- 2 Dismissal of Messrs Paul Kazungu and Gideon Katana

1 The Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Watamu Beach Hotel shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Mombasa on the 25th day of April, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Respondents also called the following witnesses —

Messrs Boniface de Mawere and K. Schmied

AWARD

3 The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 10th February, 1972, and the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner issued their certificates in accordance with section 9 (9) (e) and (f) on 2nd November, 1972

Issue No 1—Unreasonable termination of service of Valentine George Ponda

Mr Ponda was engaged by the Respondents in December, 1966, and it is admitted that he was being trained to become in due course the Assistant Manager. Prior to the termination of his services he was employed as a Receptionist in the main office at a consolidated salary of Sh 734/50 p.m. During his service with the Respondents he took a group of dancers to Europe twice on a publicity campaign on behalf of the Respondents.

In 1969 Mr Ponda requested permission to engage in his own business and according to the evidence of Mr K. N. Schmied he was granted permission to run a shop or a canteen on the condition that his brother or cousin would run it for him.

Subsequently a new business under the name of Black & White Bar came into existence and developed rapidly to become a serious competitor to the Respondents being situated only about 200 metres away from their hotel.

The Respondents very strongly suspected active involvement of Mr Ponda in the Black & White Bar—in fact they believed that Mr Ponda was the unofficial owner and the brain behind this business. Mr Schmied told the Court that he warned Mr Ponda verbally that if ever he came to know that he, Mr Ponda, was running the business of Black & White Bar, he would be sacked. In September, 1970, certain guests informed Mr Schmied that they were told at the Respondents' reception that they should visit the Black & White Bar and although Mr Schmied suspected Mr Ponda he took no action.

At about this time Mr Schmied left the Respondents' employment temporarily and the Managing Director, Mr K. Ruedin took over and on 19th November 1970, Mr Ponda's services were terminated *vide* the following letter signed by Mr Ruedin —

"In view of the fact that your considerable interest in the ownership and running of the bar in Watamu village is detrimental to you giving your full attention and effort to your job in this hotel, and furthermore are at variance, with the loyalty in business you owe to your employers, I am, with regret, obliged to terminate your services with this company by giving you one month's salary in lieu of notice, as of 30th September, 1970. You are thanked for your past services in the company."

The Claimants took up this matter on behalf of Mr Ponda and declared a trade dispute. As a result the Ministry of Labour appointed an investigator. On 21st January, 1972, the Permanent Secretary forwarded his "Findings and Recommendations" to the parties as follows —

"From the evidence presented in this case, I find that the matter was not sufficiently tackled by the parties in accordance with their own negotiating machinery. However, even discounting this fact I have come to the conclusion that if in fact Mr Ponda was in breach of trust as stated by the Management, he should have been given adequate warnings in writing. The circumstances which prompted the Manage-

ment to accept Mr Ponda's request for arrangements to be made for water connexion between Watamu Beach Hotel and Black & White Bar are to state the least dubious.

From the foregoing observations I give Mr Ponda the benefit of doubt and I recommend that the Management of Watamu Beach consider reinstating him without loss of privileges. The Management are at liberty to issue appropriate warning."

The Respondents rejected these recommendations.

The Claimants produced in Court various relevant documents to show that Mr Ponda was not the owner of the Black & White Bar. They maintained that the Respondents were completely wrong in terminating the services of Mr Ponda on mere suspicion only. They stressed that Mr Ponda was an efficient worker and had rendered very satisfactory services to the Respondents.

The Claimants suggested that the Respondents were not happy at an African enterprise having been established at Watamu in direct competition with them.

The Claimants submitted that Mr Ponda's services were terminated without any justification or lawful cause and that Mr Ponda had not been given even one warning in the four-year service he had with the Respondents.

