ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS' EXAMINATION, 1973

ATTENTION is invited to Personnel Circular No 6 of 4th April, 1970. This year's Administrative Officers' Examination will be held on Wednesday, 15th, Thursday, 16th and Friday, 17th August, 1973. It should be noted that the decision of the Public Service Commission shall be final on all matters related to this examination.

SCHEME OF THE EXAMINATION

2 The examination will consist of six test papers held over three days as follows —

First Day—Wednesday, 15th August, 1973

- (i) Law (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11 30 a.m.
- (ii) Government Organization and Practices (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4 30 p.m.

Second Day—Thursday, 16th August, 1973

- (iii) Civil Service Regulations (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11 30 a.m.
- (iv) Financial Control and Procedures (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4 30 p.m.

Third Day—Friday, 17th August, 1973

- (v) General Knowledge of East African and World Affairs (2½ hours), 9 a.m. to 11 30 a.m.
- (vi) Applied Logic and Report Writing (2½ hours), 2 p.m. to 4 30 p.m.

SYLLABUSES

3 There is no change to the syllabuses given in Appendix "B" to the Personnel Circular No 6 of 1970.

ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER

4 Personnel Circular No 1 of 4th February, 1971, categorically stated that non-civil servants and those civil servants who do not fall under the Administrative Officers Class IV cadre will not be eligible to enter the Administrative Officers' Examination.

EXEMPTIONS

5 (a) Candidates who attempted this examination previously and passed in one or more subjects, but failed to pass in all the six subjects in order to qualify for a full pass in the whole examination, will be exempted from those subjects in which they passed. They will resit only those subjects in which they failed, in a subsequent examination(s).

(b) Serving officers with legal qualifications from accredited Universities may, on application to the Registrar, High Court of Kenya, be exempted from sitting for Part I of the Law Paper. Law Graduates from the East African Universities, including serving officers who have obtained a pass in the Police Law Examination "B" can, on application, be exempted from the entire Law Paper. All the candidates seeking exemption under this proviso should apply through their Permanent Secretaries/ Heads of Department to the Registrar, High Court of Kenya, giving details and enclosing thereto photostat copies of the relevant documents supporting their claims. Exempted candidates must quote reference numbers of their letters of exemption.

ENTRY FEES

6 It has recently been decided that each candidate entering the Administrative Officers' Examination from this year onwards should pay a Registration Fee of K Sh 20 only, irrespective of the number of subjects he offers.

EXAMINATION ENTRY FORMS

7 Candidates are required to complete the entry form in triplicate as set out at Appendix "A" to this Circular Letter. The forms can be reproduced and cyclostyled by each Ministry/ Department as necessary, as no further supplies will be obtainable from the Public Service Commission of Kenya. The completed entry forms should be submitted through the Permanent Secretary, Office of the President, to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Gill House, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, so as to reach him not later than Thursday, 5th July, 1973. Each entry form must be accompanied by the entry fee of Sh 20, either in Money Order, Postal Order or cash. Un-guaranteed personal cheques will not be accepted, and under no circumstances will entries received after 5th July 1973 be accepted.

The Permanent Secretary in the Office of the President is requested to ensure that all entry forms are properly filled in, are from eligible officers only, and are transmitted to this office before the closing date mentioned above, bearing his signature and official stamp at Part 'C' of the entry form.

EXAMINATION CENTRES

8 The examination centres in Kenya will be at the Provincial Headquarters in Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa. Centres outside Kenya may be established for those intending candidates in the Foreign Service.

PASSES

9 Any candidate who passes this examination in one or more of the six papers will be credited with a pass in that paper(s) and will be required to resit the paper(s) in which he/she failed, in a subsequent examination, until all six papers are passed.

EXAMINATION PAPERS AND STATIONERY

10 Arrangements for the issue of Examination Test Papers and Stationery, appointment of invigilators, arrangements for examination venues and submission of candidates' answer scripts to this office in respect of each Provincial Centre, will be made by the Provincial Education Officer in charge of the centre, acting on behalf, and on the directions of the Public Service Commission of Kenya. No special stationery, other than the ordinary writing foolscap, to be supplied by this office, will be required for this examination. However, those candidates offering the Law Paper may bring their own Law Books to be referred to in answering Part II only, of the Law Paper. The Provincial Education Officers are requested to ensure that the relevant Law Books are available at their centres for the use of the candidates during Part II of the Law Paper. Such books should not be used during Part I of this paper.

