Birds Office Stationery and Equipment
and

Printing and Kindred Trades Workers' Union

Issue in dispute —Redundancy

1 The Birds Office Stationery and Equipment shall herein after be referred to as the Claimants and the Printing and Kindred Trades Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 12th day of June, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants also called two witnesses, Thomas Maloba and Joseph Koech

AWARD

3 This is an application by the Claimants to seek the approval of the Court for their intended redundancies. The application has been most strongly opposed by the Respondents

The background to this dispute starts from 31st May, 1972, when the Claimants issued a circular to all members of the staff in which they pointed out that due to the ill health of Mr and Mrs Bird the business output had seriously dropped and that most of the machines were standing idle most of the time. They advised their employees to seek other employment opportunities since they intended to apply to the Ministry of Labour for a reduction of staff

On 8th September, 1972, the Claimants for the first time wrote to the Respondents on the subject and asked them to meet them and discuss the matter. From then on there is a history of letters, attempted meetings and the reference of the matter to the Ministry of Labour. The important points arising therefrom will be referred to later on in the award. The fact remains that the parties never got down to discuss the problem at their level and the conciliation arranged by the Ministry of Labour was also not fruitful

The parties signed the Notification of Dispute Form "A" on 28th March, 1973, and it was received by the Court on 12th April, 1973, with the Labour Commissioner's certificate dated 4th April, 1973

The Claimants' submissions in brief are that due to the ill health of Mr and Mrs Bird who are the leading persons in the business it has been found necessary to reduce the business activities by a minimum of 50 per cent. A medical certificate from their doctor was produced certifying that the state of their health warranted the reduction of their business by 50 per cent. They also produced a statement of their accounts in support of their contention that the business had dropped by about 11 per cent in the two years from March, 1971 to March, 1973. They denied that they were anti-union or that the purpose of the intended redundancies was to get rid of a few remaining union members

The Respondents stated that the Claimants had completely failed to follow the laid down machinery between the parties for the settlement of disputes and as a result there had been no discussion between them. This showed that the Claimants wanted to disregard them as instead of the general circular to their employees they should have contacted the Respondents in the first place

The Respondents strongly resisted this application on the ground that it was no more than an attempt by the Claimants to get rid of the union members. The Respondents challenged the medical certificates produced by the Claimants and asked the Court to reject them since the doctor had not been called to give evidence on oath. The Respondents maintained that the alleged sickness of Mr and Mrs Bird was no reason for reducing the business as they should employ a competent person to run it for them. Further three employees had left the Claimants' employment in late 1972 and if they had not been replaced it meant that staff had been reduced and if replacements were engaged it meant that there was enough work for them

The Respondents called two witnesses to give evidence on oath both of whom gave evidence on various incidents which they claimed showed that the Claimants were very anti union in their outlook. One of them is the union shopsteward and it is intended to declare him redundant, the other one left the Claimants' employment in late 1972

The Court has carefully considered the various submissions made by the parties and the evidence of the witnesses and finds that the Claimants' submissions on the issue in dispute fall far short of discharging the burden of proof which rests so heavily on them in such cases

The Court would like to refer to a circular which the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, has issued on the subject of redundancy after the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1971, was passed by National Assembly. He has prescribed the following procedure to be followed —

- (a) Where there is an intended redundancy the employer should consult the appropriate union (this is provided in the majority of terms and conditions of service agreements) and report the matter to this Ministry
- (b) where agreement is reached between the employer and the union, it is only necessary to report the agreement to this Ministry
- (c) where no agreement is reached between the employer and the union at their level, the matter should be referred to this Ministry for conciliation with a view to voluntary agreement being reached,
- (d) where agreement is reached as a result of conciliation the conciliator will report the same to this Ministry,
- (e) where conciliation results in no agreement, the matter shall be referred by the Ministry to the Industrial Court,
- (f) no redundancy will be effected until the agreement mentioned in (b) or (d) above has been reached or the Industrial Court has given its Award."

