## THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

## CAUSE No 6 OF 1973

Parties —

Kenya Local Government Workers' Union

and

Masaku County Council

Issue in dispute —

Wrongful termination of employment of Gregory Mwania

1 The Kenya Local Government Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Masaku County Council shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 29th day of March, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

## AWARD

3 The origin of this dispute goes back to events which took place in early 1968 when the Respondents' employees went on strike for the removal of one of their senior officials, Mr Bhatti

Mr Gregory Mwania who at the time was the Claimants' Branch Secretary was the central figure in the events because he was asked on 1st February, 1968, to proceed on transfer to Yatta and to take over duties as a Divisional Revenue Clerk with effect from 2nd February, 1968. The workers went on strike in protest when the posting order was issued

An agreement was reached on 9th February, 1968, between the parties with the assistance of an official of the Ministry of Labour, clauses two and three of this agreement read —

"2 That the two parties agree to undertake that there will be no victimization from either side to—

(a) those who took part in the strike,

(b) those who did not take part in the strike,

(c) those who gave evidence to the Conciliator

3 That the two parties agree to undertake that there will be no obstructions to block the machineries of the appointed Conciliator and Investigator to this crisis before his final decisions are made"

The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, followed this up by a letter to the parties in which he specified the various issues between the parties

The Court is satisfied that the strike ended on 5th February, 1968, and workers resumed duty on 6th February when in the morning Mr Mwania was issued with a letter by the Acting County Treasurer in which it was stated that he had failed to take necessary steps for handing over to another official and had refused to go to Yatta. He was asked to make his position clear whether or not he was prepared to accept the transfer instructions

Mr Mwania did not go to Yatta and on 13th February, 1968, Police was called in connexion with this matter and/or on suspicion of a criminal offence having been committed. As a result Mr Mwania was arrested and taken to Court to answer a criminal charge and was released on bail pending the hearing of the case. On the same day he was issued with a letter of suspension of service

The arrest of Mr Mwania sparked off another strike and the workers strongly reiterated their demands for the removal of Mr Bhatti. Consequently the dispute relating to the removal of Mr Bhatti was referred to the Industrial Court, the dispute

was heard by the Court and award announced on 7th June, 1968—Cause No 12 of 1968. In view of the recommendations in the award, His Excellency the President of the Republic of Kenya set up a Commission of Inquiry to look into the various aspects of the dispute regarding Mr Bhatti and the allegations by the parties ascribing political motives.

The Commission of Inquiry completed its report on 26th February, 1969. Mr Mwania quite naturally figured prominently in the Commission's report. The Claimants referred to the relevant parts in support of their contention that Mr Mwania was cleared of all the allegations against him.

The Court finds that both its award in Cause No 12 of 1968 and the report of the Commission of Inquiry, though relevant to complete the background picture of the present dispute, are not all that important to it. The facts of the present dispute can quite easily be separated from the main string of events on which the Court can make a finding.

Now reverting back to the events directly connected with Mr Mwania, he was convicted by the Resident Magistrate, Machakos, on the criminal charge and on 10th April, 1968, the Respondents dismissed him from their employment under rule 21 (1) of the rules then in force these being "The African District Councils (Staff) Rules, 1959".

Mr Mwania appealed to the High Court of Kenya against his conviction and his appeal was allowed on 29th November, 1968.

On 11th January, 1969, the Respondents' Clerk wrote another letter of dismissal to him in which he revoked his previous letter of dismissal dated 10th April, 1968, but proceeded to list grounds of misconduct for which his services were being terminated again. He was also paid a sum of Sh 10,226/25 in respect of his salary from 13th February, 1968 to 10th January, 1969.

The Claimants challenged Mr Mwania's second dismissal because they maintained that the question of Mr Mwania's transfer had been suspended pending the conciliation agreement and subsequent investigation for the removal of Mr Bhatti.

The Claimants reported the matter to the Ministry of Labour and an investigator was appointed. From then on the matter dragged on with investigators being changed a couple of times and the Respondents agreeing to give consideration to the Claimants' demand for Mr Mwania's reinstatement, but nothing came out of this long delay until 6th January, 1972, when the Permanent Secretary forwarded his recommendation to the parties for the settlement of the dispute. This was —

"In view of the above, and having taken into consideration the full circumstances of the case and the frustrations that this particular employee has faced, and bearing in mind the poor relations that existed between the Union and the Council at the time, I recommend that Mr Mwania be reinstated on a formula to be worked out by the both parties in so far as Mr Mwania's benefits are concerned. If this is found to be unworkable, I recommend Mr Mwania's re-employment."