This year's Occupational Tests for Storemen will be held on Thursday, 30th August, 1973, in accordance with the following terms and conditions —

SCHEME OF EXAMINATIONS

2 Each examination will consist of the following papers —

(i) Storeman Examination III**(a) English Paper (1 hour)**

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of Certificate of Primary Education (C.P.E.), or the former Junior Clerical Examination)

(b) Practical Paper (2 hours)**(ii) Storeman Examination II****(a) English Paper (2 hours)**

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of the Clerical Examination)

(a) English Paper (2 hours)

(This paper will be set at the same level as that of the Clerical Examination)

(c) Practical Paper (2 hours)**(iii) Storeman Examination I****Practical Paper only (2 hours)****ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER**

3 The examinations are open to civil servants only who must be Kenya citizens serving with the Government of Kenya, and in the case of —

4 With effect from this year, every candidate entering each Occupational Test must pay an examination registration fee of K Sh 10 only, irrespective of the number of subjects taken in the test. The fee, which will not be refundable under any circumstances, will be payable to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, in either Money Order, Postal Order or cash. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

ENTRIES

5 Candidates must complete the examination entry forms in Triplicate as set out in Appendix "A" to this circular letter, copies of which can be reproduced and cyclostyled by each Ministry/Department as required, and the completed entry forms, duly certified correct by the candidates' Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Department and accompanied by the necessary entry fees, should be submitted to the Secretary, Public Service Commission of Kenya, Gill House, P.O. Box 30095, Nairobi, so as to reach him not later than Saturday, 14th July, 1973. In every case, each candidate must indicate on the entry form the location of the Store where he/she is working.

EXAMINATION CENTRES

6 The examinations will be held in Nairobi, Mombasa, Nyeri, Embu, Nakuru, Kakamega, Kisumu and Garissa. Candidates must specify at which centre they wish to sit, which will normally be that nearest to their station. The actual examination venue in each Provincial Centre will be notified to the candidates in due course.

CONDITIONS FOR OBTAINING A PASS

7 In order to obtain a full pass in the appropriate examination, a candidate must pass every paper at one and the same sitting. The names of successful candidates will be published in the Kenya Gazette. There will be no partial passes and no certificates will be issued to the successful or unsuccessful candidates.

EFFECT OF PASSING THE OCCUPATIONAL TESTS

8 Once a candidate has passed one of these examinations, he will be eligible to be considered, either by the Public Service Commission, or by the authorized officers (as the case may be), for promotion to the next higher grade as and when vacancies occur, and in accordance with the provisions of the Scheme of Service, as set out in Personnel Circular No 20 of 1968.

EXEMPTION

9 Exemption from sitting the English and/or Arithmetic Papers would be in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 3 (1) (i) (b) and 3 (2) (i) (c) of Personnel Circular No 20 of 17th August, 1968, the Scheme of Service for Stores Cadres. It is appropriate now to state that applications for exemption in this connexion have not been handled properly by the candidates' Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Departments in the past. Entry Forms from such applicants have been forwarded to this office without a signature for the necessary confirmation at Part B by the candidate's Head of Department. I should like to emphasize that in future no exemptions will be granted to candidates whose applications for exemptions from sitting the English and/or Arithmetic Papers have not been properly endorsed by the candidates' Heads of Department.

GENERAL CONDUCT OF EXAMINATIONS

10 Candidates will not be allowed to consult any books, files, notes, etc., during the examination, and any infringement of this rule will result in immediate disqualification from the whole examination and may also lead to disciplinary action being taken against the offenders. Examination papers and stationery will be supplied by this office, while the Provincial Education Officers in charge of the Provincial Centres, will be responsible for the distribution of the papers and stationery to their centres, appointment of invigilators, arrangement of the examination venues in their respective centres, and return to this office, of the candidates' answer scripts when the examinations are concluded, as directed by the Public Service Commission of Kenya.

