CAUSE No 18 OF 1972

Parties —

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Grain Milling Group

Issue in dispute —

Free transport to all night shift employees in Grain Milling Group

1 The Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Grain Milling Group shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The Claimants applied to the Court for a further hearing in this dispute, accordingly the parties were heard in Nairobi on the 19th day of April, 1973, and relied on their further written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 The Court announced its award in this dispute on 21st August, 1972, and the last two paragraphs of the Court award read as follows —

'After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court has come to the conclusion that the Respondents should make arrangements to provide transport for night shift workers but the Court feels that the whole burden should not be borne by the Respondents alone, therefore the Court rules that each night shift worker should contribute a sum of Sh 7/50 p.m. towards such transport. The Court further directs that the parties should immediately work out the details of such an arrangement, if necessary, with the assistance of the Chief Industrial Relations Officer, Ministry of Labour, Nairobi

Finally the Court rules that its award for the time being apply to Nairobi area only"

In September, 1972, the parties started consultations in order to finalize the arrangements for provision of transport to employees on night shift work

On 26th January, 1973, a meeting was held between the parties where the relevant rules, proposed timetable and authority for deduction were tabled. The record of what transpired at this meeting was made available to the Court by both the parties

Apart from a few minor points two major ones which brought the parties to a deadlock are the Claimants' demand—

1 that because the Respondents have asked employees living at Riruta, Dagoretti, Kibera and Kariobangi to either change their places of residence in order to come to a more central point or to change to day shift, the charge of Sh 7/50 awarded by the Court should be reduced,

2 that employees coming to work at 4 o'clock in the afternoon and leaving work at 8 a.m. in the morning should be provided with transport

The Claimants then asked the Court for a further hearing in order to solve their deadlock

During the hearing the Claimants requested the Court to reconsider their demand for provision of free transport to all night shift employees on the grounds which are already covered in the award announced on 21st August, 1972

The Respondents on the other hand came out with an offer that the demand for provision of night transport by the Claimants should be dropped and their offer of paying their such employees a night allowance of Sh 20 p.m. (which covers all employees in Kenya) should be accepted and awarded. The Claimants rejected this offer

The Court is not prepared to accept either of these two suggestions. The issue before the Court was clear and the Court made an award on that. It would be wrong for the Court to make an entirely new and different award as a result of this further hearing which is primarily for the purpose of finalizing arrangements in line with the Court award. The Court must therefore confine itself to the problems which have caused the deadlock between the parties

On page 3 of the Claimants' written submission they state —

'During the process of discussion after the employees agreed to centralize the areas, the Respondents could not accept either to reduce the charges or to give the transport to the employees when they report at 4 p.m. and when they leave in the morning

The Claimants agreed to give timetable to start and see if it would work as it had been worked out jointly by both the Claimants' and Respondents' representatives at their respective mills

After a lengthy discussion the parties narrowed the differences but failed to agree just because the Respondents could not accept to reduce the charges or accept to provide the employees with the transport at 4 p.m. and in the morning. Had this proposal been accepted by the Respondents the differences could have ended"

The Court is satisfied that there are only two points which have caused the deadlock and these have already been mentioned hereinbefore

After careful consideration of all the further submissions the Court finds that the Claimants' demand for extending the transport to workers at 8 a.m. in the morning and 4 p.m. in the afternoon is unjustified. In fact the dispute before the Court is for provision of transport for employees on night shift work because of the difficulties which have already been mentioned previously, there is no question of transport being provided for them during daytime. This demand is accordingly rejected

Now coming to the demand for reduction of the charge of Sh 7/50 awarded by the Court there seems to be justification for it in view of the changed circumstances, that is that the transport will not now be provided to workers living at Kariobangi, Riruta, Dagoretti, Kawangware and Kibera. The Court had worked out the charge of Sh 7/50 on the basis that workers at all these places would be provided with transport

In the light of the new arrangement of centralizing the workers the Court has decided to reduce the charge of Sh 7/50 to Sh 5 and so awards

The Court notes that the rules governing transport, timetable and authority for deduction have all been agreed albeit for a trial period and the parties should now urgently finalize all the arrangements so that transport would be provided to night shift employees without any further delay

CAUSE No 10 OF 1973

*Parties —*Domestic and Hotel Workers Union
and

Mombasa Beach Hotel

Issue in dispute —

Unjustified termination of service of Johnson Gichuku Karehu

1 The Domestic and Hotel Workers Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Mombasa Beach Hotel Ltd shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Mombasa on the 26th day of April, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