The Court is satisfied that the Claimants did not manage to get down to consult the Respondents because they did not follow the proper procedure as laid down in their Recognition Agreement. The Recognition Agreement applicable to the parties at the material time was the one between the Federation of Master Printers of East Africa and the Respondents as the Claimants were members of the Federation. It is true that the Respondents evaded meeting them on more than one occasion but then the Respondents relied on the technical slips which the Claimants made.

The Court would like to emphasize that in cases of redundancies the burden of proof is on the employers and they should produce detailed evidence to satisfy and convince the Court that the redundancy they seek is unavoidable. Redundancy is a very unpleasant fact of life, a fact which should be avoided as far as is humanly possible. However in certain cases it is unavoidable but in such cases convincing evidence must be produced.

The Industrial Relations Charter enumerates the following principles that will apply in case of redundancy —

- "(i) The Union concerned shall be informed of the reasons for and the extent of intended redundancy,
- (ii) the principle should be adopted of 'Last in, First out' in the particular category of employees affected subject to all other factors such as skill, relative merit, ability and reliability being equal,
- (iii) the redundant employee will be entitled to the appropriate period of notice or pay in lieu. The principle of severance pay is agreed but the form and amount of such pay shall be subject to joint negotiation."

In the present dispute the Claimants have produced medical certificates without calling the doctors to give evidence as one of them was sick and the other one had left the country or was about to leave. The other point they have put forward is a drop in their business of 11 per cent between March, 1971 to March, 1973.

The medical history of Mr and Mrs Bird goes back to 1966 and the medical certificate that was produced was undated. In view of this it was essential for the Claimants to call the doctor to come and give evidence on oath so that the Respondents could cross examine him. But again this alone would not have been enough as the Claimants did not refute or satisfactorily explain that three of their employees had left their jobs in late 1972 long after they had issued the aforesaid circular on 31st May, 1972. If this is a fact has it then met the reduction of staff which the Claimants had contemplated and if not why not? This has not been explained.

The shopsteward who is in the binding section clearly stated that there was enough work in that section to keep three of them busy. This again was not refuted.

In fact the Claimants did not explain in details the deployment of their labour force in the various sections and what efforts if any they had made to prevent redundancy. They did not tell of their efforts to reduce costs in the sections other than the factory. The Court needs this type of information in great details to come to a just and proper decision in cases of redundancy. It is regrettable that the Court could not know what efforts have been made to retrain the employees with a

view to absorbing them in other sections. Further the Court wants to be satisfied that the whole burden necessitated by circumstances which warrant redundancy has been spread fairly in the whole enterprise.

As far as the unions are concerned the Court expects them to meet and discuss the intended redundancy within reasonable time and in accordance with the laid down procedure. Evasive action such as delaying and putting off meetings will not help matters in the long run and it may well turn out that the overall interest of the workers would suffer far more than was originally intended.

In this dispute however, the Court was not even informed of the names of the four employees who are to be declared redundant, their length of service and other relevant details. Nor was there any information on the remaining employees which would enable the Court to assess the suitability or otherwise of the employees to be declared redundant.

The Court must point out that in cases of redundancies general statements will not suffice as the Court wants to know all the aspects of the matter in very great details. Loss of employment by workers, even by one worker, is a very serious matter indeed, particularly when it occurs through no fault of the worker.

The Court finds that in this dispute the Claimants have failed to discharge the burden of proof which rested on them. Accordingly the Court has decided not to approve the intended redundancies.

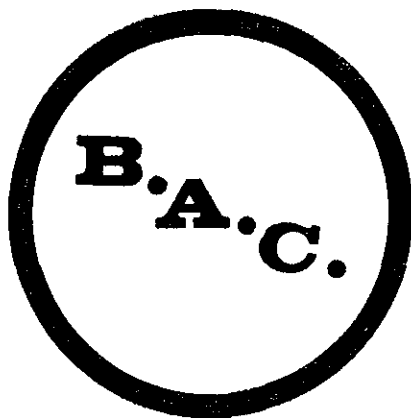