11 All in all, the decision of the Public Service Commission will be final in all matters related to these examinations.

1 The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Elgon Engineering Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 13th day of April, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The parties signed a Recognition Agreement on 29th May, 1972, and in the same agreement under Part II it was agreed that the Respondents would refer items 2 to 20 of terms and conditions of employment to the Federation of Kenya Employers for assistance

It is not disputed that the Claimants had forwarded their demands for recognition and terms and conditions of employment on 18th March, 1972, and asked for a meeting on 27th March. The Respondents did not accept the date for the proposed meeting as they needed longer time to study the proposals. On 11th April, 1972, the Claimants reported a dispute to the Ministry of Labour on these two issues and Mr A C J Omido of Eldoret Labour Office was appointed to act as conciliator

The Recognition Agreement mentioned hereinbefore was signed in the presence of Mr Omido and the parties agreed that the remaining issues would be first discussed by themselves and only the unresolved issues would be referred to the conciliator

Two meetings were held between the parties on 13th July, 1972 and 9th October, 1972. On 13th October, 1972, the Claimants advised the conciliator of the issues that remained unresolved. A conciliation meeting was held on 2nd December, 1972, and deadlock was recorded on the 10 issues in dispute

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 5th December, 1972, which was forwarded to the Industrial Court on 3rd February, 1973, with the Labour Commissioner's Certificate

1 *Housing* —The Claimants' demand is for the payment of a housing allowance of Sh 60 to the workers in addition to their wages. During the hearing they reduced it to Sh 45 p.m. The Claimants maintained that the enormous increase in rents was a major item of expense for the workers and they should be compensated separately for it. They explained that they had agreed to a consolidated wage in 1968 because that was the first agreement and now they strongly felt that it should be awarded separately

The Respondents submitted that nothing new had developed since they agreed to a consolidated wage to justify deconsolidation. They pointed out that their proposals on wages included an element of housing allowance and the Court should therefore reject this demand

The Court notes that the parties having agreed to a consolidated wage in 1968 proceeded to negotiate another wage increase in March, 1970, on the basis of a consolidated wage

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that it is rather too soon to award a separate housing allowance and the Court has taken the Claimants' submissions on this item into consideration in its award on wages. This demand is accordingly rejected

2 *Probation* —The Claimants' demand that unskilled employees should have two months' probation period and the skilled employees three months. Further the notice of termination during probation should be seven days or pay in lieu thereof

The Respondents stated that the length of probation period was not in dispute but the termination notice period was only in dispute. They referred the Court to the relevant minutes in support of their contention

The Court is satisfied that the parties did not disagree on the period of probation being three months and the only disagreement was on the termination notice period

The Court awards that an employee's services during probation may be terminated by seven days' notice or pay in lieu thereof

3 *Termination or service* —The Claimants demanded that employees with 1-5 years' service should get a month's notice or pay in lieu thereof and those with more than five years' service should get two months' notice or pay in lieu thereof before their services can be terminated

The Respondents offered a month's notice or pay in lieu thereof. The Court awards that after the completion of probationary period employment shall be terminable by either party as follows —

1 Employees with up to five years' service, one month's notice or pay in lieu thereof

2 Employees with more than five years' service, two months notice or pay in lieu thereof

Provided that the employment may be terminated summarily for gross misconduct

4 *Suspension*—The Claimants submitted that some unscrupulous employers had the habit of dispensing summary justice and penalized workers on mere suspicion without making proper inquiries. In view of this they wanted the workers to be suspended with full pay while the Respondents or the Police made the necessary inquiries into any alleged offence by a worker and when the worker is cleared then the worker should resume duty without loss of any benefits

The Respondents stated that since the workers did not handle cash there was no need for such a clause. They did not want to make the disciplinary procedure cumbersome

The Court awards —

If an employee has committed an act or omission which requires an investigation either by the employer or the Police then in such cases the employer shall suspend such worker with full pay for the first month and half pay thereafter until such time as the employer completes his inquiries and takes a final decision in the matter or the Police has conducted its investigation and in the event of a criminal case on the conclusion of such case, provided that in case the employee is acquitted of the criminal charge or the employer clears him after investigations the worker shall be paid full salary for all the time he was on suspension

5 *Sick leave*—After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that workers should be entitled to sick leave as follows —

1 Workers with up to five years' service One month on full pay followed by two months on half pay in a period of 12 months' service

2 Workers with more than five years' service One and a half month on full pay and three and half months on half pay in each period of 12 months' service

6 *Safari allowance*—The Claimants stated that other neighbouring garages in Kitale gave a total allowance of Sh 45 when a worker went on safari and spent a night out. There was no reason why the Respondents should not give the same benefit