AWARD

3 Mr J G Karehu was employed by Lodges and Hotels Ltd, who also own Mombasa Beach Hotel, on 3rd March, 1970

On 27th February, 1971, he obtained a sick sheet and went to hospital for treatment as he complained of a swollen knee cap and severe pain

He attended the Coast General Hospital where five injections were prescribed for him (he received one the same day) and the Doctor gave him three days off duty. According to the original entry on the sick sheet he was required to resume duty on 2nd March, 1971. This entry had been altered to 25th March, 1971, when he submitted his sick sheet to the Respondents on 4th March, 1971

The Respondents immediately contacted the Hospital to determine the source of the alterations. The Medical Superintendent of the Hospital wrote back to state that "the date seems to have been altered but the Doctor who treated the patient cannot confirm the alterations"

The Respondents felt that Mr Karehu had failed to prove that the alterations on the sick sheet were done by an authorized person and that he had illicitly tried to obtain three weeks' paid sick leave. They, therefore, dismissed him summarily on 4th March, 1971

The Claimants took up the matter and insisted that the alterations had not been done by Mr Karehu but had been done by the Doctor who treated him in the first place

The matter ended up in the Ministry of Labour and an investigator was appointed. On 26th October, 1972, the Permanent Secretary Ministry of Labour, forwarded his "Findings and Recommendations" to the parties, these being —

"That the relevant sick sheet was altered is not in dispute. What is seriously in dispute is the author of the alteration and the matter rests between Mr Karehu and the Lady Doctor who Mr Karehu claims to have extended his sick leave to 25th March, 1971, by altering the sick sheet. Inquiries were instituted by both the Union and the Management and, in this connexion, both parties wrote the Coast Province General Hospital. The Medical Superintendent replied to the Union's letter and stated that the Doctor could not personally confirm whether or not the alteration had been made by Lady Doctor. Equally, the reply to the Management stated that the date seemed to have been altered but the Doctor who treated the patient could not confirm the alteration

It is quite clear from the evidence of the Medical Superintendent that the alteration of the sick sheet raised doubts and nobody could pinpoint the author, in view of the above conclusions it is recommended that Mr Karehu's dismissal should be reduced to termination of appointment and he be paid his terminal benefits including notice of termination of appointment pay"

The Respondents following this recommendation agreed to give Mr Karehu a month's pay in lieu of notice but the Claimants insisted that Mr Karehu should be reinstated without any loss of wages and benefits

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 5th December 1972, which was forwarded to the Industrial Court on 12th February, 1973, with relevant certificates from the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner signed on 6th February, 1973

During the hearing the Claimants maintained that the Doctor in question had altered the sick sheet and that Mr Karehu had not tampered with it in any manner. The fact that Mr Karehu continued to receive treatment until 24th March, supported this contention

The Claimants referred to clause 11 of the Collective Agreement applicable to this case in which a worker is entitled to sick leave of 15 days on full pay followed by 15 days on half pay and thereafter to 30 days' unpaid leave

The Claimants put in all the correspondence on the subject showing that they had all along rejected the Respondents' contention that Mr Karehu had altered the sick sheet and had demanded his reinstatement

They asked the Court to uphold their submission and to order Mr Karehu's reinstatement without any loss of wages and benefits

The Respondents strongly maintained that the burden of proof regarding the alteration to the sick sheet rested with Mr Karehu and this he had failed to discharge because he had not produced any evidence to show that the Doctor had altered the sick sheet. They submitted that it was highly unlikely that any Doctor would alter a sick sheet in the hospital corridor without first examining the patient

They asked the Court to reject the Claimants' demand for reinstatement and to award only one month's wages which they had offered to pay

The Court finds that the two letters from the Medical Superintendent of the Coast General Hospital cast a big doubt on this whole affair of the alteration of the date on the sick sheet

In one letter dated 30th March, 1971, he wrote to the Respondents' Manager on the question of alteration as follows —

"Regarding date of resuming duty. The date seems to have been altered but the Doctor who treated the patient cannot confirm the alterations"

Again on 24th April, 1971, he wrote to the Claimants' Branch Secretary on this subject as follows —

"The Doctor could not personally confirm whether or not the alterations have been made by her"

Taking these two statements into consideration coupled with the fact that Mr Karehu continued to receive treatment at the hospital until 24th March, 1971, the Court has decided to give him the benefit of doubt. The Court therefore finds that Mr Karehu did not alter the sick sheet and his services were terminated wrongfully

The Court has carefully considered all the submissions and the circumstances surrounding this case and has come to the conclusion that reinstatement should not be ordered. The Court, however, feels that Mr Karehu is entitled to compensation for wrongful dismissal and awards that he be paid three months' pay by way of compensation for such wrongful dismissal
