 - (a) If the applicant is offered and takes up and pays for a plot within a period of seven days as required in paragraph 5 below, the deposit will be credited to him
 - (b) If the application is unsuccessful the applicant's deposit will be returned to him
 - (c) If the application is successful and the applicant fails to take up and pay for the plot offered to him within a period of 14 days as required in paragraph 5 of the General Conditions, the Commissioner of Lands may declare the deposit forfeited and the applicant shall have no further claim thereto

Ceneral Conditions

- 1 The ordinary conditions applicable to township grants of this nature except as varied hereby shall apply to this grant

Issues in dispute —

- 1 Suspension
- 2 Sick leave
- 3 Job grading and wages
- 4 Effective date and duration
- 1 The Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and the Nairobi Tyre Retreaders' Group shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents
- 2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 19th day of June, 1973, and relied on their written and verbal submissions

Award

3 In April, 1972, a dispute was referred to the Court between the Claimants and Bhamra Tyre Retreaders Ltd This dispute, however, was withdrawn because the Nairobi Tyre Retreaders' Group was being formed at the time

After the Respondents were formed the Claimants forwarded to them on 24th June, 1972, their initial proposals on a Collective Agreement These proposals were withdrawn by the Claimants and new ones submitted on 27th June, 1972

The parties met on 5th and 11th July, 1972, when agreement was reached on a number of items Further meetings were held on 24th August and 12th September, 1972, after which a deadlock was declared on seven issues, namely, annual leave, sick leave, termination of service, suspension, gratuity and retirement, wages and grading, effective date and duration of agreement

The Respondents reported a dispute to the Ministry of Labour on 18th September, 1972, on the seven issues because the Claimants wanted to bring the dispute direct to the Industrial Court. The dispute was accepted and a conciliator was appointed on 22nd September, 1972. In response to the conciliator's request the Claimants submitted their demands and arguments in writing but the Respondents chose to rely on verbal arguments.

During the conciliation meetings the parties visited Vacu-Lug and National Tyre Retreaders to have an appreciation of relative value of jobs Little progress, however, was made with the Claimants accusing the Respondents of using delaying tactics and the Respondents accusing the Claimants of reducing the conciliation proceedings to a circus of insults and innuendos

The parties, however, continued their contact and reached agreement on gratuity/retirement benefits and annual leave—the issue of termination of service clause had been settled previously

On 27th February, 1973, the parties signed Form "A" and on the date of mention they settled the issues of suspension and sick leave

The Claimants bitterly criticized the Ministry of Labour officials for delaying the submission of the dispute to the Couurt by two months for no apparent justifiable reason as the Labour Commissioner forwarded the Form "A" with his certificate dated 14th May, 1973, to the Industrial Court on 15th May, 1973

The Court appreciates the Claimants' feelings in the matter but at the same time it should be realized that the Labour Commissioner has to satisfy himself properly that all available machinery (including statutory machinery) for the voluntary settlement of disputes has been exhausted. This is in addition to the numerous other important duties which the Labour Commissioner has to discharge. In any case the Court always

takes such factors into account when awarding the effective date and ensures that the workers do not suffer any injustice

On the remaining two issues in dispute namely job grading and wages and effective date and duration, the Claimants sub mitted that the job grading and the rates in respect thereof offered by the Respondents were not acceptable to them because the Respondents' members were engaged in business for which there was a great demand and further that since they competed with such firms as Car & General and Firestone, there was no reason why they should not pay the same rates as these two firms. They alleged that the Respondents enjoyed cheap labour, paid less and made fantastic profit due to business boom

The Claimants proposed a job grading of eight grades with separate categories for artisans, drivers, clerks and security staff. The minimum rate they have suggested is Sh 300 (with Sh 45 housing allowance to be consolidated in the wage) going up to a wage of Sh 750 for Grade VIII. They stressed that the increase in cost of living justified their demands

The Claimants have also suggested the effective date to be 1st July, 1972, as they accuse the Respondents of having used delaying tactics

Finally they demanded a duration of 12 months only

The Respondents stated that their members were small family businesses and could not be compared with international firms like Firestone and Car & General They pointed out that each one of their members has had a separate collective agreement with the Claimants and from February this year all the wage rates had gone up because the Wages Council Regulation Order for the Motor Industry was extended to include them in it also with the result that most of the workers had received further increases from that date

The Respondents submitted that there was no flourishing market in tyre retreading industry and they were suffering from unhealthy competition from numerous other firms who were not their members. They stressed that a minimum consolidated rate of Sh 255 pm (inclusive of Sh 45 housing allowance) was quite reasonable taking into account the fact that big firms in the motor industry will pay a minimum consolidated rate for Nairobi of Sh 315 pm with effect from 1st July, 1973

The Respondents asked the Court to confirm their job grading showing five groups which included all job categories starting with a consolidated rate of Sh 255 going up to Sh 587 for Group V

The Respondents denied that they had employed delaying tactics and clarified that one meeting which they failed to attend was because an officer of the Federation of Kenya Employers (FKE) dealing with the matter had met with an accident in the Nyanza Province They asked the Court to award the effective date to be the date of the award and that the duration of the agreement should be two years

The Court notes that the parties have agreed that whatever is awarded as the consolidated wage should include an element of housing allowance to an extent of Sh 45

After a careful consideration of all the submissions the Court makes the following award —

1 Suspension