The Respondents offered the payment of certain allowances when workers were expected to work away from their normal place of employment. They denied that they had refused to discuss this item with the Claimants

The Court awards the following safari allowance —

	Sh	cts
Breakfast	3	50
Lunch	5	00
Dinner	6	00
Night stop (excluding meals)	20	00

7 *Acting allowance*—The Claimants' demand that if an employee is required to act in a higher grade or position for a period of seven days or more he should be paid an acting allowance which should be 25 per cent of the wages of the person for whom he is acting in addition to his own wages

The Respondents offered to pay acting allowance if an employee works in the higher job for a period of more than 21 days when he should be paid the equivalent of the basic rate for the higher job

The Court awards as follows —

An employee who is officially appointed to act in a higher grade than his substantial appointment and assumes the full duties and responsibilities of the higher job shall be entitled to an acting allowance which is equivalent to the basic rate for the higher job provided that no acting allowance shall be paid for the first seven days of such acting

8 *Gratuity*—The Claimants demand the payment of a gratuity to all the workers in respect of their services prior to the commencement of the National Social Security Fund (NSSF) and they want it to be worked out on the basis of 15 days' pay for each completed year of service

The Respondents stated that they were incorporated in 1965 and commenced operation on 1st January, 1966, and were prepared to pay a gratuity for the period 1st January, 1966, to the commencement of the NSSF at the rate of 10 days' pay for each completed year of service

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards the following clause —

An employee whose services are terminated or retired on account of old age or ill health, and the beneficiaries of an employee who dies while in employment, shall be entitled to a gratuity payment at the rate of 15 days basic pay for each completed year of service rendered to the Respondents up to the introduction of NSSF

Provided that an employee who is dismissed for misconduct or resigns shall not be entitled to such gratuity benefits

9 *Wages*—The Claimants demand a flat increase of 25 per cent to all workers on the present wages with the minimum wage to be Sh 290. They stated that three other garages in Kitale being members of the Motor Trade and Allied Employers' Association were paying much higher wages and the Respondents should do likewise

The Respondents have suggested a wage structure commencing with a basic consolidated wage of Sh 160 p.m. going up to Sh 500 p.m. for fitters, mechanics, welders and turners with Government Trade Test Grade III

They further offered to all existing employees a wage increment of Sh 20 for the first 12 months with effect from 1st January, 1973, and a further Sh 20 for the next 12 months

The Court notes that the Ministry of Labour has ruled after a thorough investigation that the Respondents fall within the provision of the Regulation of Wages (General) Order, 1967. This means that the Wages Council Regulation Order for the Motor Industry does not apply to them

The Court feels that a wage structure should be discussed and negotiated by the parties first and in the event of a deadlock the matter can then come to the Court for a final decision. There is no evidence that this has been done in the present case. The Court therefore rejects the Respondents' demand that a wage structure as proposed by them should be awarded by the Court. The Court advises the parties to embark on negotiations on a wage structure before the next wage revision

The Court has taken into consideration the fact that wages are consolidated and that the workers received increments in 1971 and 1972 despite there being no negotiations with the Claimants

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that all the workers should get a wage increase of Sh 40 p.m. on their existing wages for the first 12 months from the effective date as awarded hereafter and another increase of Sh 25 p.m. for the next 12 months

10 *Effective date and duration*—After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court awards that the effective date should be 1st January, 1973, with a duration period of two years from that date

Parties —

Kenya Union of National Parks Employees
and

Kenya National Parks

Issues in dispute —

- (i) Abolition of 10 ft by 10 ft houses in the Kenya National Parks
- (ii) Provision of a minimum of a two bed-roomed house for each union member, or payment of Sh 250 per month housing allowance in lieu thereof

(iii) Accelerated grading for clerks, artisans, rangers and drivers in the Kenya National Parks

1 The Kenya Union of National Parks Employees shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya National Parks shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 10th day of April, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 This dispute concerns the three items on which deadlock was recorded by the parties at a conciliation meeting on 11th September, 1972, when agreement was reached on several other items

The document recording the agreement and the deadlock was produced to the Court and the Claimants bitterly criticized the Respondents for not having implemented the items on which agreement was reached

The Claimants also made further general remarks alleging that the Respondents did not give due respect to them, the Claimants, to which they are entitled as a trade union representing the interest of the workers employed by the Respondents. The Respondents in turn denied these allegations and blamed the Claimants for the bad industrial relations existing between them