Following this recommendation the parties held a number of meetings and at one time the Respondents' Clerk asked for a period of three weeks within which he would finalize the matter and report back to the Joint Staff Committee. This was on 14th April, 1972.

The Claimants waited for a positive response from the Respondents until 1st August, 1972, when they asked the Permanent Secretary to refer the dispute to the Industrial Court. The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 15th November, 1972.

The Claimants' submissions in brief are that Mr Mwania had been victimized for his trade union activities and his transfer to Yatta was a demotion, the Respondents' intention being to obstruct the work of the Ministry of Labour officials who were to look into the allegations against Mr Bhatti. They maintained that Mr Mwania was perfectly justified in insisting in staying in Machakos keeping in view the explosive situation existing at the time. In any case Mr Mwania had been cleared of all the allegations against him by the Commission of Inquiry. Furthermore the reasons given by the Respondents for his dismissal on 11th January, 1969, were not true.

They strongly submitted that after Mr Mwania's acquittal by the High Court of Kenya he was in fact reinstated by the Respondents who, however, did not give him an opportunity of resuming duty by wrongfully terminating his services.

They asked the Court to reinstate him to his former job as he had been victimized for being an honest, hard working employee and a vigilant trade union official.

The Respondents denied that they had victimized Mr Mwania for his trade union activities and stated that the real cause of his dismissal was his refusal to obey lawful order of transfer

from his superior. They pointed out that he had been given ample opportunity to make the necessary arrangements for proceeding on transfer to Yatta yet he had defied all orders to that effect. They rejected the allegation that they were trying to hamper the work of the Ministry of Labour officials.

The Respondents pointed out that the Commission of Inquiry had a political rather than an industrial relations mission and while expressing some misgivings had not recommended the reinstatement of Mr Mwania.

Finally the Respondents submitted that in the interest of industrial relations and natural justice the dispute of this nature should be determined within a reasonable time. The time that had been taken by the Ministry of Labour to process this dispute was unacceptably long. In view of their submissions they asked the Court to reject all the Claimants' demands.

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that whereas the original termination of service of Mr Mwania on 10th April, 1968, was proper and within the rules in force at that time, the Respondents having decided to revoke this letter of dismissal on 11th January, 1969, and then proceeding to terminate his service on some other grounds was not proper and was wrongful. In this letter of 11th January, they also sent a cheque to Mr Mwania for Sh 10,226/25 which included his salary payment in full from 13th February, 1968 to 10th January, 1969.

The Court is satisfied that Mr Mwania's conduct between 1st February, 1968 to 13th February, 1968, was prompted by his trade union activities and his transfer to Yatta was not a normal transfer but was an attempt to remove him from the scene where industrial relations were at their worst due to the workers' demand for the removal of Mr Bhatti.

The Court having found that Mr Mwania's services were terminated wrongfully by the Respondents must now consider whether a reinstatement, under the special circumstances to be found in this case, should be awarded.

As already stated earlier on in this award Mr Mwania's services were properly terminated on 10th April, 1968, and it would indeed be very unreasonable to expect the Respondents to keep his job vacant for him until such time as his appeal was heard by the High Court. As it is, the appeal was allowed on 29th November, 1968, some seven months after his dismissal.

To make matters more difficult, it is a fact that now about four years have gone by and it would not be fair or reasonable to ask the Respondents to reinstate Mr Mwania in his job. Indeed it would offend the principles of natural justice in the extreme to do so.

