriate Head of Department, he shall be given priority"

This subclause again does not apply to Mr Sururu as he was not a serving officer. If Mr Katana had applied then it would have been different but there again the serving officer also would have to possess the required qualification or experience and would have to be recommended by the Head of Department

In view of the fact that Mr Katana had not applied for this post according to the Claimants' own submission, the Respondents can hardly be alleged not to have complied with clause 10 (e)

The Court is satisfied that whatever action the Claimants have taken in connexion with this dispute is neither canvassing for any particular candidate nor can it be termed as interference in the Management's right to hire and fire

It is astonishing that the Respondents being fully aware that Mr Sururu's appointment had created a serious dispute between them and the Claimants and that the dispute was being processed at the Ministry of Labour and in the event of deadlock would end in the Industrial Court, went ahead and confirmed Mr Sururu's appointment on 11th January, 1973, with effect from 11th December, 1972. In the circumstances the Court can only say that they have done so at their own risk as to consequences. They could have extended his probation period to 12 months under rule 12 (a) under the special circumstances existing

The risk they have taken is obvious from the Court's finding in that their application of the aforesaid rule 10 (a) was completely wrong and that Mr Sururu's appointment as Deputy Chief Fire Officer is therefore irregular. The Court must point out that the question of Mr Sururu or anyone else being the best man for the job is not an issue before it

In view of the Court's finding it follows that the Respondents should take the necessary steps immediately to comply properly with the agreed rules with particular reference to the appointment of the Deputy Chief Fire Officer

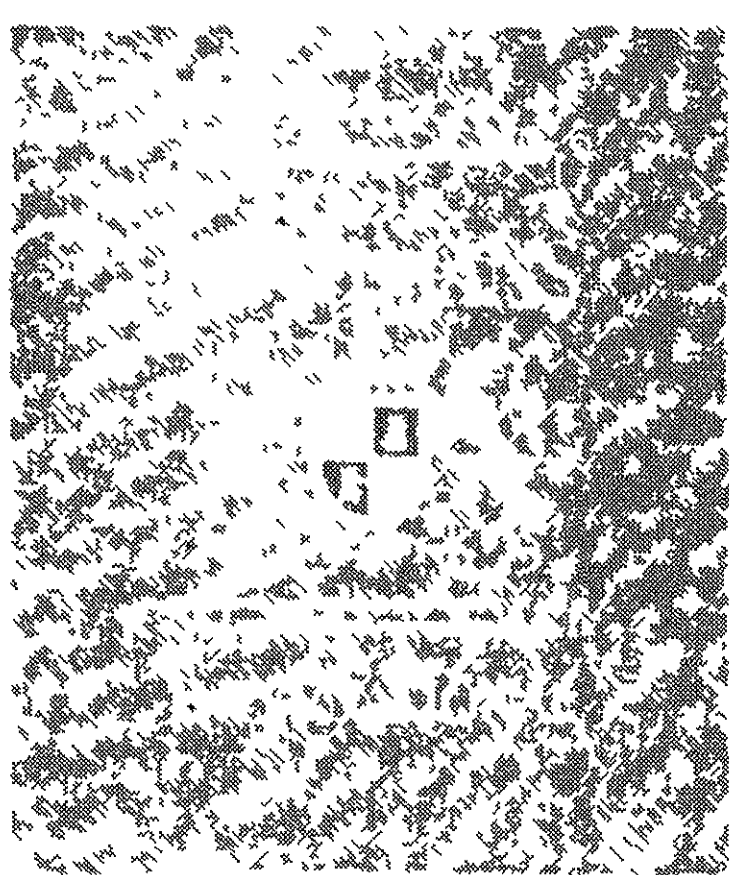