After the deadlock the parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 22nd September, 1972, and it was forwarded to the Industrial Court on 11th December, 1972, with the Labour Commissioner's Certificate

Issue 1—Abolition of 10 ft by 10 ft houses in the Kenya National Parks

Issue 2—Provision of a minimum of a two bed-roomed house for each Union member, or payment of Sh 250 per month housing allowance in lieu thereof

The Claimants submitted that it did not need any strong arguments or other proof to satisfy the Court that 10 ft by 10 ft houses were a disgrace and not fit for human habitation particularly when they were not only allocated to one family but in some of them two families were found to live, further the occupants had to cook their meals in these rooms as well

The Claimants stated that since they had no doubt that the Court would agree with their submission on this, it should order that such houses should be abolished forthwith and in their place the employees should be accommodated in two bed roomed houses or paid Sh 250 housing allowance in lieu thereof

The Claimants said it was established years ago that the productivity of better housed workers was higher than that of poorly housed workers. The Claimants strongly alleged that the lower paid employees in the National Parks were being completely ignored as far as their wages and welfare were concerned otherwise they would not still be housed in accommodation built during the colonial era when workers were considered lesser human beings than the colonialists

Finally the Claimants pointed out that their members were contributing a lot to the economy of the country and that they deserved to be treated better socially and economically than they are now. Good living conditions would improve their efficiency, morale and productivity

The Respondents referred the Court to section 23 of the Employment Act and submitted that if the Claimants were not satisfied that their members were housed in reasonable accommodation then they should take up the matter with the Health Authorities and the Labour Ministry should also be approached with their complaints. They asked the Court to direct the Claimants and themselves to the said legal provision to ensure that the workers were provided with reasonable housing accommodation

Further to this the Respondents stated that their objective is really to provide "adequate and reasonable" accommodation for all employees within their financial means

The Respondents accepted that some families (not in all Parks) share a room of 10 ft by 12 ft or 12 ft by 12 ft but it is their intention to improve on this and they have taken positive action in this direction and building is actually in progress in all Parks

The Respondents informed the Court that the set up of new houses for the category of staff represented by the Claimants is of high standard and commensurate with employees' category, this being a two roomed house with other related facilities, i.e. kitchen and w.c. It is their intention, funds permitting, to build more of these houses in all Parks.

The Respondents submitted that the Claimants' demand for a two bed roomed house was quite unreasonable and no industry could afford this type of housing to all its employees. In one Park the employees preferred to receive a housing allowance and they agreed that their old housing accommodation be demolished and an allowance paid in accordance with the scales approved by Government for the Civil Service as follows —

	Sh
(i) Nairobi/Mombasa Municipalities	75
(ii) Eldoret, Embu, Kakamega, Kisumu, Kitale, Meru, Nakuru, Nyeri and Thika Municipal Councils	50
(iii) Athi River, Bungoma, Karatina, Kericho Kiambu, Kisii, Lamu, Malindi/Mambrui, Masaku, Maseno, Murang'a, Naivasha, Nanyuki and Thomson's Falls	50
(iv) All rural areas	21

The Respondents stated that these house allowances are in fact generous and higher than in many other similar industries

The Court notes that the Assistant Labour Commissioner, J. B. O. Omondi, recently visited Tsavo (East) and Nairobi National Parks and after his visit conveyed the following observations to the parties on the subject of housing —

"Judging from the Parks I visited, I am satisfied that Management has initiated moves to provide modern sanitary facilities and to provide single houses for the employees. I also venture to observe that a building process is not one that can be carried out overnight. Indeed, a number of new houses have been built irrespective of the style of architectural design (which in some cases is questionable having in mind their long time convenience in the light of immediate future tastes of house holds). It is the intention of the Management within its five year Building Development Programme to provide each house hold with a house, preferably a two roomed house with sanitary facilities either in the house or in very close proximities

In view of the fact that the tourist industry is a viable one, the Management should immediately provide pit latrines where appropriate, and ensure that all the sanitary facilities provided are kept clean always. In some places in the Parks, these requirements are pressing and should be provided even if only on a temporary basis pending their replacement with more modern sanitation

When new houses are built and ready for allocation to employees, the Management should give priority to those employees in Tsavo East National Parks who are currently occupying houses which have poor ventilation. The same priority exercise should apply as appropriate in all the Parks