The Court has therefore come to the conclusion that Mr Mwania should not be reinstated but that he should be compensated for the wrongful termination of his services. The Court notes that he is entitled to one month's pay in lieu of notice and that he has been unemployed since his dismissal despite having made efforts to find a job. The Court has decided that he should be paid five months' salary by way of compensation for wrongful termination of his services. Since his salary at the time his services were terminated was Sh 833/35 p.m. the Court awards that he should be paid the following amount —

#### AWARD

##### Issue 1—Payment of full terminal benefits to John Omumbwa

Mr Omumbwa used to work for the Respondents as Director of Social Services to which post he was appointed on 15th December, 1965

On 25th September, 1970, the Respondents decided to suspend him from duties due to the manner in which he was carrying out his duties and after a further meeting of the Finance Committee on 28th September, 1970, a letter of dismissal was served on him the next day. This decision was ratified by a full Council meeting on 30th September, 1970

The Claimants took up the matter on behalf of Mr Omumbwa and as no satisfactory result could be obtained from the Respondents, they reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour

The Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, personally handled the matter and as a result he managed to bring the parties to an agreement to the effect that Mr Omumbwa should be retired in the public interest. The Town Clerk wrote a letter on 14th January, 1971, in which he stated that as a result of the Permanent Secretary's efforts Mr Omumbwa would be retired instead of being dismissed from 29th September, 1970. The Claimants did not accept the date as specified by the Town Clerk from which Mr Omumbwa was to be retired and maintained that the retirement should date from 23rd December, 1970, the day the Council passed the necessary resolution to that effect. The Respondents' Finance Committee however did not accept to retire Mr Omumbwa as arranged by the Permanent Secretary

The relevant minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on 16th December, 1970, when Mr Omumbwa's dismissal was reaffirmed and the Minute No 91 of the full Council meeting held on 23rd December, 1970, when the decision was taken to retire Mr Omumbwa are important and are reproduced below. They are also relevant to Issue No 2

The Committee Minute No 132 reads as follows —

##### *"Trade Dispute between KLGWU and the Council"*

The Committee considered a circular letter Ref KLGWU/TDA/70/12 dated 8th December, 1970, from the General Secretary of the Union reporting the existence of a trade dispute between the Council and the Union over the dismissal of Joseph Mukuria as contained in CIR/FINANCE/52

The Clerk to Council reported also on the threatened strike by the Union over the declared dispute regarding the dismissal of Mr J S Omumbwa, the former Director of Social Services

The Town Clerk read to the Committee a letter Ref ML/IR/4/15/70 dated 15th December, 1970, received from the Ministry of Labour proposing that the dispute over Mr Omumbwa's dismissal be resolved by regarding Mr Omumbwa as having been retired by the Council in the public interest. After considerable discussion, it was agreed—

- (i) that Mr Omumbwa's dismissal in accordance with Minute No 77 of the minutes of the meeting of the Finance Committee held on 28th September, 1970, be reaffirmed,
- (ii) that the Town Clerk be instructed to write to the Ministry of Labour enlightening them on the grounds that led to Mr Omumbwa's dismissal,
- (iii) that the Ministry of Labour be requested to show the reasons on which they advised that Mr Omumbwa be retired in the public interest was based,
- (iv) that as the General Secretary of the Kenya Local Government Workers' Union appears to have been given incorrect information regarding Mr Joseph Mukuria's dismissal, the Town Clerk be instructed to furnish him with the correct details,
- (v) that the decision of the Council regarding Mr Mukuria's dismissal as contained in Minute 5 (III) of the minutes of the meeting of the Finance (Staff) sub-committee held on 13th July, 1970, be reaffirmed

Council Meeting Minute No 91 reads as follows —

- (i) That the decision contained in Minute 132 (I), (II), (III) and (V) of the minutes of the meeting of the Finance Committee held on 16th December, 1970, be rescinded

- (ii) That Mr Omumbwa be retired from the Council's services in the public interest and that he be paid all his retirement benefits

On 18th October, 1971, the Town Clerk conveyed the Council's decision to Mr Omumbwa and stated that his retirement would be with effect from 29th September, 1970, and he would be paid all his terminal benefits less deductions and three months' salary in lieu of notice in full and final settlement of all his claims. Mr Omumbwa asked the Town Clerk to approach the Claimants who did not accept that the retirement date of Mr Omumbwa was 29th September, 1970, and insisted that it was 23rd December, 1970. They had also raised further claims on behalf of Mr Omumbwa which would be dealt with hereinafter. The parties could not resolve the dispute and decided to refer it to the Industrial Court. The necessary certificates and the Notification of Dispute Form "A" were forwarded to the Court on 5th February, 1973