The Respondents submitted that although they had no documentary proof as such that Mr Ponda was deeply involved in the Black & White Bar, they were satisfied from a number of incidents that that was so. Their Manager, Mr Schmied had seen Mr Ponda working behind the counter in the Black & White Bar, although it was outside Mr Ponda's official working hours. Further, their Chief Storekeeper, Mr Boniface de Mawere had heard Mr Ponda ordering beer and minerals for the Black & White Bar through the Respondents' telephone in a manner which revealed to Mr Mawere that Mr Ponda must have known the daily position of the stock in the Black & White Bar.

The Respondents stated that when Mr Ruedin took over from Mr Schmied he once found Mr Ponda during his official working hours serving in the Black & White Bar and it was this incident which led to Mr Ponda's services being terminated.

The Respondents maintained that Mr Ponda might have acted as an agent or a servant of Mr Kiponda, the registered owner, but the fact still remained that being a servant of the Respondents he acted in a manner which was detrimental to the interests of his employers by using his position to directly persuade the Respondents' guests to patronize the Black & White Bar.

In these circumstances the Respondents claimed that they had acted properly and the Court should uphold their decision.

The Court has noted that the Respondents called two witnesses who gave evidence on oath and confirmed certain portions of their written submissions. As against this, the Claimants did not call Mr Ponda to give evidence on oath despite having had a clear warning of various allegations against Mr Ponda in the Respondents' written submission. Not only this but Mr Ponda did not even bother to attend the Court to listen to his case.

The Court is satisfied that Mr Ponda's alleged involvement in the business of Black & White was gradually building up to a crisis point, therefore the Respondents should have warned him about the consequences in writing in order to drive home to him the serious trouble in which his conduct would land him. Instead they only gave him verbal warnings.

To make matters worse when Mr K. Ruedin saw Mr Ponda working in the Black & White Bar during his official working hours with the Respondents he did not summarily dismiss him. Instead he served a letter of termination on Mr Ponda which is reproduced hereinbefore and in that letter no mention is made of the very serious allegation of working in the Black & White Bar during official working hours with the Respondents. The Court feels that this real reason for his dismissal should have figured prominently in this letter.

After careful consideration of all the circumstances the Court has come to the conclusion that despite the fact that Mr Ponda's ownership of the Black & White Bar has not been proved, there is no doubt that he is actively engaged in this business and is the brains behind it. Notwithstanding this, however, the Court finds that Mr Ponda should have been warned in writing that his continued active association with the Black & White Bar would lead to his services being terminated. The Court therefore finds that to this extent then Mr Ponda's dismissal is wrongful.

The Claimants have asked for his reinstatement and payment of all dues up to the date of reinstatement amounting to about £1,100. Keeping in view all the circumstances of this case the Court is not prepared to order Mr Ponda's reinstatement. The Court is of the view that Mr Ponda is entitled to some compensation for his wrongful dismissal.

In assessing the compensation for Mr Ponda the Court has taken into consideration the fact that he is actively involved in the Black & White Bar although not officially. Since he has already received one month's pay in lieu of notice the Court has decided to award him another two months' salary by way of compensation and so awards

The Court would like to add that during the hearing certain comments and allegations were made vis-a-vis the competition between the Respondents and the Black & White Bar and some other difficulties between the two businesses, but since they are not strictly relevant to the issue in dispute the Court has no comments to make on them.

Issue 2—Dismissal of Messrs Paul Kazungu and Gideon Katana

Mr Kazungu started working for the Respondents as a painter on 3rd March, 1967, and Mr Katana as a mason on 1st November, 1969. Their services were discontinued on 29th September, 1970.

It is not disputed that both of them were given employment as casual employees, with the Claimants maintaining that they were in continuous employment since then until their services were terminated while the Respondents submit that both of them used to do casual work from time to time during this period.

This dispute was also the subject matter of an investigation by the Ministry of Labour and the "Findings and Recommendations" of the Permanent Secretary were conveyed to the parties on 12th May, 1971. The parties did not, however, settle the dispute on the lines suggested by the Permanent Secretary.