As far as is possible and practicable, employees' children of school age should be provided with transport to and from nearby schools

I reserve the right of visiting the National Parks at the end of the year—1973, to see how far the moves which have been initiated in connexion with housing, improving sanitation, etc., and which I have mentioned above will have advanced at that time"

The Court is very much influenced by these observations which go to support the Respondents' stand that they are very much concerned with the standard of living of their employees and are making determined and positive efforts to improve it. The Court appreciates that this can only be done as and when the necessary finance is made available to them by the Government

The Court has in the past made clear how difficult, if not impossible, it is for the Court to make an award on an issue of this nature which could quite clearly involve the employer into a capital expenditure running into millions of shillings. What the Court can do and always does is to assess the seriousness of the employers' submissions that they are doing their best to alleviate the housing accommodation of their employees. If an employer is not taking proper steps in this direction, then the Court requires him to do so

In this case the Court is satisfied that things are moving at reasonable speed to achieve the objective of providing reasonable and adequate accommodation for the Respondents' employees

The Court finds the remarks made by the Assistant Labour Commissioner to be pertinent and in the right direction and endorses his plan to keep the position under review at the end of 1973. In fact the Court feels that the Assistant Labour Commissioner should make periodic visits to all the National Parks and satisfy himself as to the steps that are being taken to improve the housing of the workers

The Court, while fully accepting the Claimants' submission on Issue 1, cannot help them any more than what has been stated hereinabove. The Court however directs that the practice of having two families in small rooms of 10 ft by 10 ft or 10 ft by 12 ft or 12 ft by 12 ft should cease forthwith. Under extreme and unavoidable circumstances such rooms can be allocated to two single workers or a married couple without children and the Court must strongly express its desire that the colonial type houses should be completely abolished as a matter of top priority

On Issue 2, which is very much related to Issue 1, the Court is not inclined to make any award. The allowance which would be paid in lieu of housing is based on Ndegwa Commission report and is effective from 1972. The Court feels that it is too soon to review these allowances and the Claimants' demand for a house allowance of Sh 250 for the lowest paid workers is rejected

Issue 3—Accelerated grading of clerks, artisans, rangers and drivers in the Kenya National Parks

The Claimants' demand on this issue is that the following workers with more skill, experience and meritorious performance should be compensated through upgrading, promotion or special allowances—

- (i) employees who have passed their professional tests, i.e. trade tests,
- (ii) employees who have acquired more experience through long service,
- (iii) employees with meritorious performance, and
- (iv) employees made to do more than one type of a job or special duties

This would act as an incentive for employees to work much harder than before

The Claimants made allegations against the Respondents that they promoted workers only if they resigned from the Union

The Respondents submitted that the Claimants' submissions on this issue were quite inadequate and they had produced no arguments justifying any variation from the present method of grading

They also stated that the Claimants had made no requests over this particular issue until recently and the Respondents considered that grading was primarily the prerogative of employers

The Court finds that the Claimants have indeed provided very inadequate information on this issue to back up their demand. For one thing they have not given to the Court the existing grading structure regarding these employees, neither did they produce their detailed new proposals on the issue. It is no use for the parties to expect that the Court would look for the necessary information from some other quarters. The Court must emphasize that it is primarily the duty of the party making a demand to make very comprehensive and detailed submissions on the issue to justify its demand

In the present dispute the Court finds that because of the very general arguments and inadequate factual information before it, it cannot proceed to make any award on this issue

The Court would like to advise the parties to tackle the question of job gradings before the next wage revision

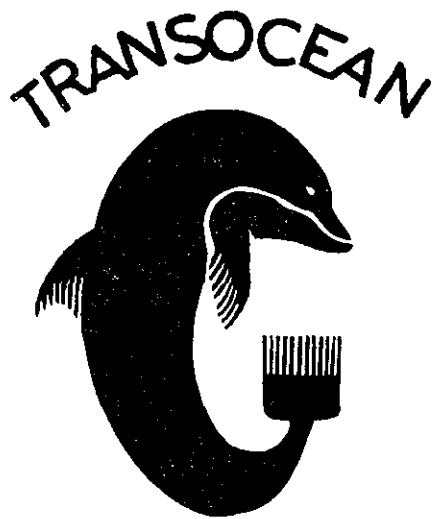