It is not denied that Mr Omumbwa was paid terminal benefits as follows —

The Claimants' demands are —

1 Mr Omumbwa is entitled to full salary for the period 29th September, 1970 to 23rd December, 1970, because he was retired in the public interest by a resolution of the Council on 23rd December, 1970, and since no date of retirement was mentioned in the resolution the effective date was the date of the Council meeting. In addition to this they demand three months' salary in lieu of notice—total amount being six months' salary amounting to £990

2 Gratuity for the period 1955 to 1st January, 1958, when Mr Omumbwa joined the Provident Fund Scheme which amounted to £247 10

3 Cash payment in lieu of accrued leave of 11½ days amounting to £57 15

4 Refund of £132 being the excess rent charged Mr Omumbwa by the Respondents for occupation of a Council house as a staff member from 29th September, 1970 to 23rd December, 1970

5 Compensation for loss of service of 15 years as Mr Omumbwa was retired at the age of 45 whereas the normal retirement age was 60 years according to rule 16 (a). The Claimants submitted that as a result of adverse publicity in the Press at the material time, Mr Omumbwa had lost all chances of getting any employment now

The Claimants had also demanded a sum of £20 being half of Mr Omumbwa's entitlement in respect of travelling allowance but they dropped this claim during the hearing

The Respondents rejected most of these claims as being without any validity and submitted that Mr Omumbwa was entitled to only three months' salary in lieu of notice (which they had been willing to pay him all along) and cash payment in lieu of accrued leave if any. The Respondents strongly maintained that there was absolutely no doubt that Mr Omumbwa was to be retired from 29th September, 1970, the day he was dismissed as through the Permanent Secretary's intervention they had agreed to substitute retirement for dismissal

The Court has carefully considered all the submissions and finds that if the Respondents had intended to retire Mr Omumbwa with effect from 23rd December, 1970, then the resolution would certainly have contained words to that effect. Keeping in mind the background of the dispute the Court finds that the effective date for Mr Omumbwa's retirement was 29th September, 1970, the date he was dismissed because the Court is satisfied that after the Permanent Secretary's effort to solve this dispute the parties agreed to change dismissal to retirement. It should be noted that in the relevant Council Minute 91 it is stated that "decision" contained in Minutes 132 (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) be rescinded. The "decision" refers to dismissal and in the next paragraph it is stated that he should be retired. In view of this finding the Court rules that he is not entitled to salary for the months of October, November and December, 1970, but is entitled to three months' pay only in lieu of notice. The Court accordingly awards that he should get £495 in respect of this claim

The Court is not satisfied on the evidence produced before it that such a senior officer would have been entitled to benefits under a scheme which is restricted to employees earning Sh 150 p.m. or less. This claim is accordingly rejected

The Court has no doubt that Mr Omumbwa is entitled to cash payment in lieu of accrued leave which the Claimants state is 11½ days (£57 15) and the Court awards that he be paid this amount

As far as the question of excess rent is concerned the Court rules that Mr Omumbwa was entitled to occupy a Council house as an employee while his dispute was being processed and he is therefore entitled to a refund of £132 which is alleged to have been overcharged by the Respondents and the Court so awards

Now coming to the claim for compensation for loss of 15 years' service due to Mr Omumbwa being retired at the age of 45 instead of 60 the Court finds that there is no merit in this claim. There is no wrongful termination of service alleged and it was by agreement a retirement in the public interest. The Court accordingly rejects the claim. It should be noted that Mr Omumbwa was paid a sum of Sh 45,114/30 being his terminal benefits due under the Provident Fund

To sum up the Court awards that Mr Omumbwa be paid the following additional amounts —

#### Issue 2—Payment of balance of terminal benefits to Mr J Mukuria

Mr J Mukuria was first employed by the Respondents on 26th May, 1964, as Clerk, Water Section in the Municipal Treasurer's Department and was appointed Revenue Clerk in the same Department on 1st November, 1965. On 1st October, 1968, he was appointed to understudy the then Chief Accountancy Assistant and on 1st November, 1968, he was appointed to understudy the then Rates Clerk

On 26th May, 1970, he received a letter suspending him from duties because over £100 of Council money were missing through manipulation and water deposit refund with which he was connected. The matter was handed over to the Police for investigation and while the investigations were still proceeding, the Respondents dismissed Mr Mukuria on 14th August, 1970