The Claimants submitted that their Collective Agreement with the East African Hotelkeepers Association which applied to this case required in clause 1 that all persons engaged by the Association shall be on probation not exceeding two months, therefore both Mr Kazungu and Mr Katana should be deemed to have been in regular monthly employment after the first two months. They asked the Court to reinstate both of them and to order the Respondents to pay them all the fringe benefits to which they were entitled.

The Respondents strenuously resisted this demand and maintained that both of them were casual employees although they were paid weekly. They produced the relevant records and stated that the Claimants were fully aware of the position and had never raised the matter until the two employees were discharged.

They asked the Court to reject the Claimants' demand.

The Court cannot accept the Claimants' submission that clause 1 of the Collective Agreement prohibits the members of the Association from engaging casual employees. The proper thing for the Claimants to do is to seek a right to represent casual employees as well, that is if they do not have such a right already, and then negotiate their terms of employment. In the absence of any such terms and conditions relating to casual employees the Court is not able to help them.

The investigator found that both these employees were employed on casual basis although paid weekly and that they were aware of this. The Court is also of the same view.

The Court finds that the Permanent Secretary's recommendations to settle this dispute were fair and proper. These were —

- 1 In view of the observations above I have to recommend that as far as practicable Messrs Kazungu and Katana should be given an opportunity to continue working for the hotel in their former capacities since they had worked for the hotel previously.
- 2 If it is not possible to reinstate them and in view of the fact that they were being paid weekly they should be paid one week's pay each in lieu of notice.
- 3 Since it appears that maintenance work is always going on in the hotel the Management and the Union should negotiate and agree on terms and conditions of employees in this section so as to regularize them parti-

cularly in the light of the negotiated agreement and the Regulations of Wages (Hotel and Catering Trades) Order 1967.

The Court upholds these recommendations and awards that both these persons be paid one week's pay in lieu of notice.

Provided that if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the lessor or any person authorized by him on behalf of the County Council to re-enter into and upon the land and the term hereby created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the County Council or the Commissioner in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained

3 The grantee shall maintain in good and substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land

4 Should the grantee give notice in writing to the County Council that he/she/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the County Council shall (at the grantee's expense) accept a surrender of the land comprised therein

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given (1) within 12 months of the commencement of the term the County Council shall refund to the grantee 50 per centum of the stand premium paid in respect of the land, or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period the County Council shall refund to the grantee 25 per centum of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period no refund shall be made

10 The grantee shall from time to time pay to the County Council on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the County Council may assess

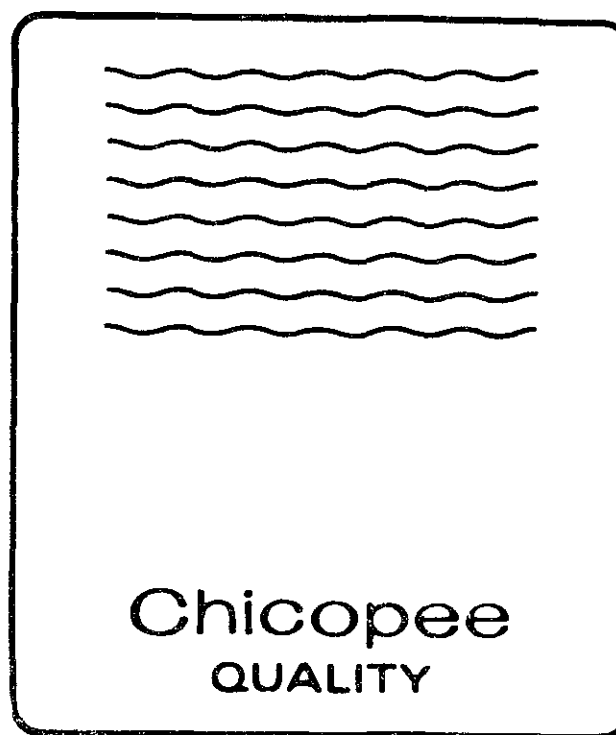