The Claimants took up the matter on behalf of Mr Mukuria alleging that his dismissal was contrary to rule 27 of the terms and conditions of service and asked for payment of his salary during suspension in accordance with rule 27 (b). The Respondents did not accept the Claimants' contention and even a meeting of the Joint Staff Council failed to resolve the dispute

The Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour on 8th December, 1970, and an investigator was appointed. But on 23rd December, 1970, the full Council met and took a decision in the matter—the relevant minute has already been quoted under Issue No 1 hereinbefore

It should be noted that the Police cleared Mr Mukuria in a letter which they wrote to the Town Clerk on 3rd March, 1971. Further that Mr Mukuria had managed to get a job with Egerton College from 1st September, 1970

The Claimants maintain that Mr Mukuria was wrongfully dismissed and since this decision was later rescinded by the Council he is entitled to be paid full salary for the period he remained unemployed (17 days) from 14th August, 1970, and he should be paid the Council's contribution to the Local Government Superannuation Fund together with interest

The Claimants did not press their demand for payment of £18 travelling allowance and it is accepted by the parties that he received the balance of his salary for the days he was on suspension

The Respondents maintained that his services were terminated in accordance with the agreed regulations and although there was not sufficient proof that Mr Mukuria was directly responsible for the alterations and forged signatures he was certainly seriously at fault by inefficient control of his department

They pointed out that Mr Mukuria had been paid terminal benefits as follows —

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court cannot accept that there is sufficient evidence to show that Mr Mukuria was inefficient while in control of his department. If an unknown person in a department has committed a criminal offence it can hardly be reflection of inefficiency on the part of his superior. It should be noted that Mr Mukuria was not charged for any criminal offence. Accordingly the Court awards that the Respondents should advise the Management of the Superannuation Fund that Mr Mukuria should be paid their contribution and interest thereon as well as rule 42 of the Superannuation Fund Rules applies to his case and not rule 37

As far as the claim for 17 days' pay is concerned the Court finds that since the Respondents have paid him salary in lieu of notice he is not entitled to it, neither is he entitled to £18 by way of travelling allowance and both these claims are accordingly rejected

#### Issue 3—Compensation on wrongful termination of Mr Onyango Ahula

Mr Onyango Ahula was employed by the Respondents as a watchman on 2nd January, 1957. On the night of 6th January, 1969, there was an armed robbery at the palace where Mr Ahula was on duty and the robbers made off with Sh 5,000 of the Council money after tying him with ropes to a table

The Police detained Mr Ahula in cells for questioning for five days after which he was released and he resumed duty

On 13th March, 1970, the Respondents decided to terminate his services for "alleged negligence resulting in the robbery of 6th January, 1969"

The Claimants intervened on his behalf and after being unsuccessful at a Joint Council Union meeting, reported the trade dispute to the Ministry of Labour on 10th April, 1970. The dispute was accepted and an investigator was appointed. After the investigation was completed the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, informed the parties that Mr Ahula was completely innocent and recommended that he should be reinstated without loss of seniority in service. He further recommended that Mr Ahula's absence during investigations should be treated as unpaid leave

The Claimants accepted this recommendation but the Respondents rejected them on the ground that the investigator did not get the facts correct

The Claimants now demand compensation for the wrongful termination of his services because he had only another two years to complete before retirement. They asked the Court to award him half salary for every completed year of service or full salary for two years. They further demanded that he be paid gratuity for the 13 years' service with the Respondents

The Respondents stated that a special sub-committee had investigated the conduct of Mr Ahula and although the work of the sub-committee was delayed for nine months it had recommended that he should be dismissed from the Respondents' service with immediate effect. This decision had been approved by the Council at its monthly meeting held on 1st December, 1969, and through an oversight he was not dismissed until 14th March, 1970

They submitted that Mr Ahula was paid his terminal benefits in full, these being Provident Fund—Sh 1,257 55 and Sh 240 in lieu of notice

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court is satisfied that Mr Ahula's services were terminated wrongfully and he is entitled to compensation and the Court awards that he be paid a sum of Sh 1,440 being six months' salary as compensation

As far as gratuity is concerned the Court finds that the gratuity scheme under which payment is sought appears to be an out of date document. In any case the Claimants did not satisfy the Court that Mr Ahula is entitled to any such benefits. This demand is accordingly rejected
